







Rock on Sarimento Bank.

All bearings are Magnetic. Mean. Var. 21° 30' E/07.

Nassau Rock. While sounding on the Sarimento Bank, HM Surveying Ship "Nassau," struck on an unknown rock. This rock is a small pinnacle with three feet on it at low water springs (ordinary), and 3 to 6 fathoms all round it. Its position is S. 80° E 3½ miles from Cape Virgin. There is little kelp on it, but not enough to mark it. Shoal inside Second Narrows.

A Shoal patch with 2 fathoms on it at low water, has been found inside the Second Narrows, between Cape St. Vincent, and Santa Marta Island. Its position is N. 16° E. 22 miles from the extreme of Santa Marta Island.


Whereas by the Vaccination Ordinance No. 1 of 1868 it is enacted "That it shall be lawful for the Governor from time to time to divide the Falkland Islands into as many districts as he may deem advisable or necessary and to appoint the Colonial Surgeon or other Public Medical Officers of these Islands; or any duly qualified Medical Practitioner to be the Public Vaccinator or Vaccinators of such districts, whose duty it shall be attend at such time or times as may be appointed by the Governor at some convenient place within each such vaccination districts as the Governor may direct, and the said Public Vaccinator

" or Vaccinators shall and are hereby required to
" Vaccinate all persons resident in any such District
" or Districts, who may come or be brought to them
" for that purpose, being fit subjects for Vaccination
" subject to such regulations as may be issued by
" the Governor, in that behalf, provided always
" that the provisions of this Ordinance shall not
" apply or be in force in any District until
" a Public Vaccinator has been appointed for such
" District;" and Whereas it is desirable that the
" said Ordinance should be brought into immediate
" operation so far as regards the Town of Stanley
" and the districts adjacent thereto:

Now therefore I the said Governor do hereby
Notify that for the purposes of the above
Ordinance the Stanley Vaccination District
shall include all that district lying within
a radius of six miles from Trinity Church
in the Town of Stanley; that I have appointed
Horace Newbegin Watts Esquire M. D. to be Public
Vaccinator for the said District; and that I have
directed the said Public Vaccinator to attend at the
Government Dispensary on Monday in each week
for the purpose of Vaccinating all persons resident
in the Stanley District who may come or be brought
to him for that purpose;

Whereof all and singular the inhabitants of
the said District whom it may concern are hereby
required to take due notice and govern themselves
accordingly.


