It has been brought to my notice that the Estate L. Williams, has for some time past been delivering letters to the Master of the F.I. Co, vessels (just before departure for Montevideo), to be posted in Montevideo. These letters have had Uruguayan stamps stuck on.

In the Post Office Guide under the heading Exclusive Rights of the Postmaster General, states:

No collection of letters of any kind (whether exempt from the Postmaster General's privilege or not) can be made for the purpose of conveyance or delivery, and carriers are specially prohibited from carrying letters. Penalties are imposed for any infringement of the Postmaster General's rights.
