This is most annoying as I have orders awaiting execution to the value of £400 and these cannot now be despatched until the 23rd of November.

I notice that 11,220 stamps have been supplied but 10,200 were ordered. The C.A.'s or the suppliers seem to have erred on the right side in this respect.

The correspondence in this M.P. shews that the time taken for delivery of the stamps by the firm was 1 week. They could have been shipped before the 16th of November if the vessel which carried them had sailed earlier.

However, I agree that there may not ^{now} be time to order a further supply to catch the vessel sailing from the United Kingdom on the 28th of December, and in these circumstances I propose to reduce some of the larger orders already received and to refuse to accept further requisitions for 1/- stamps.

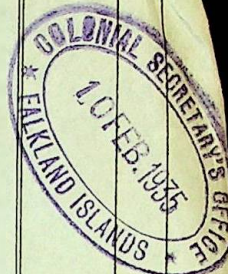



The King is much interested in the sets of postage stamps which will be issued in the various Colonies on May 6th to commemorate his Silver Jubilee. His Majesty wishes to know whether it would be possible for you to arrange, without much inconvenience, for an envelope bearing one copy of each value of the stamps to be posted to him on the day of issue in each Colony?

He would like the envelopes to be of uniform size, about $7\frac{1}{2}$ x $5\frac{1}{4}$ inches, and for them to be addressed:

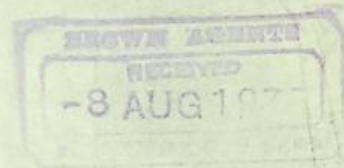
