Dear Mr. Lellman,

Your letter of the 4th of August, to Miss Carey has been passed on to me, together with your designs for stamps. I have shown them to the Governor who is particularly interested because he is at present busy working on a similar idea. The two new stamps we want are the 1/6 and the 2/- values in order to enable people to put one stamp instead of two on their airletters. We particularly like your design with the Turkey Buzzards and are forwarding this to the Secretary of State. Our design for the other stamp may be that of a wandering Albatross, white over a blue sea. We are rather attached to this idea and are not really anxious to put an aeroplane on the stamp since airmails actually from the Colony are but a dream of the future. I want to thank you for your helpful ideas and I thought it would interest you to know that our minds are working on the same lines.

Dear Madam,

As it appears to be fairly certain that an inter-island air service will be introduced in the near future may I suggest that the issue of air mail stamps warrants consideration.

As far as I can ascertain the only Empire air stamps, apart from the Dominions, are limited to Papua and Newfoundland and that Crown Colonies are not in the habit of issuing such stamps. Whether this policy is deliberate or accidental I am unaware, but if the latter then possibly the issues of the above two Colonies may be regarded as sufficient precedent.

To elaborate on the idea I enclose my suggestions for design etc. and hope that the matter may receive your consideration and that of any other departments concerned.

I have the honour to refer to my Despatch No. 34 of the 25th April, under cover of which I forwarded copies of the Post Office (Airtelletter Fees) Order.

2. Owing to the lack of either a two shilling or a one and sixpenny postage stamp in the current issue, the public have to use two stamps instead of one to every air letter.

3. In order to overcome this difficulty and for the convenience of the public I think it necessary, as is the practice elsewhere, to add a two shilling and a one and sixpenny stamp to the current issues of the Colony and Dependencies' stamps.

4. The design of the Dependencies' stamps being

uniform

uniform only the colours in this case need to be decided. I would suggest orange for the one and sixpenny and a contrasting blue to that of the threepenny for the two shilling stamp.

5. For the Colony issue I would suggest two fresh designs for the centres in the same frame as the others. The one and sixpenny stamp might show turkey vultures in flight, centre black, frame red. The two shilling stamp might show a wandering albatross in flight over the sea, centre blue, frame brown (blue as in the five shilling and brown as in the sixpenny value). Both stamps should bear a vignette of His Majesty.

6. I attach a drawing of the turkey vultures which shows very clearly a common sight here, the birds usually being in groups of three. The sketch is by Mr. K. V. Lellman, a local man. The colours and true shape of the bird can be found in the British Museum (Natural History).

7. If you approve of this proposal I should be grateful if you would inform me by telegraph and arrange for the designing and printing of the stamps to be put in hand.

Crown Agents for the Colonies being asked to proceed at once with preparation of new 1s.3d. postage and revenue stamp for inclusion in current series of Falkland Islands. I assume that equivalent denomination for Falkland Islands Dependencies no longer required.

I agree that 2d. and 6d. Falkland Island stamps should be withdrawn, and should be grateful if Crown Agents might be informed direct, as far in advance as possible, of precise date upon which all sales of these Falkland stamps will be discontinued as it is important that they should not execute orders in London after the stamps have ceased to be available in the Colony. 




