





Sir,

Having received orders for stamps of the Coronation issue as per details attached hereto, I beg to enquire whether arrangements could be made whereby the stamps would be issued to me some days previous to Coronation Day.

As all the stamps required are to be torn into single sets by me and affixed to envelopes and the envelopes addressed to several different persons, a considerable amount of time will be required, particularly as all stamps are to be ready to be passed through the Post Office for cancellation on the first day of issue.

It will be readily understood that it would be impossible for me to deal with this large quantity of stamps on the one day. It is, therefore, for this reason, - coupled with the fact that a mail from Europe is due to arrive on Coronation Day, - that I ask that the stamps might be issued to me several days before Coronation Day in order that I will have sufficient time in which to deal with them and have them actually posted on Coronation Day.

In addition to these stamps, I expect to receive orders for several thousand more sets by the mail due to arrive at Stanley on the 23rd inst.
