1. The Coronation Stamps and the Whale issues of stamps can be withdrawn from sale at the Counter on 31st December, 1937. 2. The orders arriving by the incoming mail, i.e. ex Fitzroy will have to be executed owing to these orders arriving in the Colony before the date of withdrawal, but as congestion will arise as the result of the arrival of another mail and the preparation for the issue of the new stamps it is suggested that the Postmaster may be permitted to complete the incoming orders after the 31st December for despatch by the mail leaving on 10th January. A Board might be appointed at a later date to check and destroy the balance remaining from the Coronation and Whale issues. 4. First day covers may therefore be granted on 3rd January as the 1st is a public holiday and the 2nd a Sunday.

5. It will be necessary for the Custodians of the Vault to make an issue to the Postmaster on Sunday for the preparation of sets and it is recommended that you will instruct the Custodians accordingly.

5. The outlying offices will not have the stamps by the 3rd January, but this cannot be avoided.

Arrangements are now being made for new issues at or about the date of Coronation next year of Colonial stamps bearing the effigy of His Majesty. The new issue will be confined at first to a few denominations for each territory and will be based on a common design. These stamps will form part of new permanent issues and will not be special for Coronation issue. No such special Coronation issue for Colonies are at present in contemplation.

The stamps will be of standard size. The design comprises a \$\frac{3}{4}\$ profile vignette of King's head in a cirque placed towards the top of left hand corner of stamp with Imperial Crown in the top right hand corner. The name of the terrotory is shown beneath the vignette. The duty tablet is shown at the bottom right hand corner and the denomination appears in words at the base of the stamp.

The stamps will be printed by recess process except in the case of the Gold Coast which will continue to use photogravure process adopted in 1928 and except possible in the case of Aden.

Sir,

I have the honour to refer to my circular telegram of the 24th of July and to inform you that I have recently had under consideration the question of the design(s) to be adopted in the new issues of postage and revenue stamps for the Colonies and Protectorates which are necessitated by His Majesty's Accession, and the possibility of commemorating the Coronation of His Majesty by the issue of a special series of stamps.

- 2. I greatly regret that the close proximity of the date of the Coronation, combined with the large number of separate issues of Colonial postage stamps, renders it impracticable to commemorate the occasion by arranging for complete new issues of stamps to be prepared in time for these to be put on sale in the Colonies on Coronation Day. His Majesty the King has, however, been pleased to approve the alternative suggestion that some few denominations of the new permanent issues that will be necessitated by His Accession should be placed on sale in each territory on the 12th of May, 1937, and that the remaining denominations should be issued as soon thereafter as may be found practicable.
- 3. It is considered desirable that in the first issues of the new reign as many stamps as possible, especially of the denominations in most common use, should bear a simple portrait of the King, and it would be in accordance with His Majesty's wishes if the same design could be adopted for use throughout the Colonial Empire.
- 4. I am aware that special pictorial designs have been adopted in many Colonies for certain denominations of stamps, and I should not wish to interfere with any very strong local sentiment on this subject. In cases where these designs have been combined with a King's head vignette I should offer no objection to the retention of the present designs, merely changing the portrait, if that course is preferred.

- 5. Further, it is, in my opinion, desirable that stamp designs should be as free as possible from a multiplicity of detail, particularly as regards the wording, and I should much prefer it if the use of the words "postage" or "postage and revenue" could be discarded in the preparation of any new designs. This should occasion no difficulty if the principles enunciated in Mr. Amery's circular despatch of the 4th of January, 1928, are strictly observed.
- 6. In order that the preparation of the new stamps may proceed as rapidly as possible I shall be obliged if you will inform me in due course:—
- (a) whether there is any local objection to the adoption of the standard King's head design for (i) all denominations, (ii) all denominations up to, say, 6d. or its equivalent in local currency, or (iii) whether it is desired that the use of that design should be restricted to the denominations dealt with in my circular telegram under reference;
- (b) in the case of those territories having pictorial stamps, whether it is specially desired to retain the existing designs subject only to the necessary change being made in the portrait where this forms part of the design; and
- (c) whether any inconvenience would be caused by the omission on future issues of the words "postage and revenue" or the word "postage" where either of these inscriptions appears on the current issue.





Towards the top left-hand corner is the Ring's head placed in a circle and at the top right-hand corner the Imperial Crown in a circle.

The 10/- stamp portrays the entrance to Port Foster at Deception Island which is one of the Dependencies of the Falkland Islands and is used as a base for whaling factories. Towards the top left-hand corner is the King's head placed in a circle and at the top right-hand corner the Imperial Crown in a circle.

The 5/- stamp has for its subject a young Southern Sea Lion which is common around the shores of the Falkland Islands and its Dopendencies. Towards the top left-hand corner is the King's head placed in a circle and at the top right-hand corner the Imperial Crown in a circle.

The 2/6 stamp shows a typical group of Gentoo Penguins. The birds breed in large numbers in the Falkland Uslands. Towards the top left-hand corner is the King's head placed in a circle and at the top right-hand corner the Imperial Crown in a circle.

The 1/- stamp has for its subject a view of Mount Sugar Top, South Georgia. Towards the top left-hand corner is the King's head placed in a circle and at the top right-hand corner the imperial Crown in a circle.





I have the honour to inform you that I have heard in conversation that the new issue of Stamps will not be available for issue until the early part of the year 1938. It has also been mentioned to me that a sum of £800 will be due to be paid to the Falkland Is. Co, Ltd., in respect of voyages completed at the request of the Government in previous years and which have not yet been paid.

As you are no doubt aware, the amount of £4,000 provided in the estimates as revenue from sale of Stamps was based on the information received from the Secretary of State to the effect that the stamps would be issued on the 12th May, 1937; therefore, if the stamps are not issued this year our revenue may be seriously depleted.

I am loth to refer a matter which I have merely picked up in conversation, but I feel justified in doing so in this case, as, should this information be correct it may be necessary, after investigation, to suggest curtailment of such expenditure as may be necessary to maintain a sound financial position, and meantime I shall be glad to receive a list of any expenditure which has been authorized by Government, and for which no provision has been made in the Estimates.

The 4d stamp illustrates the front view of the Town Hall and Public Offices in Stanley. Towards the top left-hand corner is the King's head placed in a circle and at the top right-hand corner the Imperial Crown in a circle.

The 2½d stamp shows a double arch of whales' jaw-bones which were obtained from a Dependency of the Colony. Towards the top left-hand corner is the King's head placed in a circle and at the top right-hand corner the Imperial Crown in a circle.





The 2d stamp is a map of the Falkland Islands. Towards the top left-hand corner is the King's head placed into circle and at the top right-hand corner the Imperial Crown in a circle.

The 1d stamp depicts the nail steamer "Lafonia" which operates the inter-insular and overseas services. Towards the top left-hand corner is the King's head placed in a circle and at the top right-hand corner the Imperial Crown in a circle.

The ½d stamp presents a view of the Lighthouse at Cape Pembroke which is at the entrance of Port William and Stanley Harbours. Towards the top left-hand corner is the King's head placed in a circle and at the top right-hand corner the Imperial Crown in a circle.

Coronation stamps were obtained from the Vault and issued to South Georgia to the value of £173---6---8 and £5 to Fox Bay.

The custodians of the Vault handed me packets in tact of each denomination of the Coronation stamps. They were waiting for a telegram from South Georgia and could not keep the Vault open until it arrived. At first, I refused to take these stamps into my custody owing to the safe in my Office being small. However, the Colonial Treasurer was adverse to breaking up the packets in the Vault and space was provided for them.

In view of the work involved in separating these stamps and to save time on the 12th May sets have been prepared in readiness.

I presume that the stamp letter orders by the incoming mail will be abnormal and a great deal of time will be required in preparing them by the 20th May therefore the stamp letter orders in hand have been made up under my supervision. These orders, the sets and the balance of stamps are placed in the safe in my Office.

I was not aware that special authority other than by the Colonial Treasurer had to be given to obtain these stamps from the Vault.

The balance of stamps and sets may be returned to the Custodians of the Vault if my responsibility is doubted.





I have the honour to refer to your despatch No. 2 of the 5th of January, 1937, regarding the proposed new issue of postage and revenue stamps for use in the Falkland Islands, and to my telegram No. 17 of the 27th of February, 1937, in which I informed you that I considered it desirable that the low value stamps should be produced in pictorial designs.

- 2. I have accordingly caused designs to be prepared similar to those enclosed in my despatch No. 164 of the 19th of November, 1936, and forward for your approval the particulars in connection with these and the seven low value pictorial stamps of \$10, 10, 20, 2\$10, 40, 60 and 90 denominations.
- 3. I suggest the R.R.S. "Discovery II" as a suitable design for the 6d stemp, and subject to your concurrence, I should be grateful if the 'Discovery' Committee could be asked to supply for the purpose a suitable photograph of that vessel. It has not been found possible to provide locally a design suitable for the 9d stemp. I suggest therefore that the 'Discovery' Committee be invited to provide some design suitable for that denomination.


