





Values, colors and designs are 30-lire green and black, bicycle rider being paced by a motorcyclist; 70-L blue and black, five cyclists sprinting, and 300-L orange, a single bicycle rider.

To promote its efforts in the field of education, the Republic of Guinea, one of the new African nations, has issued four multicolored stamps. The values and designs are five francs and 15 francs, a boy using a pointer on

a blackboard on which a banana plant has been drawn, and 10 and 20 francs, an instructor using illustrations to explain words to an adult class.

BRITAIN WILL issue a special set of stamps Nov. 14 to mark the opening of its National Productivity Year. A twopence, half-penny red and green shows the NYP symbol and a layout of blocks at the left with three arrows shooting upward; a three-pence violet and blue also presents the NYP symbol with arrows at the left, and a one shilling and threepence green, blue and red has the symbol again with an arrow in the upper left corner. A portrait of Queen Elizabeth II appears on all three values.

BOLIVIA WILL issue a 1,200 bolivianos (10 cents U.S.) stamp early in 1963 showing the flaming torch symbol of the Alliance for Progress program in Latin America.

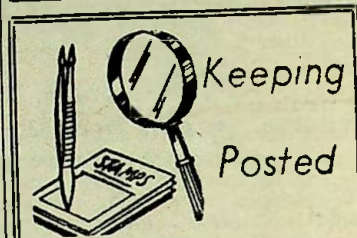

green depicts a receiver; the 2 shilling violet and ultramarine pictures a rotary spark transmitter.

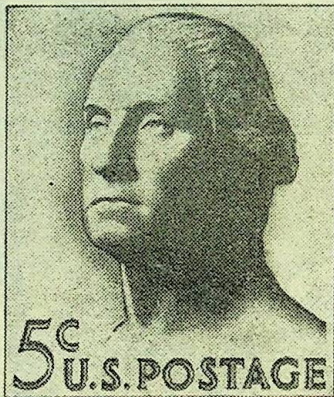
STAMPS and COINS By GEORGE ALLARD

THE NEW POSTAL RATE will go into effect on Jan. 7, 1963. A 5c George Washington stamp, based on a classic sculpture, will be the new regular first class stamp. It is blue. The new 8c air mail stamp shows a plane soaring past the dome of the nation's Capitol. It is conventional red in color.

In issuing a Washington stamp as basic first class postage, the Post Office Department restores the Father of His Country to a position he has held repeatedly since stamps were first issued in 1847. An adaptation of the same bust appeared on the Washington 3c stamp in 1851.

THE UNITED NATIONS POSTAL ADMINISTRATION will issue a commemorative stamp on Dec. 3 to focus world attention on international cooperation for peaceful uses of outer space. The stamp will honor the 28 member U.N. Commission on the Peaceful Uses of Outer Space. There will be two denominations 4c in blue and 11c in maroon. Details will be announced later.

FALKLAND ISLANDS 50th anniversary of radio communications commemorative set of three values was released Oct. 5. All three include the Annlogi portrait of Her Majesty the Queen and the St. Edward's Crown and feature designs sym-

Vol. II includes all the nations of Europe and colonies with the exception of Great Britain. The price is \$7.95 per volume.

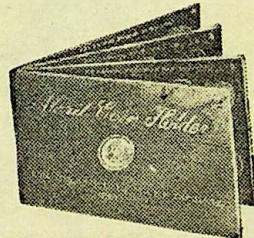

Falkland Islands' 50 Years Of Radio Are Observed By Three Colorful Issues

ON SEPTEMBER 23, 1912, wireless communication was established between the Falkland Islands and the H.M.S. Active at Montevideo, Uruguay. To mark the 50th anniversary of the Falklands' radio station, three stamps have been published. All three include the Annigoni portrait of Queen Elizabeth. The 6-pence shows a Morse key, the 1-shilling a two-valve receiver, and the 2-shilling a rotary spark transmitter.

The call sign V.P.C., which has been used half a century by these faraway islands off the eastern tip of South America, is shown in Morse code on all three stamps. The 6-pence is crimson and orange, the 1-shilling dark green and

olive green, and the 2-shilling violet and ultramarine.

Free primary education is the theme of three new stamps from the Federation of Malaya. The designs are identical: two schoolchildren casting long shadows, the symbolism apparently being that they will make better adult citizens because of their education. The 10-sen is bright purple, the 25-sen buff, and the 30-sen emerald.

VICTIMS of concentration camps are memorialized by a new Belgian 40-centime blue and black. It shows two outstretched hands encircled by barbed wire.

To mark the 30th anniversary of the founding of the



The scarlet ibis, a native bird, is shown on this new Trinidad and Tobago stamp, one of a set marking their newly attained independence.

International Film-Art Festival at Venice, Italy has placed on sale a two-value set. A stylized camera's eye is pictured on the 30 lire. The 70-lire has the same design, but with the Lion of St. Mark superimposed on it.

CANADA has brought out a 5-cent stamp marking the 100th anniversary of Victoria, British Columbia. The design includes a reproduction of the Capitol at Victoria.

ASTRONAUTS John H. Glenn, Jr., and Scott Carpenter, Jr., are honored by eight new Paraguayan stamps. Some show their capsules in flight around the earth; others bear profile portraits of the daring Americans. Three are animals.

Two sets were released re-

cently by the United Arab Republic. One, honoring the African Table Tennis Tournament, shows a map of Africa and a table-tennis net. The second marks the 38th World Shooting Championship and depicts a rifle and a target.

SOME of Austria's historical landmarks are featured on new Austrian stamps. The 40-groschen red shows Porcia Castle in Spittal on the Drau; the 60g red-brown, Lederer Tower in Wels; 80g yellow-brown, a farmhouse in Pinzgau; the 1.20-schilling purple, Kornmesser House in Bruck on the Mur; and the 2.20-schilling green, Beethoven House in Heiligenstadt.

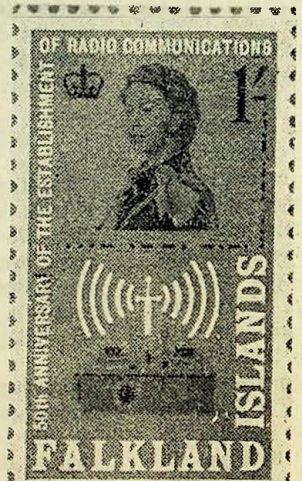

STAMP CHAT

"BLACK BLOT" ISSUES

The American Philatelic Society early this year started issuing a "Black Blot" bulletin each month which lists stamps issued by various countries which it deems unnecessary and issued only for the revenue they would bring from stamp collectors. The APS is not trying to dictate to collectors what they should or should not collect, but are aiming to stem the flow of stamps considered speculative or questionable, such as stamps with a limited print-

long set of 18 values from the five cents to \$20 (A Hong Kong dollar equals 17 cents). The values from five cents to \$1 are in small format and in single colors, while the higher values are in full color, with the Ann Queen portrait being used on all values. Seychelles is also having a new set of 14 values to supply a population of 45,000, most of whom have no communication needs outside their own villages. Several other new sets

are being prepared for issue, shortly by other colonies.

FALKLAND COMMEMORATES

On Oct. 5 Falkland Islands issued a set of three stamps to commemorate the 50th anniversary of the Falkland Islands Radio Station. All three stamps include the Ann Queen portrait and feature "des gus" symbolizing communications. The 1d value shows a Morse key, the 1s value a two-valve receiver and the 2s value a rotary spark transmitter. The call sign "VPC" has been used by the Falkland Islands Radio for the past 50 years and it is shown in Morse code on all three stamps.

UGANDA INDEPENDENCE

On March 1, 1962, Uganda became internally self-governing and on Oct. 9, 1962, attained full independence. To commemorate this event a set of 12 stamps was issued, from the 10 cents to 20s values. The theme of the new stamps is "Building a Greater Uganda" and the design range under four main headings: agriculture and livestock, commerce and industry, tourism, and social services. The stamps up to the 50 cent denomination are in a small format while the higher values are in double size.

SPECIAL STAMP?

The Hon. Ellen L. Fairclough, Postmaster General of Canada, in a reply to a question in the house said that a number of requests have been received from various localities in the Niagara Peninsula for a special stamp commemorating various stages of the war of 150 years ago. "The matter has been considered," she said, "and I believe a stamp will be issued, possibly along the lines of commemorating 150 years of peace or something of that nature, which might give credit to many groups."

To mark the 50th anniversary of the Falklands Islands Radio Station, the Falkland Islands released a special issue of three postage stamps on October 5. All three stamps include the Annigoni portrait of Her Majesty, Queen Elizabeth II and the St. Edwards crown, and feature designs symbolizing communications. The 6 pence value shows a morse key, the 1 shilling value a two-valve receiver and the 2 shilling value a rotary spark transmitter.

The Call-Sign — VPC — has been used by the Falkland Islands Radio throughout the past 50 years and it is shown in Morse Code on all three stamps.

The issue was printed in two color photogravure by Enschede of Holland on CA watermarked paper in sheets of 60 stamps. All three values are in vertical format and measure 40 x 24 millimetres perforation to perforation. Colors are 6 pence crimson and orange, 1 shilling dark green and olive green, and 2 shilling violet and ultramarine. Collectors can obtain these stamps from their usual dealers.

Exhibit Features Postal History

More than 200 frames of philatelic and pre-philatelic items entered by U.S. and European collectors will be on display during the Postal-History-INTERPEX exhibition to be held Friday, Saturday and Sunday at the Barbizon Plaza, 8th St. and Sixth Ave., Manhattan.

In addition there will be scores of unusual postal history items—including a 4,000-year-old Babylon clay tablet, an 800-year-old Quipu (knot record) from the Incas and messenger sticks from Australian Aborigines all part of a massive collection that is the pride and joy of Herbert Rosen of Rego Park. Rosen's collection has won many international awards.

The exhibition is being staged by Industrial Exhibitions Inc., Manhattan—headed by Rosen—in cooperation with the Postal History Society of the Americas. The society is holding its annual convention during the show period.

One feature will be a "philatelic breakfast" Sunday morning, which will be open to anyone interested, as will the entire exhibition. Breakfast speakers are scheduled to give lively talks on postal history.

Exhibition hours will be from 10 a.m. to 9 p.m. Friday and Saturday and from noon to 7 p.m. on Sunday. There will be a small admission fee, which will be sliced in half for children. This postal history exhibition has no tieup with the big annual INTERPEX show, the next of which is scheduled for March.

The postal history program is a varied one, with noted experts lecturing Saturday and Sunday. The Post Office will operate a substation at the exhibit and there will be a dealer course.

"We of the Postal History Society," said Dr. William Reiner-Deutsch, its president, "extend a hearty invitation to the public to attend this exhibition. We are positive this show will remain in the memory of the viewer for many months to come."

AND ON LONG ISLAND . . . Mayor William Gulde of Hempstead has proclaimed this as "Dag Hammarskjold Week" in conjunction with NASPEX—the annual stamp show of the Nassau-Suffolk Philatelic Alliance.

This year's NASPEX—the tenth—will be a "million dollar exhibit," according to general chairman Alfred Raita of Flushing. Stamps on exhibition will pass the \$1 million mark in total value.

The show will open at 2 p.m. Friday, at the Hempstead Armory. Closing at 10 p.m., it will reopen at 10 a.m. Saturday, with closing again at 10 p.m. On Sunday, the show will open at noon and end at 6 p.m.

The three-day exhibition will honor the U.N.'s late secretary-general Dag Hammarskjold, for his efforts toward world peace. Each paid admission will receive a



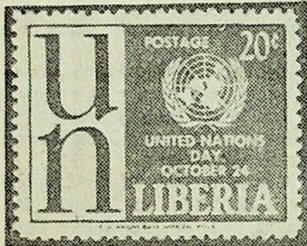

U. S. Will Issue First Christmas Stamp Nov. 1

Burning tapers and an ever-green wreath will make up the design of the first Christmas postage stamp to be released by the U. S. Post Office at Pittsburgh, Pa., Nov. 1.

The green, red and white stamp is being issued in conjunction with the annual convention of the



National Association of Postmasters of the United States. Nationwide sale of the stamp begins Nov. 2 and will continue through Dec. 31.

Postmaster General J. Edward Day said the plans are to reissue a Christmas stamp during future holiday seasons.

The stamp will serve a double function, the Post Office announced. It will supply a colorful fillip to greeting cards, and this is in response to heavy public request. It will also encourage the use of first-class postal rate for greeting cards, providing preferred handling and return-to-sender service in the event of non-delivery.

Initial printing on the Giori

press is 500,000,000 stamps, more than quadruple the normal commemorative stamp printing.

A stamp honoring one of Canada's most eminent citizens of Polish birth, Sir Casimir Stanislaus Guzowski, will be issued next March.

The 14th National Postage Stamp Show will be held Nov. 16-18 at the 71st Infantry Regiment Armory, Park Avenue and 34th Street, New York City. The event, which attracted more than 70,000 last year, is sponsored by the American Stamp Dealers' Association.

To mark the 50th anniversary of the Falkland Island's radio station, the islands released a three-stamp set earlier this month. Designs symbolizing communications and a portrait of Queen Elizabeth appear on each stamp. The 6d crimson and orange shows a morse key; the 1 shilling dark green and olive green shows a two-valve transmitter and the 2 shilling violet and ultramarine shows a rotary spark transmitter.

To promote the country's educational effort, the Republic of Guinea has issued four stamps, two showing a boy using a pointer at the blackboard and two picturing an instructor using illustrations to explain words to an adult class. In addition, Guinea has issued five stamps in an African heroes and martyrs series, all showing

portraits of famous Africans who died between 1898 and 1912.

Greece plans to issue two stamps Oct. 30 to commemorate the farmer's social insurance project. Through a special Government agency, an old age pension is offered farmers, medical care is offered to the farmer and members of his family and agricultural production is insured against hail and frost.

Rifle shooting and softball are pictured on two Japanese 5-yen stamps issued to mark the 17 National Athletic Meeting.

A set of bi-colored stamps marking the observance of United Nations Day as a national holiday has been prepared for release by the Republic of Liberia. Each of the two stamps bears a different but appropriate UN symbol. A miniature sheet bearing a 50-cent airmail stamp in a third design, with marginal inscriptions in gold, has also been prepared for release.

The set of stamps and sheet may be ordered at face value (95 cents) by mail from the Liberian Philatelic Agency, 261 Broadway, Room 702, New York 7, N. Y. Orders must include return postage.

A new definitive issue has been released by Hongkong, all stamps featuring the Annigoni portrait of Queen Elizabeth. High values in the set are in full color.

Hong Kong Series Features Queen

THE RELEASE of a new 15-value definitive series for Hong Kong marks the first time that full-color portrait of Queen Elizabeth II appears on a postage stamp.



A multicolor reproduction of the famous Anni-goni portrait of the monarch appears on the five top values of the set, according to the Crown Agents Representative. These are the \$1.30, \$2, \$5, \$10 and \$20 values. The remaining 10 stamps of the set, ranging in value from 5 cents to \$1, have a monochrome reproduction of the portrait.

New African States

Uganda has made its philatelic bow as an independent nation with a 12-value set depicting national scenes and building of the nation.



The new state was formerly a part of the British protectorate of Kenya, Uganda and Tanganyika.

Only Kenya has yet to win its independence.

The low value of the Uganda series is 5 cents and the top 20 shillings.

Uganda is the second new African nation to release its own stamps. The other is the Kingdom of Burundi, formerly a part of the Belgian protectorate of Ruanda-Urundi.

Burundi's nine-value series is symbolic of its independence with some values picturing her king, Mwami Mwambutsa IV.

Israeli Air Lines

Israel plans to release a 55-agorot stamp and £1 souvenir sheet on Nov. 7 in commemoration of El Al, the nation's airline.



The souvenir sheet will be issued in conjunction with a special El Al exhibition in Tel-Aviv.

Radio Communications

The 50th anniversary of its radio station is being marked by a trio of stamps of similar design by the Falkland Islands, in the deep South Atlantic.

In addition to picturing Queen Elizabeth, the stamps show the modes of radio communication of 1912.

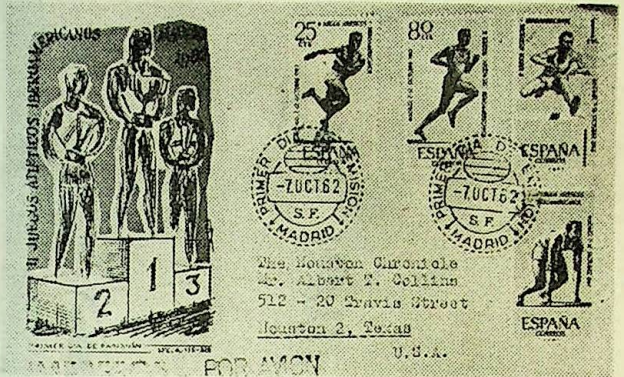

Two New United Nations Stamps Out December 3

The United Nations Postal Administration will issue a set of two stamps Dec. 3 to focus world attention on international cooperation for peaceful uses of outer space.

The same design, featuring a globe and palms of peace emanating from the center into outer space, will be used on the 4-cent, blue, and 11-cent, maroon, stamps.



The design is by Kurt Plowitz of the UN Presentation Unit. The stamps will honor the 28-member UN Committee on the Peaceful Uses of Outer Space.

For first-day cancellations

send addressed envelopes with remittance covering cost of stamps to be affixed to United Nations Postal Administration, United Nations, N.Y.

The United States Post Office Department is planning a 6-cent airmail postal card and a 5-cent embossed envelope for use when the new rates go into effect Jan. 7.

The imprint stamp on the new airmail postal card will feature an eagle. Design for the 5-cent envelope has not been disclosed.

More than 30 countries have promised to issue postage stamps in 1963 to commemorate the centennial of the International Committee of the Red Cross which was formed in Geneva, Switzerland.

All countries of the world associated with the Red Cross (in Christian countries) and the Red Crescent (in Moslem nations) have been approached about issuing stamps to commemorate the event. Each is being asked to develop its own stamp designs.

The Falkland Islands issued Oct. 5 a set of three stamps marking the 50th anniversary of its radio communications.

The bi-colored stamps include the portrait of Queen Elizabeth in the upper half of the design. The Crown Agents Representative, Washington, D.C. said the designs in the lower half are:

6-pence, a Morse key; 1-shilling, a two-valve receiver; and 2-shilling, a rotary spark transmitter. The call-sign—V.P.C.—used by Falkland Islands Radio throughout the 50 years is shown in Morse code on all three stamps.

STAMP CORNER

By REG. NAIRNE

Trinidad and Tobago, the most southerly of the West Indies, became independent on Aug. 31st, so a special set of five pictorials (from 5c to 60c) were issued to mark the event. Perhaps the most interesting of these are the 35c, showing a bird of paradise, and the 60c, featuring the scarlet ibis.

As the former bird's native habitat is restricted to New Guinea and adjacent islands, one may wonder what it is doing on a stamp 10,000 miles away from its homeland.

But it is quite correct to show this beautiful bird on a Trinidad issue, for, in 1909, 24 pairs were imported from the wilds of Arru Island, and released on the island of Little Tobago -- the only place in the western world where they live in their wild state.

The scarlet ibis is another brilliant denizen of the tropics which makes its home in Trinidad. The Coronel Sanctuary, near Port of Spain, capital of the island, is the home for some 6,000 of these remarkable birds, which are clothed from head to tail in the most dazzling scarlet.

Unlike most birds, the females vie with the males in coloring, and even in the nest-

ing season retain their spectacular plumage.

This reckless disregard for camouflage, which is perhaps unique in nature, makes them easy marks for predators; and until they were given protection, there was danger that they might follow the way of the Dodo.

* * *

Falkland Island on Sept. 23 brought out a set to mark the 50th anniversary of Radio Communications.

The Republic of South Africa has recently issued a couple of stamps (2½c and 12c) to mark the unveiling of the "pioneer stone" of the British Settlers Monument at Grahamstown.

Design shows the ship "Chapman" which arrived at Algoa Bay April 10, 1820, bringing the first of a large group of settlers from Britain. It seems rather surprising to see the Republic honoring the advent of the British settlers in what the Dutch inhabitants must have then thought was their own preserve.

* * *

Both Stanley Gibbons and Scott have recently brought out their Vol. 7 editions of the catalogues for 1953. These cover all British Commonwealth issues up to date, and, in the case of Scott's, the stamps of the Americas as well.



FALKLAND ISLANDS

Three new stamps were issued Oct. 5 by the government of the Falkland Islands, off the Atlantic coast of South America, to commemorate the 50th anniversary of radio communications. The Islands are owned by Great Britain.

On Sept. 23, 1912, wireless communications between the Falkland Island Radio Station and H. M. S. Active near Uruguay was established. The installation was by Marconi's Wireless Telegraph Company, and was a five kilowatt set with a synchronous disc discharger. The station operated over a range of 500 nautical miles by day and considerably more at night.

The design on all three stamps differs in some respects. All three include the Annigoni portrait of Her Majesty the Queen and St. Edward's crown. The six penny value is crimson and orange, and in addition to the standard design already mentioned, has a morse key. The one shilling value has the two-valve receiver, and the two shilling value has the rotary spark transmitter.

The one shilling stamp (shown here) is dark green and olive green and the two shilling stamp is violet and ultramarine. They come in sheets of 60 stamps, each stamp measuring 40mm x 24mm.

The call sign of the Falkland Island Radio Station, V. P. C., has been used since it began, 50 years ago, and is shown on all three stamps in Morse Code.

CHRISTMAS STAMP

The long-awaited Christmas stamp from the U.S. Post Office has been designed and advance photographs show it to be an innocuous design that won't offend any religious denomination but will not please many people either. The four cent. green, red and white stamp intended for use on season's greeting cards shows the holiday symbols of burning tapers, and an evergreen wreath with a red bow and Old English lettering! How a Post Office can authorise art as different as the new five cent. reported above and a piece of low-grade designing like this within a few weeks is beyond me.

V.P.C

The radio call sign V.P.C. has been used by the Falkland Islands Radio throughout the past 50 years and is shown in morse code on all the three stamps issued to mark the 50th anniversary of Radio Communications in the Falkland Islands.

The three stamps, a 6d. crimson and orange, a 1s. dark green and olive green and a 2s. violet and ultramarine were released during October. All three stamps show the Annigoni portrait of the Queen and the St. Edward's Crown and feature designs symbolising communications. The 6d. shows a morse key, the 1s. a two-value receiver and the 2s. value a rotary spark transmitter.

On September 23rd, 1912, wireless communication was established with H.M.S. Active at Montevideo and a telegram was sent by the Governor to the Secretary of the State for the Colonies conveying loyal congratulations of the Colonists Falklands to H.M. the King. The installation was by Marconi's Wireless Telegraph Company who supplied the photographs used on the stamps.

POLISH CANADIAN

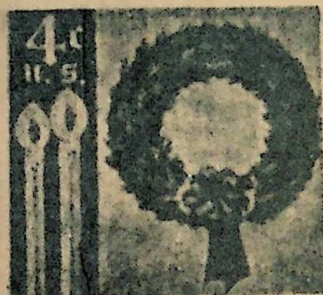

The design of the first US Christmas stamp was announced last week by Postmaster General J. Edward Day. The 4c green, red and white stamp goes on initial sale in Pittsburgh, Pa. November 1, in conjunction with the annual convention of the National Association of Postmasters.

Nationwide sale begins November 2, and continues through December 31.



The new stamp, intended for use of season's greeting cards, ties in with the POD's "shop and mail early" campaign. In addition to a colorful stamp for greeting cards, it is also a subtle attempt to convince the public to use first class postage on greeting cards.

Plans are to reissue a Christmas stamp during future holiday season, according to the Postmaster General. The stamp was designed by Jim Crawford, a POD artist, and modeled by William K Schrage. Richard M. Bower engraved the vignette; George A. Payne the lettering and numeral. The stamp will be in regular size, 0.75 by 0.87 inches.

The initial press run, on the Giori press, will be 500 million, from six plates.

There were 1,603,548 first day covers canceled when the 4c Apprenticeship commem was placed on sale in Washington on August 31. In all, 1,147,834 stamps were sold, with a value of \$45,062.16.

Another of those stamp flaws which crop up periodically was found recently at Leamington, according to Barry Truax, 39 Robinson St., Leamington. The flaw consists of a red line through part of the recent Victoria Centenary commemorative stamp. It extends from the tablet bearing the figures 1962 through the reproduction of the first Vancouver Island stamp to network below the stamp and then back up again into the stamp reproduction. It was spotted by Barry's father when he was buying stamps at the Leamington post office. Due to his son's interest in stamps, he asked for the privilege of looking over the remaining stock of these stamps, but no further stamps with the flaw were found.

This circumstance provides adequate proof that this discovery is merely a freak production, probably caused by a vagrant hair or fine fibre drifting onto the plate and after one stamp impression disappearing again.

Only One Regular

The new regular 5-cent stamp scheduled to appear on Oct. 3 will be the only value of the regular series which will be issued this year. As described earlier it comes in a horizontal format instead of the time-honored vertical style. Its size will be the same as the present regular 5-cent stamp. Instructions to postmasters suggest they order 10-day supplies of the new stamp and when that supply is exhausted that they give preference to the present 5-cent stamp, until existing supplies are sold. However, orders are that postmasters must keep the new stamp available for such patrons who specifically ask for it.

Nkrumah Issue

Ghana issued a set of four stamps yesterday to mark the birthday of its president, Dr. Kwame Nkrumah. The set is styled National Founder's Day issue. Values will range from 1d to 2s, with the three lower values picturing Dr. Nkrumah,

while the top value shows a bricklayer's hands, placing a brick lettered Ghana in a structure. All four stamps will be printed in four colors.

Radio Anniversary

Later on this month a three-stamp set will be issued by the Falkland Islands to mark the 50th anniversary of the first radio communications between the islands and the outside world. The three values 6d, 1s and 2s, picture the queen together with symbolic representations of the radio station and its equipment.

Old Name Returns

The other long set will be issued by Uganda to mark the independence of that country. It will consist of 12 stamps, ranging in value from five cents to 20 shillings. The issue will be entirely pictorial with topics ranging from Ankole cattle to the Mountains of the Moon, plus churches, a mosque, college and hospital. Most values will be printed in two or more colors. Uganda has not issued its own stamps since early in the century, when it was merged with British East Africa.

Exhibitions

The first fall stamp exhibition to be announced is that of the Niagara Frontier Federation of Stamp Clubs being held in St. Catharines, Oct. 12 to 14 at the Merriton Community Centre. The program embraces an auction, bourse, exhibition and dinner. The auction takes place Friday night, Oct. 22 with the dinner the following night while the exhibition will be open all day Saturday as well as Sunday from 10.00 a.m. to 5.00 p.m.

London's show has been scheduled for three weeks later on Saturday, Nov. 3. The London Philatelic Society is sponsoring the show which likewise includes an auction, bourse, exhibition and dinner. As was the case last year the entire proceedings will take place in Cronyn Hall at St. Paul's Cathedral. The guest speaker at the dinner will be B. M. Erb.

New Issues

HUNGARY—To commemorate the twin flight of Soviet spacemen Niko- layev and Popovici, the Hungarian Post Office has issued 1 airtel and 2 forint stamps in their honor. The adhesives, 30 by 70mm, are photo- gravured in two colors. One shows the two space vehicles orbiting the earth and the other features portraits of the two cosmonauts. First day of issue was Sept. 4. A total of 360,000 perforated and 15,000 imperforated sets were released. (Philatelia Hungarica, Budapest).

JAPAN—The Nikko National Park set recently issued comprised two 8-yen and two 10-yen stamps. One 8-yen adhesive pictures the Ozeegahara swampland and Mt. Shibutsu, the other depicts fumes issuing from the top of Mt. Chauu, Nasu. One 10-yen features Lake Chuzenji and Mt. Nantai and the second, the Senryu-kyo Nar- rows, Shiohara. All are photogravured on white, unwatermarked paper, with a printing of 8 million each. (Phil- atelic Agency, Tokyo CPO).

CYPRUS—The new definitive issue of 13 values ranging from 3 mils to 1 pound, will be released tomorrow. All are printed on special Cyprus watermarked paper by offset litho and inscribed in Greek, English and Turk- ish. Most of the designs reflect the antiquity of the island. (Crown Agents).

REPUBLIC OF GUINEA—Four stamps—25, 30, 50 and 75 francs— will be released Wednesday to mark the struggle against illiteracy. The face value of the set is 74c (U.S.). Recently issued was a colorful set of six "animal" stamps of 10, 25, 30, 50, 75 and 100 francs. (Agence Philatelique, Boite Postale 814, Conakry (Rep. de Guinee).

A late starter in the malaria stamp program is the Canal Zone, with a 7-cent airmail scheduled for release Sept. 24 at Balboa.

The stamp, to be issued in connection with the World Health Organization's malaria eradication program, will be printed on yellow tinted paper in black. Giori presses in Washington will be used.

For first-day service send addressed covers to the Philatelic Agency, Balboa Heights, Canal Zone. Enclose remittance to cover face value of stamps to be affixed. Note in upper right corner of each cover the stamps desired (singles, pairs, blocks, etc.).

Send outside envelope: "First-Day Covers." Do not enclose orders for mint stamps. Such orders should be sent separately and return postage included in the remittance.

Rayburn Stamp Announced

Design of the Sam Rayburn stamp was unveiled by the Post Office Department in a ceremony attended by Mr. Sam's old friend, Vice President Lyndon B. Johnson.

Postmaster General J. Edward Day showed the model of commemorative postage stamp that is tribute to the Texas who served as speaker of the U.S. House of Representatives 17 years—three longer than any other man in history.

The stamp will first be placed on sale September 16 in Bonham, Texas, on the 22nd anniversary of his election to the speakership. He had served continuously in Congress since 1913 until his death at 79, Nov. 16, 1961.

In the multi-color, vertical stamp, Sam Rayburn stands before the Capitol dome. Graded tones of brown and blue give the stamp a three-dimensional effect.

Collectors desiring first day cancellations of the Sam Rayburn stamp may send addressed envelopes, together with remittance to cover the cost of stamps to be affixed, to the Postmaster

for the 1962-63 Migratory Bird Hunting Stamp. A \$2 revenue stamp, in grayish black, light purplish blue and moderate reddish brown, it is the twenty-ninth of an annual series of the Fish and Wildlife Service of the Department of the Interior. Every hunter must carry one.

Funds derived from the sale of the stamp supplement other revenues in the maintenance of waterfowl refuges throughout the country. Known as "duck stamps" to philatelists, they have formed the basis of many stamp collections.

Coming New Issues

Bermuda is to issue new definitive set. The designs will include a portrait of Queen Elizabeth II with the St. Edwards Crown and also feature famous buildings of Bermuda.

Cayman Islands also is to release a new definitive set up to the Pound value.

Falkland Islands will issue a commemorative issue for the 30th Anniversary of the establishment of radio communications. The set will be in 3 values.

Malta will have a set of four commemorating the Great Siege.

Sierra Leone will have a new definitive issue with 13 values to a Pound value.

Trinidad and Tobago will issue an Independence Commemorative Issue consisting of five values.

EMBLEM of the World Health Organization (WHO) is centered on this 2-cent denomination issued by Hungary to mark the 1962 World Campaign Against Malaria. Stamp is printed in color and black.

According to the Crown Agents, special stamps will soon be issued for countries to which they administer postal matters.

On July 26 Uganda will issue four identically-designed stamps to commemorate the 100th anniversary of the discovery of the source of the Nile by John Hanning Speke at Jinja. A view of the Rapon Falls, named by Speke after the president of the Royal Geographical Society, will be seen on the stamps as well as a portrait of Queen Elizabeth II. The base color of the adhesives will be black with the denominations having a second color as follows: 20 cents, red; 50c, blue-violet; 1 shilling 30c, green, and 2 shillings, blue. Inscribed will be, "Centenary of the Discovery of the River Nile by Speke, 26th July, 1862."

Coming from Antigua on Aug. 1 is a four-stamp set to mark the 100th anniversary of its first postage stamp. A common design will feature the original Antigua 4-pence stamp inset above a view of English Harbor with a Royal Mail Steam Packet of 1862 in the foreground. Queen Elizabeth II will be pictured in the design in the well-known P. Ansonian portrait. The stamps will be in two colors and have a base color of green. Other colors and denominations are: purple, 2 cents; blue, 10c; black, 12c; and orange-brown, 50c.

Scheduled for release Aug. 6 is a 15-stamp Independence series by Jamaica. Eleven values will be current overprinted stamps with four new designs—denominations of 2-pence and 4-pence picturing a Zouave bugler and an outline map of Jamaica with the other two stamps, 1-shilling 6-pence, showing the Golden Bough and banner, and a 5-shilling carrying a symbolic design representing agricultural and industrial development. The new designs will be multi-colored and with the over-printed stamps will comprise the regular issue.

The same island will issue a four-stamp set on Aug. 11 to commemorate the IX Central American and Caribbean Games. The three lower values, 1d, red and brown; 6d, blue and brown; and 8d, yellow olive and brown, will depict the seal of the city of Kingston and various sporting events in the games. Top value, 2-shilling, multi-colored, features the coat-of-arms of the city of Kingston as well as the official emblem and motif of the games.

The Falkland Island's 50th Anniversary of Radio Communications series, going on sale Sept. 23, will consist of three stamps and be in upright format. A Morse Key will be prominently displayed in the design.

Collecting the Europa stamps issued by numerous countries has become a specialty of many collectors, judging by the demand for the annual Europa stamps issued in recent years. To give collectors a catalogue of such stamps, the American Topical Association (3306 North 50th St., Milwaukee 16, Wis.) has issued its topical handbook 34 covering all such stamps and others which deal with the broad topic of Europe.

The illustrated booklet gives catalog numbers of the stamps according to Scott's Standard for American collectors, Gibbons for British collectors, and Michel for European collectors. Included are the stamps issued in 1951 for the European coal and steel community by Luxembourg, the stamps of the Common Market countries issued since 1956, the Europa stamps issued by up to 19 countries for the postal and telecommunications organization, and stamps for the Council of Europe.

Since the subject of Europe can be broadened considerably the booklet also lists stamps of the Scandinavian countries for northern European unity, for the North Atlantic Treaty Organization, for various European sporting events, for pre-war Balkan treaties, and many other causes.

Now that we can see live programs as they are transmitted from Europe via space communication satellites, it is difficult to realize that the whole field of radio communication is only 60 years old. New stamps from the Falkland Islands, issued a few days ago, mark the 50th anniversary of the first radio communication from that remote island group in the South Atlantic.

The three new Falkland Islands stamps depict the actual transmitting and receiving equipment used in 1912 on the warship H.M.S. Active to send a message from the governor to King George V in London. This is probably the first time that a spark gap transmitter is featured on a postage stamp, as well as an early type receiver. For topical collectors of stamps on the subject of radio, these stamps will be of special interest.

The Falkland Islands are not quite as isolated today as they were 50 years ago. There is air service between the various islands at the southern tip of South America, but no air service connecting the British colony with the outside world. The islanders still rely on radio communication for fast contact with the outside world.

The islands have had postage stamps since 1878. Until 1933 the stamps portrayed only Queen Victoria, King Edward VII and King George V. Some of the stamps are quite scarce today. In 1933 a pictorial issue was released for a centenary of British occupation.

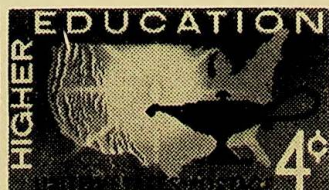
After this first series which showed scenery, map of the islands, whaling ships and whales, there have been other pictorial releases. They have depicted scenery in the islands, penguins, sheep, sea lions, birds and ships, along with inset portraits of King George VI and later Queen Elizabeth II. The current series features many varieties of birds found in the islands, which are the closest occupied land areas

to the South Pole.

Because of claims of some of the islands by Argentina, Great Britain in 1944 overprinted then current stamps with the names of the dependent island groups to the south, including Graham Land, South Georgia, South Orkneys and South Shetlands. In 1946 map stamps appeared showing the location of these islands, the stamps being issued for the Falkland Islands Dependencies. In 1954 these stamps were replaced with Queen Elizabeth II stamps showing various ships which featured in the exploration of this area of the world. Some were overprinted in 1956 for a Trans-Antarctic Expedition.

Falklands Note 50th Year Of Radio Link

From the moment of its first settlement on January 31, 1764 The Falkland Islands group has been a lonely place to live, comments the "Crown Agents Bulletin" in announcing a set of three stamps to mark the 50th anniversary of the radio facilities there.



Even today there is no air facility to nearby South America, and "regular" island-owned ship service is on something like a monthly schedule. Any faster communication depends on radio, and it was on September 23, 1912 that this service was first available there.

The new stamps show the Queen in the upper half of the design, and a radio instrument and symbol below. An early wireless key is depicted on the 6d; later equipment appears on the 1/- and 2/- values.

Falkland Islands

A commemorative issue for the 50th anniversary of the establishment of radio communications is being produced by Messrs. Enschede en Zonen of Holland by the photogravure process in vertical format. The designs include the Annigoni portrait of Queen Elizabeth II with the St. Edward's crown. The denominations, subjects and colors: 6d, Morse key, crimson and orange; 1sh, two-value receiver, dark green and olive green; 2sh, rotary spark-transmitter, violet and ultramarine. (Release date to be announced.)

W. E. Manasse of Brooklyn, New York, writes telling me how he appreciates this column and he goes on to say that this is the first time in his 74 years he has written any writer. I feel flattered.

Coming Issues

Here are some dates for you for coming issues but you will, of course, already have secured your copies of the Trinidad and Tobago Independent stamps on the 31st of last month. In September the Great Siege of Malta stamps were issued on the 7th the new Cyprus permanent set is slated for the 17th and on the 23rd there will be the Falkland Islands Radio Communications issue. I have given you details of these already.

Five items, which were listed in the August Crown Agents Bulletin are due for issue at any minute so you should make your arrangements if you wish for Day of issue covers. They are the Basutoland set in its new currency, the new values for Fiji, the Cayman Islands definitive issue, the Sierra Leone definitive issue and the Ascension Islands definitive issue. Since these last three, as well as the Cyprus set, are permanent ones, they will include all the denominations, to the top value, so that the total may knock you back a dollar or two!

DENMARK. A 35 ore stamp was issued August 31st on the occasion of the 150th anniversary of the birth of Georg Carstensen, founder of Tivoli. The design by Rasmus Nellemann pictures the neck of a violin and other objects. Engraving was by Bent Jacobsen.—*Postal Philatelic Agency.*

FALKLAND ISLANDS. Three values of a commemorative issue for the 50th anniversary of the Establishment of Radio Communications are being printed by Messrs. Enschede en Zonen of Holland, as follows: 6d crimson and orange, Morse Key; 1/- dark green and olive green, Two-valve receiver; 2/- violet and ultramarine, Rotary spark-transmitter.—*Crown Agents.*

FRANCE. Three new stamps replaced current ones bearing Algerian designs. They picture the coats of arms of Amiens and Nevers, and a view of Le Touquet seaside resort, in place of the coats of arms of Oran and Algiers, and the ancient gate of Lodi in Medea. The 5c Amiens stamp pictures lilies and ivy; the 15c Nevers, a rampant dragon. Both were designed by R. Louis, in the basic colors of these coats of arms, and they were issued July 23rd. The large 1fr stamp, issued September 3rd, was designed and engraved by Pheulpin, picturing the beach at Le Touquet with a plane overhead and a large golf bag at left. Caption at the base of the horizontal stamp reads "*Le Touquet, Paris, Plage.*"

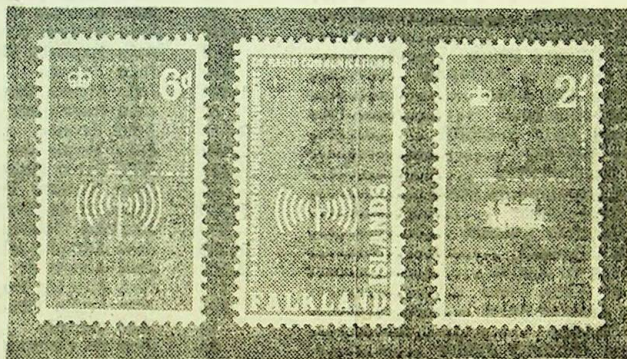

Falkland Series

We have been talking about the 50th Anniversary of the Establishment of Radio Communications for Falkland Islands long enough.

These are going to be photogravure stamps produced by Enschede of Holland and, in addition to the Annigoni portrait, and the St. Edward's Crown, the values, subjects and colors are:- 6d., Morse Key, Crimson and orange, 1/-d., Two-valve receiver, Dark Green and olive green, 2/-d., Rotary spark-transmitter, Violet and Ultramarine.

Malta is to celebrate the Great Siege of 1557-1568, from which the Knights of St. John emerged triumphant, with four stamps. The values and subjects are as follows:- 2d., Madonna Damascena. 3d., Great Siege Monument. 6d., La Valette, Grand Master 1557-1568. 1/-d., Assault on Fort St. Elmo.

Flora Series

For Sierra Leone, new definitives being printed by Harrison and Sons in multicolor photogravure are now being prepared. All thirteen stamps depict the Flora of the country so they should be very attractive.

They comprise:- ½d., Fireball Lilly; 1d., Jina-gbo; 1½d., Sterospermum; 2d., Black Eyed Susan; 3d. Beriseed; 4d., Blushing Hibiscus; 6d., Climbing Lily; 1/-d., Beautiful Grinum,- 1/3d., Blue Bells; 2/6d., Broken Hearts; 5/-d., Ra-ponthi; 10/-d., Blue Plum-bago; £1., African Tulip Tree.

The last new issue of the month will commemorate the Independence of Trinidad and Tobago. Harrison and Sons are producing the set by the photogravure process.

There are five stamps in the set which include views and Birds standing upon maps of the Islands. They are:- 5 cents, Buccoo Reef; 8 cents New Terminal Building Piarco, with Royal Portrait; 25 cents, Trinidad Hilton Hotel, with Royal Portrait; 35 cents, Bird of Paradise on Map of Trinidad and Tobago, multicolor and 60 cents, Scarlet Ibis on Map of Trinidad and Tobago, multicolor.

Every composer of a philatelic column is quite pleased to receive mail enquiries from his readers, if for no other reason than to re-assure him that someone finds the column of interest. He will often go to considerable trouble and research to answer such questions as are forwarded.

In such instances it is an old philatelic custom for the reader to forward a stamped, addressed envelope for use in sending his answer. We are glad to report that the great majority of collectors adhere to this custom.

Occasionally we run into cycles, and the present time is one, in which new or thoughtless readers disregard or are not aware of this practice. We regret to say that unless return postage is enclosed such postcards and letters cannot be answered.

Falkland Islands—On October 5 a set of three stamps—6d, 1/- and 2/-—was released to mark the 50th anniversary of the Falkland Islands Radio Station. All values include the Annigoni portrait of the Queen and the St. Edward's Crown and feature designs symbolizing communications.

The 6d shows a Morse key, the 1/- denomination a two-value receiver and the 2/- a rotary spark transmitter. The call signal "VPC" (--- · --- · --- ·) has been used by the Falkland Islands Radio throughout the past 50 years and it is shown in Morse Code on all three stamps.

Printed in two-color photogravure by Enschede of Holland in sheets of 60 on C. A. (Block Capitals) paper, the stamps are of vertical format and perforated 1 1/2 x 11 on a comb machine moving downward.

The Crown Agents reveal that it was on September 23, 1912 that wireless communication was established with HMS "Active" stationed at Montevideo and a telegram was sent by the Falkland Islands Governor to the Secretary of State for the Colonies. It can well be imagined how important this event was to the isolated inhabitants of these remote islands.

Australia—A last minute reminder to all collectors and to postal stationery adherents particularly: The Seventh British Empire and Commonwealth Games issue is due November 1 and will remain on sale for only four weeks.

In addition to the 5d. and 2/3 adhesives, a 10d aerogramme has been produced at the Note Printing Branch, Reserve Bank of Australia. With such a limited life planned, the

Paquebot Cancels In Maritimers' Journal

The March-April 1962 issue of "Seaposter" illustrates 13 "paquebot" cancellations in current usage at seaports around the world.

Among them are two circular designs used in Ghana to cancel U.S. stamps, and a Zanzibar cancellation used on British postage.

"Seaposter" is published bimonthly for members of the Maritime Postmark Society.

aerogramme should be a real good item.

Uganda—Coincidentally with the new Independence definitive issue released October 9, the country has issued both booklets and coils. The complete booklet, printed by Harrison, is priced at 5/- at the post office and consists of four stamps each of the 15c, 20c, 30c, and 50c values.

The coils are of 10c and 50 denominations. The 50c coils each contain 500 stamps and have been prepared from strips of stamps from the current printing; the 10c values will be in continuous rolls each containing 1000 stamps from a special printing. Watch this latter item for possible differences from the regular sheet stamps.

Singapore—Eight more values to the new definitive set are reported in production by the Crown Agents, with Harrison and De La Rue each preparing four. These will complete the set, making 15 in all, since seven have already been released. Further details later.

Fiji—Bradbury, Wilkinson and Harrison are preparing new designs for production by the recess and photogravure processes respectively, for certain values of the current definitive set.

The engraved stamps will be printed on C. A. Script watermarked paper, while the photogravure items will be on C.A. (Block Capitals) paper. Details will be reported as the work progresses.

Briefs—Perforation gauges for the new Hong Kong definitives are 14 x 14 1/2 for the large high values and 14 1/2 x 14 for the smaller low values. All work was done on the same comb machine, the sheets were fed in differently, in the style of U.S. issues; that's all.

Malaya withdrew its National Language commemorative set on October 20 and Antigua will do likewise on the 31st with the Postal Centenary issue. Bermuda's new definitives due October 26 were printed in sheets of 60.

CONGO—On Oct. 15, 1962, a set of overprinted stamps was issued to commemorate the reorganization of the C. Adoula Ministry. The basic stamp is the 6.50F showing Dag Hammarskjold, which was issued July 11, 1962. The overprinted values and colors of the overprint are: 0.10 blue, 0.20 violet, 0.30 black, 0.40 carmine, 0.50 blue, 3, violet, 6.50 black, 8, carmine. Number of copies issued 65,000 each. The stamps are in sheets of 100.

FALKLAND ISLANDS—The 50th anniversary of radio communications stamps in three values: 6d, 1/-, and 2/-, which were forecast here with full details in our issue of Sept. 8, 1962, have now been received from the *Crown Agents Representative*, Washington, D. C.

GERMANY (WEST)The *World Wide Philatelic Agency*, New York, advises that the Famous Men series is coming to an end. The series began June 15, 1961, and consists of 22 stamps for West Germany; 7 on regular paper, and 15 on fluorescent paper. Also, 15 for West Berlin, all on fluorescent paper.

They also advise that work has already begun on a new definitive series.

A new definitive issue is now in preparation by Messrs. Harrison & Sons Ltd., London. Details of this issue will be published at a later date.

FIJI

New designs are now in preparation by the recess process and by photogravure, for certain values of the current definitive issue.

The recess stamps will be printed on CA script watermarked paper, while the photogravure will be on CA (block capitals) paper. Further details will be announced in a later edition.

FALKLAND ISLANDS

The special set of 3 stamps to commemorate the 50th anniversary of radio communications was released September 23rd, 1962. All are in vertical format.

From the Crown Agents comes advice that Trinidad and Tobago will have an independence issue Aug. 31, and that Tonga will withdraw its stamp marking the 75th anniversary of its postal service set on the same day.

ON ORDER, with release dates to be announced, is a set from the Falkland Islands to mark the 50th anniversary of radio communications, and a Malaya free education issue. The Qu'aiti state in Hadramaut (Aden) is having a net set prepared with a portrait change and Basutoland is in the process of converting its currency adhesives to the decimal system.

Fiji is to have new designs on its regular adhesives, and Ascension, Bermuda and British Antarctic Territory, the Cayman Islands, Cyprus, Hong Kong and Sierra Leone are in the process of having definitive issues produced. Malta's "Great Siege" commemorative issue set embracing 2, 3, and 6 pence and 1 shilling denominations is to appear Sept. 7.

Next there is the Falkland Islands 50th Anniversary of Radio Communications issue on Sept. 23 which will consist of three stamps in upright format. A two-color leaflet is also being produced, describing the issue and it will illustrate the Morse Key from the 6d. value.

Another leaflet will illustrate the new definitive issue of Bermuda but we do not yet know the date of issue. The designs of the stamps will illustrate ancient and modern buildings with a new portrait of the Queen, used for the first time on postage stamps and the two-color leaflet will tell the whole story.

Coming back to Jamaica, here again there is to be a two-color leaflet in turquoise and black for the IX Central American and Caribbean Games on the 11th to the 25th. This leaflet will illustrate the four horizontal rectangular stamps and will themselves depict athletic scenes.

Jamaica—De La Rue is printing four Independence commemoratives from designs by V. Whiteley in values of 2d, 4d, 1/6 and 5/-. They will be released at the same time as certain denominations of the current definitives overprinted "Independence 1962".

The following are overprinted by De La Rue: 1/2d, 1d, 2 1/2d, 3d, 5d, 6d, 2d, 1/-, 2/-. Overprinted by Bradbury Wilkinson: 1/-, 1 1/2/-, one pound. On release these issues will comprise the permanent series, pending the preparation of new definitive designs.

Malaya—Sales figures of the Kelantan Coronation issue—311,573; of the Selangor Installation stamp—2,906,227.

The Europa stamps (5.50 and 6.50Ks.) will be issued on September 17, and two values are due in November to mark the opening of Submarine Telephone cables (and Newfoundland 15 7Ks.). All issues will be phot printed by Courvoisier.

Two values for Sports Scouts are due early in July. Signs are being prepared for competition.
