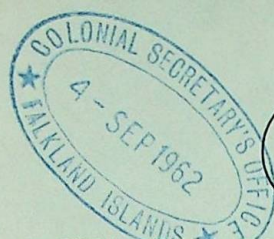

CENTENARY OF THE RED CROSS MOVEMENT, 1963

The British Red Cross Society have suggested that as 1963 marks not only the centenary of the Red Cross movement but of the first International Red Cross Conference which led to the signing of the first Geneva Convention, it would be appropriate for the occasion to be marked by the issue of special postage stamps.

2. To celebrate this event an International Red Cross Conference will open in Geneva on the 2nd September, 1963, to be attended by delegates from nearly 100 Red Cross Societies all over the world and also by delegates from the same number of governments - all those in fact who adhere to the Geneva Convention. The Conference therefore is just as much official as a Red Cross event.
3. All International Red Cross Societies have been asked to approach their governments about special stamp issues and the British Post Office have the matter under consideration.
4. This would appear to be a most suitable occasion for a special commemorative issue with a design common to all overseas territories. I would be prepared to approve such an issue and suggest that it consist of two denominations, that is, the internal surface letter rate and the overseas airmail rate. The stamps could be produced in the two-colour process, a central motif in one colour being common to all with a separate name plate for each territory which wishes to participate in the issue. There would be two background colours - one for the internal, and the other for the airmail, rate. The Crown Agents have very generously offered to bear the costs of preliminary and plate-making work which would be common to all territories. The issue would be made on the 2nd September, 1963 and it would be regarded as additional to the "ration" of one commemorative for each territory in two years, which is suggested in paragraph 6(b) of Lord Perth's circular despatch No.46/62.
5. Will you please let me know as soon as possible whether your administration would wish to participate in this issue, and whether you agree with the suggestions in paragraph 4 regarding the number of stamps, rates, and design, etc. I would hope that on this occasion you would be prepared to leave the selection of the design (subject to Her Majesty's approval) to me. Would you also please indicate the quantity of stamps which you would require and state the values of the stamps to be included in the issue.

You may feel that, having regard to the valuable work which has been performed in so many overseas territories by the Red Cross Societies, it would be appropriate to mark the occasion of the centenary by making a donation from Government funds to the local Red Cross Branch. The alternative of arranging for a surcharge on the stamps, as is done in some countries, has been considered but is regarded as impracticable and undesirable.

I enclose for your information and retention a stamp sized photo print of the two values of Red Cross Commemorative stamps. These have been approved in this Office and the printers are now proceeding with the production of the stamps. Further information which may be of interest to you is given below.

The stamps, designed by Mr. V. Whiteley, will be printed by Messrs. Bradbury, Wilkinson & Co. Ltd., by the lithographic process on Crown Agents (block) watermarked paper in size 42 x 27 mm. perforation to perforation. The lower value will be printed in black and red, the higher value in blue and red. The red printing comprise the cross and the dates 1863 and 1963. Decimal values will be in sheets of 50; Sterling values in sheets of 60.

We will let you know, as soon as details are known, when shipment of your stamps is being effected.

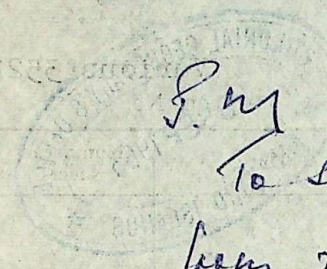


