Commemorative issue of postage stamps.

In accordance with Circular Despatch No. 377/65 approval in principle is requested for the issue of a four stamp set to commemorate the Golden Jubilee of the Falkland Islands Defense Force to be released in the second half of 1970, the stamps to be of 2d. 6d. 1/- and 2/- values.

Permission is also requested for the issue of a four stamp set depicting local activities including sheep farming, trout fishing and perhaps peat cutting and telemetry. These stamps would also be of 2d. 6d. 1/- and 2/- values.

My general letter on the subject of stamp issues dated the 8th May, 1968, (reference 0283/II) provides some of the background.

I look forward to receiving your authority for the issue of a four stamp set to celebrate the one hundredth anniversary of the consecration of Bishop Stirling made in my Savingram No. 59 of the 3rd April, 1968.



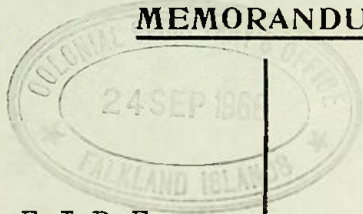

On receiving your original request (with reference to your letter 0283/0 of the 19th September) I placed the matter in the hands of the FSM. On contact this morning he assures me that the photographs required will be taken and handed to you this week.

Will you please take the preliminary steps in connection with the preparation of a four stamp issue to be put on sale in early 1970 with values of 2d. 6d. 1/- and 2/-. Although the release date is a long way ahead, I do not expect these values to be changed but I cannot be definite about this.

The Secretary of State's approval for the issue has been received.

First Day Covers will be required.

The three lower values might be based on any of the following subjects: the highest value being reserved for the Unit badge.

Horse Unit. Photographs (a) indicate the dress worn by volunteers on horse back who were largely responsible for patrolling an area as large as Ulster (an approximation of the size of this Colony) during the last war. Unfortunately, I cannot obtain better photographic material.

6-inch guns at Sapper Hill. Photographs (b) show 6-inch guns taken from war ships (including H.M.S. Canopus) in the 1914-1918 war and which were, for a considerable part of that war, manned by the Falkland Islands Volunteer Force (which later became the Falkland Islands Defense Force). Although the enclosed photographs were taken during the last war, one of the guns shown was in use during 1914 - 1918 and only an alteration in uniform is required. The 1914-1918 dress was exactly as the British forces. Unfortunately I cannot raise a picture of a 1914-1918 volunteer in working kit.

Other guns. Photographs (c) taken during the last war, show activities at Charles Point which covers the main entrance to Stanley Harbour. They may be of some use to the artist.

Colour slides. Colour slides show -

- (a) Best dress uniform as in 1966.
- (b) March past at which His Excellency the Governor is taking the salute.
- (c) The present ceremonial uniform, and
- (d) Present combat kit.

The present Unit badge is a direct reproduction of the official Colony crest which was in use from 1925 until 1948. The description as taken from the Grant reads - "Per bend Azure and Or, sinister a representation of the ship "Desire" dimidiated and issuant Argent Flag and Pennon charged with a Cross Gules and dexter a Sea Lion proper, with the Motto "Desire the Right". As a Unit badge the crest was never worn in a coloured form but if a colour version/...

We refer to your letter 0283/0 dated 26th September 1968, concerning your proposed special issue of postage stamps to commemorate the Golden Jubilee of the Falkland Islands Defence Force in 1970, and have pleasure in enclosing four rough designs prepared by an artist for your consideration. We would state however, that on the three highest values we feel that the design should not encroach upon the territorial name and would propose that the design be dropped lower or made smaller to avoid this. We would also suggest that the value tablets on the three lowest values be omitted and the same type of lettering used as on the highest value with the value in the clear space on the design. To make the sub-caption stand out we would suggest that the words be printed in black on a white background, and this would also assist the printers in respect of the 2/- value where part of the badge drops down amongst the wording for the sub-caption.

We look forward to your comments on these designs at an early date in view of the proposed release date early in 1970.

Dear Sirs,

Please refer to your letter HL/FALKLAND IS. 8/25835 of the 5th May, 1969, regarding the special issue of postage stamps to commemorate the Golden Jubilee of the Falkland Islands Defence Force. We agree that the design on the three highest values should not encroach on the territorial name and would prefer the latter to be made smaller rather than dropping the design or making it smaller. We also agree that the value tablets on the three lowest values be omitted and the same type of lettering used as on the highest value and arc content to leave the positioning of the value to your discretion. We further agree that the sub-caption be printed as suggested. There are two minor errors in the horse gear on the 2d value. Only single reins are used in the Falkland Islands and the higher rein on both the left hand and the right hand side of the horse's neck should be omitted. The stirrup strap should emerge from under the sheepskin saddle cover.

In view of the time factor it would be appreciated if you could approve the final proofs without reference here.

The rough designs are returned herewith.



2D. VALUE HORSEMAN

- (1) Sheepskin to be made to look rougher - see examples in photos.
- (2) Thumb is held on TOP of one rein in left hand of rider - reins are held between (a) thumb and forefinger and (b) forefinger and middle finger - it is his near side (i.e. left hand) reins which is at (a) and this is correct but it appears as if draped over top of hand and thumb is not visible. This needs slight alteration.
- (3) Some doubt about rifle depicted - would it not have been a short muzzle Lee Enfield? Or would it have been a carbine?

- (4) An omission which will certainly be spotted by Falkland Islanders is no CABARESTA, i.e. leading rein, which is almost invariably part of the equipment of a horseman in the Falkland Islands and which can clearly be seen in the photographs. This should not be difficult because it would lie above ^{the} his nearside of ^{the} his horse's neck, i.e. ^{the} his left hand side and would thus be largely obscured in the design. A tracing is attached to these notes and if this is laid over the artwork the position of the Cabaresta will be seen. Please note that the Cabaresta does NOT start from the ring of the snaffle but from a point under ^{the} his horse's chin which is fully obscured in ^{the} this artwork.

- (5) The descriptive label at the foot of this design should have black lettering as proposed but the background should NOT be white. It should be either the same blue colour as the background of the main design or a tone of the same. The artist's opinion should be sought on this point.

6D. VALUE GUN

This is a pleasing design and the only comment is that the background to the descriptive label at the foot of this design should be a tone of the shade used in the main design and NOT white.

1/- VALUE PRESENT DAY CEREMONIAL DRESS

- (1) Please see colour slide. The blue of ^{the} his uniform is incorrect. It should be the same as that worn by the Royal Marines, a very dark blue indeed. Colour shade is correct.
- (2) Buttons are, I am virtually certain, silver and not brass but a telegram should be sent to Falkland Islands to confirm this.
- (3) Fittings of white belt are almost certainly correctly shown as brass but here again query should be sent to Falkland Islands.
- (4) It is suggested that the LEFT hand of ^{the} this man should be shown very slightly shorter than at present.
- (5) It is also suggested that the artist be invited to reconsider the angle of ^{the} his LEFT sleeve - a very slight modification might be an improvement - it looks just a shade too straight at present.
- (6) It is regretted that the yellow background used at present is not really quite what is required. Falkland Islands colours tend to be muted and have been extremely well recaptured in the 6d. value. It is suggested that a shade of fawn, not dissimilar to the 6d. value be substituted.

The 'Mounties' are now a non-existent unit but I don't suppose this matters as the issue is historical anyway. The 'Mountie' proposed for the F.D.C. (official) is not exactly similar to that depicted on 2d value bromide, e.g. the rider's feet are angled differently, there is a more pronounced bend in the right arm and the left hand is held higher. These minor points would not matter but I suggest the exclusion of the cabaresta does.

If we were to go for the design suggested by the Crown Agents I would say that the picture of horse and rider should conform much more closely to that on the stamp. I agree with S.P.T. that the cabareta should definitely be shown and I can not help feeling that the face of the horse on the proposed First Day Cover is suited more to that of a pantomime horse than to something in real life.

All in all I would go for something very much simpler for a First Day Cover, i.e., the Defence Force badge rather larger than shown in the example sent by the Crown Agents and above or below it the words:-

In accordance with instructions the P.M. and myself met Major Goss and Lieut. Summers of the F.I.D.F. this morning and they agreed that the 'Mountie' was hardly appropriate in this day and age. After discussion it was decided to suggest that the 'Mountie' idea be dropped and perhaps an element of 'Keep the Falklands British' (but not in so many words) would be more topical. The suggestion therefore is that the badge be retained and the 'Mountie' replaced by simple crossed flags (Union Jack and Colony).. This would add colour and have the merit of portraying the Defence Force's long association with the U.K. Services, i.e. Royal Navy, Royal Marines, Gordon Highlanders, Royal Scots, Royal Artillery and the Yorkshire Regiment. The Force is affiliated to the latter two and wear the lanyard of the Yorkshire Regiment as part of their uniform.

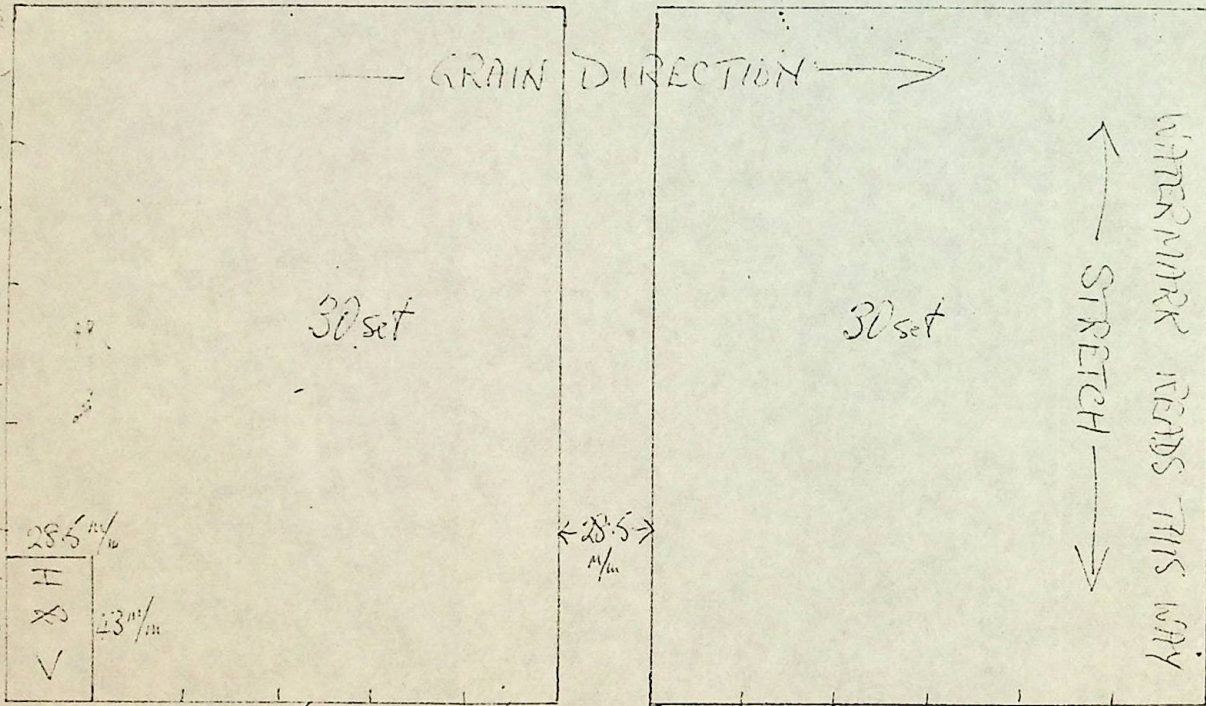

We refer to your proposed special issue of postage stamps to commemorate the Golden Jubilee of the Defence Force, and enclose one colour proof of each denomination, which have been approved subject to the following amendments being carried out before printing is commenced:

- 2d. - The Royal portrait should be made more solid to match the portrait on the 1s. value.
- 1s. - The stripes, buttons and buckle on the uniform should be made yellow, and the background colour should be amended to match the artwork.
- 2s. - The Queen's portrait should be made more solid to match the portrait on the 1s. denomination.

You may wish to note that H.M. The Queen requested that the Royal portrait be made more solid than on the bromides.

We are awaiting the final proof from the printers and one copy will be forwarded to you as soon as this is received. However, this should not make any difference to the delivery of the completed stamps.

We have looked into the matter of the paper, referred to in your telegram of the 22nd January, and have ascertained that the BAT £1 stamp was printed by the recess process on white, thick paper and the South Georgia £1 stamp was printed by the recess process on woodfree paper. Since woodfree paper will also be used for this issue, the quality should be acceptable.



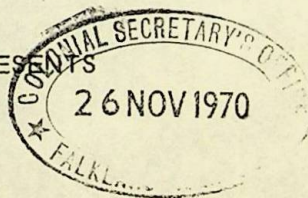
