This situation comes about because, rather late in the day, the Postmaster wrote from UK while he was on leave that he had discussed our programme of issues with Crown Agents and suggested that our stamp issue programme should be adjusted so that the Heraldic Arms issue coincides with the actual date of the issue of the first Arms (16th October) (1925)



Coinage Issue. With new overseas postal rates shortly to be increased it was agreed that the following denominations should appear on the stamps of this issue. 2p, 5½p, 8p, 10p, and 16p. The Crown Agents to be notified and requested to forward half the issue by airfreight and the remainder by charter vessel unless the issue was delayed.

Heraldic Arms. 2p, 7½p, 10p, and 16p were recommended as values for this issue starting with the original 'Flag Badge' at 2p the remainder in chronological order. The words 'Flag Badge' to be inserted as a title on the 2p. stamp.

Airfield Issue. On studying the Crown Agents letter it was agreed to appoint a Design Committee, members to be The Chief Secretary, Mr. H.L. Bound and the Ag. Postmaster. Suggestions already put forward being:-

- Airport Building
- Map of the Islands in relation to South America
- Location of Airfield
- Completed Airfield
- ? Her Majesty the Queen ?
- Aircraft that would use the Airfield.

New Definitive This issue was discussed as Mr. John Smith had just completed the final ship in this series. It was agreed that Mr. Smith be allowed to photograph his pictures of the ships for record purposes only. Artists name not to appear on the stamps.

B.A.T. Definitive No decisions were taken on this issue.

South Georgia. ^{The} latest correspondence was noted and it was decided to continue with the 50th Anniversary of the Initiation of Discovery Investigations (which has already been approved by the FCO) as the next South Georgia commemorative.

Sale of covers to Dealers. The Crown Agents advice was noted.

Finally it was suggested that information be sought from the Crown Agents on what happens to designs etc. sent to them for the preparation of stamp issues, could this material be returned to the Colony?.

Thank you for your letter of the 3rd July, 1975. It is difficult to make any worthwhile comments on the F.D.C. for the Heraldic Arms issue based on a black and white photostat. However, I think here we have been concerned that some of our recent F.D.C.'s have been rather too garish and not in conformity with our philatelic image of a responsible territory anxious to achieve the very highest standards in stamps. We have written elsewhere to enquire if some of the rather strong colours in recent issues might be avoided in the future and, although we do not have any positive suggestion for this F.D.C., we do have some reservations about the conjunction of green and blue.

We have received an enquiry from a philatelic dealer in the UK who is investigating the possibility of producing Maxi Cards in connection with the above stamp issue.

2 To this end the dealer requires your permission for him to reproduce the Colony's various coats of arms used over the years in postcard size on envelopes or actual postcards. Stamps from the above issue would then be affixed to the envelopes or postcards and submitted to you for cancellation in due course.

3 The dealer has given no idea of the number of sets of stamps he would require were he to mount such an operation, but I would imagine that the quantity would need to be fairly large to make the scheme worthwhile. As this could, therefore, represent a sizeable additional sale I recommend that permission be granted but await your decision before taking any further action.

Heraldry is a study used to distinguish individual families and to authenticate official documents. The heraldic design is called a coat of arms. This term comes from the custom of embroidering the emblem of a Knight on the surcoat which he wore over his armor.

The need for heralds developed as more and more coats of arms were designed and confusion became the order of the day. About 1200 A.D., a systematic study of heraldic designs began. The complete coat of arms consists of a shield, crest and motto.

The development of heraldry parallels the march of history. Today, by careful observation and a bit of hindsight, we can decipher parts or a great segment of the Heraldic Arms of the Falkland Islands. First the formalities.

The badge of the Falkland Islands is the same as the new arms which were granted in 1948. It consists of a blue shield having three wavy bars in the lower half of which is superimposed the ship 'Desire' in gold. In the chief (upper part of the shield), there is a ram standing upon tussac (tussock - tight-packed) grass.

But let's look for ourselves at the badges and heraldry of the Falkland Islands and with a bit of research, we can surface some excellent reasons for the badges. The first stamp pictures the original Seal and Flag Badge, and what have we; a cow (or bull) standing on grass with a ship in the background. The ship is most likely the 'Desire', captained by John Davis and the year is 1592. Mark these dates; they lead to today's British-Argentina dispute.

On October 16th 1925, The Falklands received the Coat of Arms by Royal Warrant. The Coat of Arms is divided in half, one half given over to a seal. The seal industry is a giant in the economy of the Falklands. The other half of the Coat of Arms shows a good bit of the 'Desire', still laying solid English claim to the island. The words 'Desire the Right' are self-explanatory.

On September 29th 1948, a new Coat of Arms came along with a fully-coated sheep on the chief portion of the shield, while the 'Desire' occupies the bottom portion of the shield. The words 'Desire the Right' stand boldly under the shield.

On March 11th 1952, a new Coat of Arms was issued to the Falkland Islands Dependencies which consists of groups of islands lying from 200 to 2000 miles to the east and southeast of Port Stanley (Capital of the Falkland Islands). They consist of South Georgia, South Sandwich Islands and the Shag & Clerke Rocks. British Antarctic Territory is administered from Port Stanley. The new Coat of Arms featured a Lion Rampant facing a Penguin. The shield is between them and bears a firebrand or torch and is intended as an illuminant.

This Coat of Arms may also illumine the Antarctic Treaty, an agreement signed in 1959 by many nations (including the U.S. and U.S.S.R.) in which the Antarctic continent was made a demilitarized zone to be preserved for scientific research. The treaty bound its members for a peaceful ecological rebirth period of 30 years.

All these Coats of Arms because England, France, Spain and Argentina have at one time or another laid claim to the Falkland Islands. And why? They are strategically located with approaches to the Strait of Magellan and provide a base for Antarctic whalers.

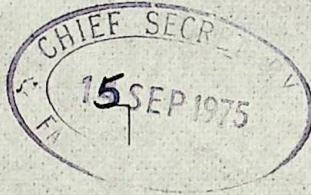



We have run into problems with the Wool Industry stamp issue, although hopefully it will not delay it. The art work presented considerable problems. This was most unexpected bearing in mind that sheep farming is our one and only industry.

As regards the marketing aspect, I expect there is no objection to mentioning a particular name, but you are probably aware that it is not only David Smith and Co who market our wool, so that a mention of the other firms may be worth while, or a reference to David Smith and Co could be on the basis of "one of the marketing agencies".

Thank you particularly for your concern about us. I suppose things always look somewhat worse from a distance and, in fact, we have taken the several "occurrences" recently more or less in our stride, although they are, of course, worrying, and create a considerable extra workload.

I will pass on to the Postmaster your suggestion about 'gift packs' of new stamps. Frankly I am always rather wary of ventures of this nature, as anything that smacks of sales promotion in the philatelic world seems to bring down coals of fire upon my head. Harold Rowlands, of course, is always looking for new ways of increasing revenue, and if we can do this without spoiling our image, we should certainly have a go.
