Late Fee Letters, Introduction of.

Considerable interference with the normal working of out-going mails is occasioned by people bringing letters after the bags have been sealed.

In the past it has been the custom to open the bags for the benefit of late-comers.

The introduction of late fee letters, i. e. letters posted up to one 1/2 hour after the official closing time upon which a fee of 1d. is charged, would either encourage the Public to post in time or pay the over-time of staff delayed in their work.

Should this be approved a notice would be posted giving closing time of mail & closing time of late fee box stating that an extra 1d. stamp should be affixed.

LATE FEE LETTERS

In order to extend additional facilities to the Public for posting letters up to the last possible minute, a special Late Fee Service will be ~~instituted~~ *instituted* in conformity with that in the U. K.

Letters will be accepted and placed in a special bag up to 1/2 hour after the official closing of the mails. These letters will bear an extra 1d. stamp in addition to ordinary postage rates.

These letters should be handed over the counter with the instructions "Late Fee Letter."
