Unless there are any objections of which I am unaware I should like the "shipping" flags to fly from the tall mast in front of the Town Hall. The present flag-pole near the H.M.'s house is very small and inconspicuous and difficult for the general public to see. A notice should be put in the Gazette informing the public of this change and the different flags used & what they represent. Could we have following signs:- ?

1. Vessel entered, no mails & parcel
2. " " Letter ~~mail~~ mail
3. " " Letter mail only
4. " " Parcel mail only

But if this causes unnecessary trouble two signals will be sufficient:-

1. Vessel entered, ~~with~~ with mails
2. Vessel entered without mails

His Excellency the Governor directs it to be notified, for general information, that the following arrangements have been made to signal the arrival at Stanley of vessels from overseas with or without mails, by a flag flown from the flag staff on the north side of the Town Hall.

On the arrival of a vessel bringing a mail a red ensign will be flown and on the arrival of a vessel with no mail a blue ensign will be flown.
