We have been thirteen months in trying to get the Ship issue off the ground and if the Stamp Design Committee does not come up with something definite soon, say within the next two months, then I think we will have no choice but to go for something else.

2. There is certainly merit in having an historical issue and I am sure there would be enough material available. I've had a look at Cawkell's book and there are various persons, places, etc., which could be featured. I haven't spent long on it but such events as the visit to Saunders Island in 1765 by Captain Byron, Captain John McBride's visit to Pt. Egmont, Keppel Island, Commander Allen Gardiner, map of the Falklands and Leg Co. in 1845, John Davis and his ship Desire, de Bougainville 1764, G. W. Whittington etc.
3. As stamps are going to play an important role in our budget I suggest that I be permitted to visit the Crown Agents Stamp Bureau when I am in England. I'm sure there are many things that could be gone into without commitment which would be helpful and if we are hindering them in any way then it would be beneficial to both sides.
4. Reverting to the subject of an historical issue, if we do not use it for a definitive issue then it would make a good commemorative set of 5 stamps or two commemoratives.





10p. The left hand side of Mount Longdon should slope down more and should appear more rugged. Both Mount Longdon and Two Sisters should appear rocky rather than lush green hills!

15p. The figures in the foreground should be deleted. This would give the impression of the houses being on higher ground.

5p. Here again the background mountains should not be so lush.

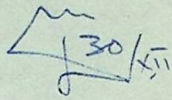

Thank you very much for your letter of 19th January 1976, regarding a suggested stamp issue featuring Early History and Settlements of the Falkland Islands.

I am seeing Mr Mitchell on Tuesday - and in fact am staying the night at his home, as we have both been invited to dinner by a member of the Foreign & Commonwealth Office. I will ask him if I may go through his collection of old photographs on Tuesday afternoon.

I think that I should tell you that I had Mr John E. Coates, who designed the Township Stamp Issue to hand last week. He works as a free lance stamp designer and is not keen to produce any more designs for Falkland Islands stamps. I told him that there had been an appeal on the Falkland Islands Radio for old pictures with a view to producing such an issue and he expressed great interest. At this stage I have provided him with photo copies of two old engravings of the Islands which appear in Linklater's two books "The Voyage of the Challenger" and "Dassow" and also the old illustration of Port Louis which appears in my book. I thought that I had better tell you this in

case, at a later stage, I might be accused of collusion! He is
incidentally also interested in proprietary designs for a series of stamps
based on old maps of the Islands.

I would add that John Cooper is a most workable
person and of his to design stamps which will be acceptable both in
design and colour to all.

I realize that you also have a gifted local artist in
John Smith, to whom you may be looking to produce future designs and
there are other stamp designers. I would not wish you to feel that I
was ~~of~~ interfering in any way except as a highly ~~and~~ objectively
interested philatelist of the end result. My chief interest is that
the Falkland Islands should maintain the standard of superb stamp
design, thus maintaining and increasing the interest of collectors in the
Islands, who are the designers, and my secondary concern is in
writing articles for commercial journals about the stamp issue with the
same objective in view.

I will let you know what I advised Mr Mitchell has
that might prove suitable and I shall take care not to pass on what
I said to Mr Cooper, without your permission.

STAMP ISSUE

Ref your P&T/2/24 of 19th. January 1976

I visited the Falkland Islands Company Limited on Tuesday and Wednesday, 3/4th. February 1976 to search for old photographs and illustrations of the Islands in response to your request.

1. Photographs. The following photographs seemed to offer possibilities:

- a. Marmont Row. An old photograph of this row of cottages, in one of which Ellen Terris, the famous actress, was born. One cottage is clearly labelled "Ship Hotel" and it is clear that the photograph was taken before modernising alterations were made to the cottages. Although the photograph has been taken from fairly high in the air (possibly from an aeroplane or a tall tower), it is perfectly large and detail so clear that there is little doubt that a skilled artist could easily alter the perspective.
- b. Adelaide Station. An old but excellent photograph of a single stone cottage entitled "Mr Holmsted's and Mr Blake's". The photo must be pre 1860 in origin.
- c. Port Sussex. An old photo of a wooden house with a roof made of small shingles, entitled "Mr Bonners". C1860.
- d. Stanley. A view of Stanley including the old Exchange Building (old Church and School), taken from across the harbour. The Exchange Building is rather small but thought to be clear and view useable.

2. Watercolours. There are four small very beautiful watercolours in an old Nautical Notebook containing notes taken by a midshipman in the course of his studies. Two of these watercolours are signed by the Revd. John Slaughter, Colonial Chaplain - although I can find no reference in histories of the Islands to this gentleman: perhaps he succeeded James Leith Moody?

- a. Berkeley Sound on 12th. Feb 1848. A landscape featuring a ship beating up a hill lined estuary, bordered by two cottages. Fresh, colorful and seemingly accurate.
- b. Port Louis. A scene showing small buildings, a Union Jack on a flag pole backed by an estuary on which 2 or 3 ships stand at anchor, whilst being loaded or unloaded, by men in small rowing boats and walking on the

grass around the buildings. Fresh, colourful and full of life

Both these paintings seem to be the work of no mere amateur, but of a skilled artist.

3. Engravings.

- a. Port Louis. Plate 1 of "The Falkland Islands" by Cawkell, Maling & Cawkell. This is a French engraving. The Falkland Islands Company Ltd, archives have an original impression of the engraving.
- b. Berkeley Sound. Page 143 of "Darwin and the Beagle", by Alan Moorehead. This is really just another view of Port Louis in black and white, and is rather a dreary scene. It is noted from the list of illustrations that it was drawn by Conrad Martens and was taken from Volume II of "Narrative of the surveying voyages of HMS Adventure and Beagle between the years 1826 and 1836, by Robert FitzRoy, 1839.
- c. Stanley, Falkland Islands. Page 267 of "The Voyage of the Challenger", by Eric Linklater. This is rather an interesting scene, showing a rough track leading up to a small town, beside an estuary, with hills in the background, and hulks lying in the shallow water. There is a church-like building which I cannot identify and a low building on top of a mound. There are 8 to 10 other double story buildings. The source of the drawing is "The Report of the Scientific Results of the Exploring Voyages of HMS Challenger during the years 1873 - 1876 50 Vols. London, Edinburgh and Dublin 1885-95. (Buchanan, J.Y., Moseley, H.N., Murray, J., Tizard, T.H., Narrative of the Voyage, contained in Volume One, parts 1 and 2.)". This particular drawing comes from part 2.

It seems to me that there are other possibilities for stamp designs on a similar theme, for example Falkland Islands Pioneers; it is understood that a portrait of Governor Moody exists in Government House; the Falkland Islands Company Ltd have an original engraving of S.F. Lafone and several photographs of F.E. Cobb. There is a photo of an engraving of Commodore John Byron in my book. No doubt there are many other pioneers including previous Governors who might be considered. Some few months ago an illustration of Government House from the back appeared in a magazine, in an article about the Crown Agents. It was an old photo? and in some ways was much more interesting than the normal front view, because it showed the various stages of construction of this building, from the very first stone building. At the moment I cannot put my hands on it.

I have not passed any of this information on to Mr John Cooter, except before you wrote to me, as I told you in my previous letter; nor have I passed it on to anyone else, who might be interested in prospecting future Falkland Islands stamp issues. However Mr Cooter does want to prospect more designs for Falkland Islands stamps, and is interested to prospect an issue featuring the Falkland Islands Company. If you wished I would be happy to take Mr Cooter along to the Falkland Islands Company to consider designs for the Early History and Settlements Stamp Issue. However I shall not do this unless you give me permission to do so, since you may wish to go about the matter in other ways.

I do hope that all this has been of some help to you.

We, in England, think a great deal about the Falkland Islanders in this time of special anxiety. At least most people in this country seem to have learnt where the Islands are, and that you are not all black! It is surprising just how much support I have heard around from ordinary people in the last

few weeks. Most of them seem to express ^{not} ~~mis~~ understanding why fleets of British Naval gunboats are not now surrounding the Islands, and the general public just ^{does} not seem to realise how weak we are as a nation! The opinion from America seems to be exactly the same.

All stamp issues have to be approved by the F.C.C. and we have at present sufficient subjects to cater for the immediate future.

Dear Mr Morrison.

Thank you very much for your kind letter of 27th. February. Unfortunately, I received your letter the morning after I had taken Mr Cooter to visit the Falkland Islands Company offices, with a view to his desire to prospect a stamp issue, or rather designs for a stamp issue, featuring the Falkland Islands Company. He was most keen to do this, and as no comment had been made on the idea in your last letter to me, I assumed that you would not be averse to it, though of course, neither had you encouraged it.

2. I have since shown Mr Cooter your letter and he has decided to continue with his prospective designs, hoping that he will be able to convince those concerned with stamp issues that his designs for such an issue are so good, that they cannot be turned down. Precedents, of course, do exist for featuring Colonial Companies on stamp issues: Southern Rhodesia issued a very popular issue in 1940, featuring the British South Africa Company, and Newfoundland in 1910 featured the "London and Bristol Company for Colonising Newfoundland" - again a very popular issue, and now of some considerable value.

Mr Cooter is also looking further into the future, as he has to do as a free lance stamp designer, and he has some good ideas for issues, looking some 2, 3 or 4 years ahead. My own private thoughts on the matter are, that whilst not encouraging the Islands to produce over many stamp issues, (indeed the present more conservative policy is the best one) the more choice of material which the committee concerned with stamps have to select from, the higher the standard the final results should be, and indeed it could save the committee a great deal of worry and time spent on research. But after all the selection is the decision of the committee in the Islands, and no one can deny that they must have the final choice. Others of us interested can merely suggest.

Yesterday, I submitted a 1,000 word article on the Sheep Farming Industry issue to Stamp Collecting Weekly, and it is hoped that the article will be published concurrent with the date of release of the stamps - or at least during the same week. I shall forward a copy of the article to the Secretariat, when it has been published. I am hoping to prospect a similar, but longer article for publication in one of the sheep or wool magazines. Hopefully, this will help push the sales for you.

- 1.3 Historical Issue: The Design Committee have submitted recommendations taking in Keppel Island, Port Egmont, Port Louis and Stanley. All the material had not been seen by the Committee and it was agreed to defer disoussion of it to the next meeting.

EARLY HISTORY AND SETTLEMENTS STAMP ISSUE

" I visited the Falkland Islands Company Limited on Tuesday and Wednesday, 3/4th February 1976 to search for old photographs and illustrations of the Islands in response to your request.

1. Photographs. The following photographs seemed to offer possibilities:
 - a. Marmont Row. An old photograph of this row of cottages, in one of which Ellen Terris, the famous actress, was born. One cottage is clearly labelled "Ship Hotel" and it is clear that the photograph was taken before modernising alterations were made on the cottages. Although the photograph has been taken from fairly high in the air (possibly from a low aeroplane or a tall tower), it is perfectly large and detail so clear that there is little doubt that a skilled artist could easily alter the perspective.
 - b. Adelaide Station. An old but excellent photograph of a single stone cottage entitled "Mr Holmstedts and Mr Blake's". The photo must be pre 1860 in origin.
 - c. Port Sussex. An old photo of a wooden house with a roof made of small shingles, entitled "Mr Bonners". c1860.
 - d. Stanley. A view of Stanley including the old Exchange Building (old Church and School), taken from across the harbour. The Exchange Building is rather small but thought to be clear and useable.
2. Watercolours. There are four small very beautiful watercolours in an old Nautical Notebook containing notes taken by a midshipman in the course of his studies. Two of these watercolours are signed by the Revd. John Slaughter, Colonial Chaplain - although I can find no reference in histories of the Islands to this gentleman: perhaps he succeeded James Leith Moody?
 - a. Berkeley Sound on the 12th Feb. 1848. A landscape featuring a ship beating up a hill lined estuary, bordered by two cottages. Fresh, colourful and seemingly accurate.
 - b. Port Louis. A scene showing small buildings, a Union Jack on a flag pole backed by an estuary on which 2 or 3 ships stand at anchor, whilst being loaded or unloaded, by men in small rowing boats and walking on the grass around the buildings. Fresh, colourful and full of life.

Both these paintings seem to be the work of no mere amateur, but of a skilled artist.
3. Engravings.
 - a. Port Louis. Plate 1 of "The Falkland Islands", by Cawkell, Maling & Cawkell. This is a French engraving. The Falkland Islands Company Ltd, archives have an original impression of the engraving.
 - b. Berkeley Sound. Page 143 of "Darwin and the Beagle", by Alan Moorehead. This is really just another view of Port Louis in black and white, and is rather a dreary scene. It is noted from the list of illustrations that it was drawn by Conrad Martens and was taken from Volume II of "Narrative of the surveying voyages of HMS Adventure and Beagle between the years 1826 and 1836", by Robert FitzRoy, 1839.
 - c. Stanley, Falkland Islands. Page 267 of "The Voyage of the Challenger", by Eric Linklater. This is rather an interesting scene, showing a rough track leading up to a small town, beside an estuary, with hills in the background, and hulks lying in the shallow water. There is a church-like building which I cannot identify and a low building on top of a mound. There are 8 to 10 other double story buildings. The source of the drawing is "The Report of the Scientific Results of the Exploring Voyages of HMS Challenger during the years 1873-1876" 50 Vols. London, Edinburgh and Dublin 1885-95. (Buchanan, J.Y., Noseley, H.N., Murray, J., Tizard, T.H., Narrative of the Voyage, contained in Volume One, parts 1 and 2.)". This particular drawing comes from part 2.

2. The local Design Committee made a suggestion that the following settlements should be portrayed -

- i) Keppel Island - Mission Station established by Captain Snow in February 1853.
- ii) Port Egmont- First British Settlement established by Captain Byron in January 1765.
- iii) Port Louis- First seat of British Government established by Captain Onslow in January 1833.
- iv) Stanley- Seat of Government moved from Port Louis by Lt Moody in March 1843.

3. It is suggested that Boyson's Book called The Falkland Islands might provide material on which the artist could draw. There is also an illustration in Cawkell's Book called the Falkland Islands.

4. I am sorry that we are unable to provide anything other than the above scanty information, but hope that this will enable you to pursue the matter and produce some designs. The above suggestions are by no means our definitive thoughts on this issue and you should feel free to expand or pursue other lines that occur to you.

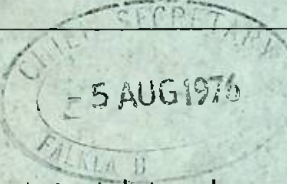



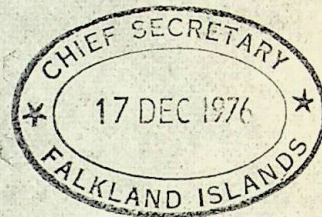

With reference to the above stamp issue, I am pleased to enclose for your perusal three rough stamp designs together with a rough First Day Cover design.

2 Although the composition of the designs as they stand is good and the aspect generally pleasing, our publicity section have commented upon the absence of a selling theme and the general lack of detail. Thematic interest could be heightened by throwing some emphasis onto the ships where they occur by changing the aspect somewhat. Any greater change would necessitate access to appropriate reference material and we have already stretched our resources. For your information, I have detailed below our source of reference for each design.

5p The design is based on a photograph opposite P.149 in Cawkell's 'The Falkland Islands'. The caption identifies it as 'Sullivan House, the Mansion House on Keppel Island'. Mr Mitchell of the Falkland Islands Company assures me this is the original Mission Station.

10p Based on a black and white illustration on P.267 of 'The Voyage of the Challenger' by Eric Linklater. Circa 1875/76.

15p Based on an original watercolour by Rev. J Slaughter in a Midshipmans Scrapbook borrowed from Mr Mitchell. Circa 1845?

First Day Cover:

Part of an engraving circa 1764 from Boyson's 'The Falkland Islands'.

3 Incidentally, you may wish to decide on the general treatment to be employed as regards the border or absence of it for the finished design. Please state whether you have any preference in order that we may instruct the designer accordingly.

THE STORY OF THE FALKLAND ISLANDS 25

(43)

known controversy between Junius and Dr. Johnson. Junius, who wrote acrimoniously for fame, severely censured the policy of the Government; while Dr. Johnson, who wrote for bread, brilliantly defended the Ministry.

On the 15th November, 1772, the last expedition to Port Egmont left England. It was sent out there in the *Endeavour* storeship, and had on board in pieces the armed shallop *Penguin* of 36 tons, mounting ten swivels. The Surgeon's Mate, Bernard Penrose, has drawn aside the screen, and has thus described the settlement as it then was:

"It was situated on the south side of an island, named Saunder's, from whence there was a view of the whole harbour called Port Egmont. Its ornament and defence was a large timber blockhouse, which had been framed in England, and carried out in pieces as our shallop was. It could mount four guns, and had a good command of the landing-place; but if attacked with any considerable force, it was incapable of much resistance, but must capitulate on any terms; for on the enemies firing a tar-barrel under it, they might soon reduce it to ashes. This fort we found converted into a store-house on account of its capaciousness and security, and as such we used it during our continuance on the island. Besides this, there were some other buildings of an inferior construction, erected by the unskilful hands of marine architects out of what materials the shore afforded, such as stones and sods, and thatched for the most part with *Penguin* grass (tussac grass). In the most splendid of these, which was covered with tarred canvas, the Captain of the *Hound* had taken up his residence while he was Governor of the place; and in this dwelling he was succeeded by our Commander, Lieutenant Clayton, who had the area in the front enclosed, for distinction's sake, with a small parapet wall, on which the shallop's swivels were mounted, and which we fired on every occasion of rejoicing. Not far from hence was a house of somewhat

26 THE STORY OF THE FALKLAND ISLANDS

less elegance appropriated to the use of the petty officers, whose inferiority of rank might be discovered at a distance by another circumstance besides that of the battery; for whereas the chimney of the chief officer's mansion was made out of an old ship's funnel, that of the others was composed of a cask clapped on the roof. The habitation of the private men was a long building, which Captain Burr had raised as an additional store, and it is easy to conceive it did not excel the rest in magnificence. . . . But it must not be imagined that these hastily erected edifices were in the best repair; we found at our taking possession of them, that they required much attention, in order to make them weather-proof; which we effected, by giving them an additional wall of sods, and binding on new thatch upon the rafters, which were mostly ribs of whales that had been cast on the beach. We had likewise two sheds, one for the carpenters, and another for the smiths, and at the distance of a musket from the blockhouse was an enclosure with a slight hovel within it, occupied by the people who took care of the little live stock we had among us. But the glory of our Colony was the gardens, which we cultivated with the greatest care, as being fully convinced how much the comforts of our situation depended upon our being plentifully supplied with vegetables." Then follows a list of thirteen vegetables which they produced.

On the 23rd April, 1774, the *Endeavour* sailed into Port Egmont with instructions that the settlement was to be evacuated, but that the marks and signals of possession and property were to be left upon the islands, to indicate the right of possession, and to show that the occupation might be resumed. On May the 20th a formal leave of the islands was taken, and the following inscription, engraved on a piece of lead, was affixed to the door of the blockhouse:

"Be it known to all nations,

"That Falkland's Island, with this fort, the storehouses, wharfs, harbours, bays, and creeks thereunto belonging,



Thank you for your letter of 28th November 1977. We have looked at the designs and think that they are very good. We would still like, however, to pursue the idea of featuring Port Egmont even though there appears to be no illustration to which I can refer you. I attach a description of Port Egmont which should enable your artist to create a design which should go a long way to meeting our needs. We have some doubt in our minds of the propriety of doing this, particularly if it could be challenged at a later date as not being authentic. You will be aware of the question of the Argentine claim to the Falklands and how essential it is that anything we depict about the early settlements must be accurate. With this in mind I would be grateful if you would approach the Hong Kong & General Department of the FCO to whom I am copying this letter and ask them about the propriety of issuing a stamp based on an artists impression.

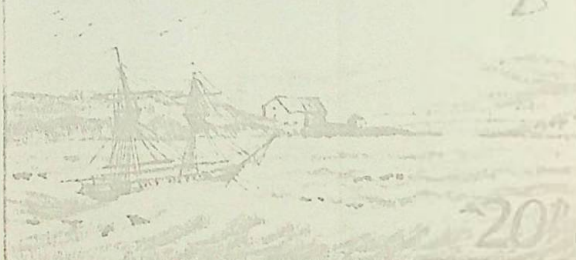

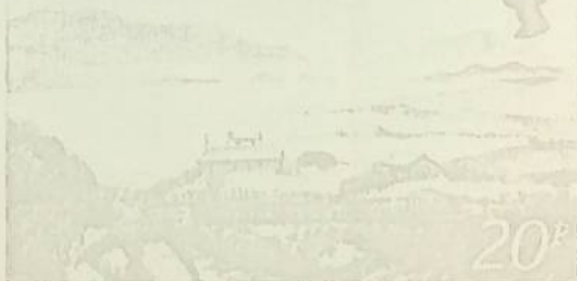



1. In reply to your telephone enquiry about the final sentence of the letter dated 4 January 1978 from Mr Morrison to Mike Vaughan, I write to say that in principle there is no objection to stamp designs being based on an artist's impression. It is not to be understood, however, that this means artistic licence may be indulged in indiscriminately. Each case needs to be judged on its own merit and it is important to bear in mind the relation of the artist's impression with the truth he is trying to express.
2. Insofar as Mr Morrison's suggestion is concerned if it can be established that no early photographs or prints exist showing Port Egmont, there could be no objection to an artist drawing up a picture based on a verbal description of Port Egmont. Before taking that step, however, it would be worth asking the Scott Polar Research Institute in Cambridge whether they are aware of any pictures of this settlement.

Mr Clive Abbott, the artist, made the following comments about this design:-

- i) He has shown the fort elevated on wooden supports because of the reference in the text "for on the enemies firing a tar barrell under it, they might soon reduce it to ashes".
- ii) The Chief Officer's mansion is said to have had a chimney "made out of an old ship's funnel". We will have to check on this before the finished design is completed because a ship's funnel would seem to imply a steam ship. However, the old vessels must have had a funnel to take away cooking fumes and the such like from the hold.
- iii) Mr Abbott would like a photograph of the site of Port Egmont so he can accurately portray the coast line and horizon on the finished design.

I return the art work which we find acceptable.

We are in a quandary as regards the values: the Post Office has made proposals for a change in the postage rates but these are subject to approval by Executive Council, and, of course, we cannot anticipate what the decision of Council will be. This leaves us in a bit of a spot as naturally we want our stamps to relate to a postage rate; but it is impossible to achieve this with stamps which must be produced a year ahead. The alternative is to settle for the present rates, which makes us look a bit foolish when the stamps are placed on sale in a year's time, if Council agree to a change in rates. It is, as you will readily appreciate, much more convenient for the Post Office and customer just to use one stamp on a package rather than two.

With regard to copyright and Mr. A. F. Cobb, I have it on good authority that Mr. A. F. Cobb died some years ago. I do not know if this solves your copyright problem or not; I hope it does. The late Mr. Cobb has no relations living here.

You have already given your blessing to the release of a short set of stamps featuring the early settlements of Port Louis, Port Egmont, Stanley, and the Mission Centre on Keppel Island - Your file HKG 205/492/1 refers.

2. We have now got as far as agreeing to stamp designs, and the design for the First Day Cover which is a reproduction from Boysons "The Falkland Islands" - copy attached; see also plate 1 in the Cawkell book "The Falkland Islands".

3. A suggestion has been made that we should have on the First Day Cover the Clayton tablet left at Port Egmont in 1774. For the wording see p.35 of the Cawkell book.

4. As this introduces a slightly different aspect, I should be grateful if you would let me have your views. If you see no objection to this you may feel disposed to tell the Crown Agents at Sutton to substitute the Clayton tablet for the Port Louis picture - this would save time.

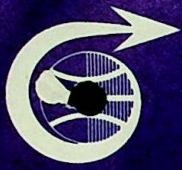

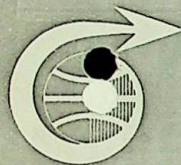
EARLY SETTLEMENTS ISSUE

The Stamp Committee viewed the First Day Cover design for the above issue yesterday and, while finding the presentation of it acceptable, inasmuch as it is a true reproduction of the engraving from Boyson's book "The Falkland Islands", the Committee felt that we are over-doint the French presence by featuring Port Louis both on a stamp and on the FDC.

2. The Committee thought that, instead of the proposed design, there may be another early picture of Stanley that could be used or, better still, an early map or chart of the Port Egmont area where the first British settlement was. Hawkins did some surveying in that area and there may well be a map or chart which would be suitable for the FDC.

3. I realise, of course, that, historically, the French had the first settlement, but perhaps politically we should be emphasising the continued British presence since 1833. Patriotism, as you can see, prevails! Anyway, I pass these thoughts to you in the hope that you can run down something for the cover; if not, we will stay with the artwork as presented, which I return herewith.



2. Now that we have received the finished artwork, I see that I was under the mistaken impression that the Port Louis stamp featured the French settlement. This came about because all we had on file was a rather poor photocopy of the original design. I am sorry about this, and you need not pursue the idea of something to replace the FDC design.

3. The Stamp Committee has taken a long hard look at the designs: we see this as an important issue which will be looked at very critically from various quarters.

4. The committee members felt that the following changes are necessary and I should be grateful if you could arrange for them to be undertaken. I realise that time is getting short, but if need be we shall just have to delay the issue or insert it in the programme for another year. (Could the Peter Oxenham Working Animals come forward a bit if need arose to change these around?) The changes required are:

3p We have already had the artist change this and it is still not right. On reflection we prefer to go back to the original and make the stamp a copy of the drawing appearing at p.267 of "The Voyage of the Challenger" by Eric Linklater.

1lp Leave as it is but the two buildings to be shown in less well preserved state. I attach a copy of a description of the buildings which indicates that they were made from what materials the shore afforded such as stones and sods, and thatched for the most part with tussac grass. The "most splendid" was covered with tarred canvas.

I think you will agree that, as shown, the buildings - not the blockhouse, as this was brought out from England - are too well constructed for what seems to have been rather a roughly built settlement; and I say this with all due respects to the endurance and capacity to improvise of the settlers.

25p If you are satisfied that this is a true reproduction of the original then please proceed. In the case of the 3p and 25p we would have to indicate that they were reproductions of originals because we are bound to be challenged on their accuracy; but if we are reproducing a drawing of the early days then we can defend it as an accurate reproduction.

-2-

5. In all cases the greens should be more in keeping with the slides you have. The Mission House (33p) looks too much like a well-kept English house with a fine lawn. The hills in the background are also too green. There is a lot of white grass in the Falklands which reduces the green look to a mixture as shown in the enclosed two slides which I would like returned in due course.

Business: Consideration of the artwork of the Early Settlements Issue.

It was agreed that, as portrayed, all four designs needed changing. Numerous methods of improvement were considered, from colour changes to new artwork being prepared.

It was noted that the issue was scheduled for release in November 1980 and that a major revision of the artwork might necessitate the postponement of the issue, the rescheduling of the 1980 programme, or for only three stamp issues in 1980.

Each design was considered and the following agreed upon:

3p Port Stanley. It was noted that the design was prepared from an artist's water colour impression of Port Stanley during the visit of HMS Challenger 1875/76 and should therefore be appropriately advertised as such, and redrawn as a reproduction of the original.

11p. Port Egmont. This design was an artist's impression of the settlement at Port Egmont based on a description of the settlement in "The Story of the Falkland Islands". It was felt that the construction of the buildings was not in accordance with the limited material available for construction, ie stones, whalebones, tussac grass, and tarred canvas, and that the buildings, other than the blockhouse should be shown less well constructed and more in keeping with the description of the settlement.

25p Port Louis. This design, also prepared from a water colour engraving from "A Midshipman's Scrapbook" circa 1845 was acceptable, provided this was made known.

33p Mission House, Keppel Island. This was acceptable. It was noted that in all cases the green of the grass needed reducing to the colours predominant in the Falkland Islands where there is a lot of white grass.

Our comments as follows:

3p Majority of sheets badly registered, double flagpoles etc. also colour variations, practically from one sheet to the next and about 50 sheets from bundle of 500 stamps badly centered i.e. perforation into stamp design. A number of sheets are also noticeable for blegs/ blobs.

11p One bundle of 500 sheets opened. Misregistration on every other sheet, also bad colour variations on over 20 sheets.

25p One bundle 500 sheets opened. Bad registration, i.e. double flagpoles, ships masts and sails, figure in trousers on one side of sheet turns into long skirt on other. Colour variations noted but not so drastic as 11p.

33p One bundle 500 sheets opened. Bad registration particularly on windows and fences. Colour variation not really noticeable.

Regret we do not have time to examine remaining sheets individually and quick flip through reveals errors mentioned above.

Majority misregistration appears on left hand side of sheets i.e. up to four rows across. Significant difference between top left hand stamps and bottom right.

Regret we cannot accept these (unless we are being over critical) but errors of this nature have not been noticeable previously. Please take up with printer and proceed reprint. Release to be postponed and will confirm new date when advice on reprints received.

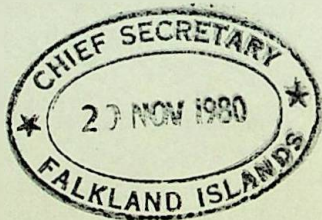

A most interesting proposition has been suggested to us by the firm Calhoun Collectors Society Incorporated of Minneapolis, USA, and we offer it for your consideration. A speedy decision is required and so I would like to receive your reaction, favourable or otherwise, by cable. I hope that I can explain the proposition successfully.

2 Calhoun's propose to produce a series of First Day Covers and are hoping to gain your permission to feature the 25p value of the Early Settlements Stamp Issue on 4,000 of these private covers. They have offered to pay a 5 US cent cancellation fee plus a royalty of 200 US dollars.

3 The unique feature of the FDC would be that before it was sent out to the collector, Calhoun's would fix an exact, true replica of the postage stamp, made from 14ct gold leaf. We have explained that your stamp design is covered by copyright and so it would be necessary for you to sanction the proposal, but the idea seems quite legitimate to us and we cannot see any likelihood of damage to your philatelic reputation.

4 The programme of events is as follows:

- 1) Upon receipt of your agreement to the proposal Calhoun's will print the FDC and affix a stamp (which they will purchase at face value through our agency in the USA, Stangib Ltd) which we hope you will be able to supply from your stock.
- 2) FDCs will be sent to you for cancellation on the first day of issue, and subsequently returned to Calhoun's.
- 3) Meantime, Calhoun's production team will have produced engraved dies and the necessary tools to make exact replicas of the postage stamp in gold leaf.


- 4) When Calhoun's receive from you the cancelled FDCs, they will affix one gold replica to each (it cannot be done earlier as the gold leaf is too fragile to withstand repeated handling or heavy buffetting in transit).
- 5) The cancellation fee of 5 US cents plus negotiated royalties, will be credited to your account when Calhoun's have received the fully serviced covers.

5 As far as we can see, the operation is not of a security nature; the stamp replicas will not be postally valid but they will increase your revenue through 1980 at no extra expense to your Government because we will make it clear to Calhoun's all freight charges will be for their account.

6 Should you decide to accept the project as outlined above, please despatch the 4,000 x 25p stamps to Stangib Ltd, 1325 Franklin Avenue, Garden City, New York 11530, USA and advise us of the despatch details.

7 If you have any queries or doubts, please cable, but hopefully you will give me a cable to go ahead shortly.

I have received running proofs for the re-print of your above issue, from Bruder Rosenbaum. I have examined these running proofs on your behalf, and consider them to be satisfactory. In view of the urgency, I instructed Bruder Rosenbaum yesterday by telex to despatch all supplies, warning them that they would be committed to accept full liability if any stock were found to be defective.

!??

2 I also take the opportunity to advise you that as a result of further review it will be necessary to increase our security control fee from 5p to 6p per 1000 stamps in respect of all despatches after 1 January 1981. Whilst any increase is regretted, I am sure you will appreciate the need for us to make a realistic charge for this very labour-intensive work. Much of the time of our Control Staff at the printers' works is devoted to the careful counting and issuing of paper for printing, and the counting and reconciliation of all sheets of stamps, both good and mis-printed. As the security control charge is a fixed rate per 1000 stamps rather than a percentage of costs, our revenue therefore is unaffected by increased production costs. The increase will mean that the charge has only doubled in 10 years, whereas the related salaries have more than tripled in the same period.

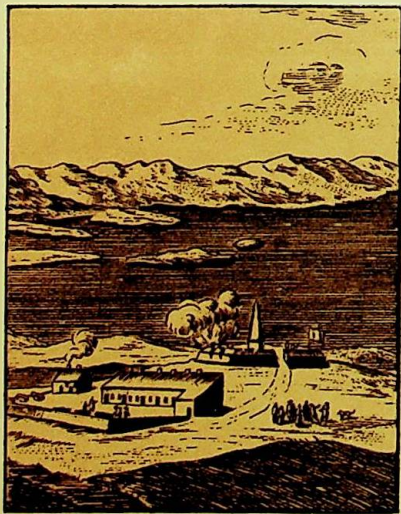
