

I would suggest we go ahead with the Mammals set and ask Mr. Strange to re-design the Conservation stamp by deleting the porpoise and adding a second specie of seal.

We had thought of a 'Kelp' issue years and years ago - infact it is in our stamp programme for 1979. I am sure Mr. Strange could produce some very interesting designs on the Kelp theme and suggest he be asked to produce a sample.

Stamp Designs

Dear Sir,

Further to our conversation regarding stamp designs covering the theme of <u>Seaweeds</u>, it is understood that the five rough designs submitted to you have been approved by the Stamp Committee and that a request has been made for the final art work to be produced.

I have noted the terms for such work as laid out in (copy of letter from Crown Agents Ref HI/FALK IS 4/31594 your ref: P&T/2/26) The fees of 25£ for each accepted rough and £75 for each piece of finished art work are acceptable. I also agree to the fees for First Day Covers ie £20 for rough design and £25 for the completed art work. However on the question of invoicing for the entire work on completion of the commission this is not acceptable. It will be appreciated that a considerable amount of both research and art work has already gone into the rough designs. I would therefore request that fees for accepted roughs be paid at this stage, with final art work fees being invoiced for on completion of that work. This arrangement would greatly facilitate special outlays expected in the production of the final art work.

In our conversation we also discussed the Marine Mammal theme which I proposed some time back. I would be quite prepared to work on this design and submit roughs for your approval, but again feel that the commission should have a small measure of insurance for the artist prior to commencement of the work. I would therefore propose that a fee of £25 might be paid at the time the commission is accepted. This fee to be deducted from payment made for accepted roughs, but should the roughs not be acceptable and the design abandoned the artist would retain this initial fee to help cover a percentage of time incured.

Should the above be acceptable I would be grateful if you could inform me at your earliest convenience so that final work might be started on these themes this winter.

If it would be helpful to your own plans it would probably be possible to submit roughs of the Marine Mammal theme before the first week in May.

STAMP DESIGNS : DOLPHIN AND PORPOISE

Notes on rough designs.

As the subjects of the theme for this design are generally black and white a lot more attention will be given to the background colouring in any final design work. Example, although "green" may be used for the backing of one particular design, it is proposed to shade these colours, so in effect obtaining a variation in colour and adding depth to the whole design.

Five species of Dolphin and Porpoise, including the "Killer Whale" which is a true dolphin, have been shown. One other species is a possibility but expert advice is awaited on this. It is suggested that if a sixth species can be used, then this might be replace the Killer whale, thus leaving this species free for use in a further set depicting a different group of marine mammals, which might be used in the future.

Although a silhouette of HM has been used on the roughs it is proposed to use the Royal Cipher on final work.

THE FALKLAND ISLANDS POSTAGE STAMP ISSUES

- i) MARINE MAMMALS 1979
- ii) CONSERVATION 1981
- iii) KELP 1983

I have recently reviewed the status of each of the above stamp issues and find that my understanding of the progress of each is vague to say the least.

I admit some confusion has arisen because reference to the production of the three sets has been made in various correspondence from both your office and Mr Strange. Therefore, I would appreciate your appraisal of the artwork produced to date so we may proceed accordingly.

I take each issue in order of release.

i) 1979 - MARINE MAMMALS:

This set is the most pressing since a release date is planned for next year. Regrettably, I see that we had not formally commissioned Mr Strange to prepare the artwork so I enclose our letter of commission and request you to forward it to him. Also enclosed is a copy for your records.

I understand Mr Strange has already submitted five rough designs for your approval which I would like to view before he prepares the finished artworks so we may assess their suitability for printing and make any necessary constructive criticism at this early stage in production.

I would reiterate our customary warning that time is of the essence in the production of all stamp issues. Thus we would like to complete the artwork as soon as possible to avoid any subsequent delay which might jeopardise the proposed release date.

In your reply, will you please advise the release date planned as well as your local requirements, if known at this stage.

ii) 1981 - CONSERVATION:

Although the scheduled release date is more than three years away your early advice on the design concept would be valued. I would be happy to undertake any research on your behalf.

We originally commissioned Mr Strange, at your request, to prepare this artwork in our letter dated November 1975. We would point out that there has been a subsequent increase in our artists' fees since that time. Therefore, you may find our letter to Doug Morrison H1/1618 of 9 January helpful in determining the scale of fees now due.

iii) 1983 - KELP:

Our comments concerning the early preparation of designs also apply to the Kelp set.

I understand Mr Strange has completed five designs and I would like to see them before the finished artwork is completed.

You will find enclosed a rough design submitted by Mr J E Cootem at the instigation of Major Spafford. I do not know whether you will be interested in it since you have already viewed Mr Strange's work on this subject. However, I enclose it for your comments.

In addition to a status report on each of these issues, I would like to clarify the matter of settling Mr Strange's invoices in respect of his commission.

As you know, it appears we cannot pay Mr Strange direct by airmail transfer of funds because there is no bank on the Falkland Islands. Therefore it would seem best policy if you were to continue the practise of reimbursing Mr Strange locally in accordance with the fees offered in our commissioning letters.

However, if this means of payment is not acceptable, will you kindly let me know and at the same time advise an alternative method of remittance so we may overcome this problem of lack of banking facilities in the Islands.

I now look forward to your advice on these stamp issues.

FALKLAND ISLANDS "MARINE MAMMALS" STAMP ISSUE

I regret the delay in confirming your commission to prepare the designs in respect of the Marine Mammals stamp issue. However, will you please design this special set of five stamps and First Day Cover as discussed with the Falklands Island Secretariat.

The fees payable for this work, subject to acceptance of each design, are:-

- i) Stamp artwork
 - £35.00 for each rough design £95.00 for each finished design
- ii) First Day Cover artwork
 £25.00 for the rough design
 £40.00 for the finished design

Please note that if any photo setting for lettering and overlays etcetera is to be done in England, then the above fees may be slightly reduced.

As with the 'Kelp' and 'Conservation' stamp issues, the required finished stamp size is to be 28.45mm x 42.58mm. Therefore the finished artwork size should be 102mm x 158mm. This allows a white border around the design.

I understand you have already submitted the rough designs to M_Γ Massingham, Chief Secretary. I would also like to view them before you prepare the finished artwork so that we may assess their suitability for printing and make any necessary constructive criticism at an early stage in production.

I look forward to receiving your acceptance of this commission as well as the rough artwork.

I attach a letter to you from Ian Strange, a copy of a letter to me, and two pieces of artwork for you to view and comment on.

At one time it was thought that there were only five species of dolphin and porpoise in these waters but Ian Strange has had in confirmed that there are six. While not challenging his knowledge or information passed to him, we think it prudent to get you to do a check on this but I shall write about this later.

Do you see any objection to a six stamp issue? We think this is a bit much, but could keep the overall cost down. An alternative wouldd be to issue six stamps but have some stamps of the same value (different mammals). We will be having five stamps in the Kelp issue totalling 58p and naturally do not wish to overdo the numbers of stamps in short sets.

I should be grateful for your views on the wisdom of a six stamp issue, if possible before you comment on the design and other points raised by Ian Strange, so that we can tell him what the position is: you may even wish to telegraph.





We have been in touch with the Sea Mammal Research Unit BAS who make the following comments:

"1) Commerson's Dolphin - frequently seen, and stranded specimens recorded

2) Dusky Dolphin - stranded specimen recorded

3) Peale's Dolphin - frequently seen, and stranded specimens recorded

(Better to use name Peale's Dolphin which is accepted internationally)

4) Spectacled Porpoise - stranded specimens recorded (Phocoena is the correct spelling)

5) Hourglass Dolphin (Lagenorhynchus cruciger)

- There are two sight records at sea, both some distance from the Falkland Islands, but it probably occurs in the waters off the islands

(The accepted name is Hourglass Dolphin; there is no such animal as Cruciger's Dolphin, but the name Cruciger Dolphin has been used in the past).


On the above basis, the first four species occur in the waters of the Falkland Islands, and the fifth probably also does."

Dolphins & Porpoises Issue

I refer to Brian Hawthorne's letter of 28th June with comments on the above issue. It is always very helpful to obtain further comments on such matters and for these I am grateful.

Commerson's and Peale's Dolphin we know well here and the art work is taken from many observations made in the field. For most of the other species I have had to rely on notes of stranded specimens, photographs and descriptions by a few other observers.

In the case of the Mourglass Dolphin, I believe I was in fact responsible for giving you the old title of Gruciger, but you will note that the former name is shown on the art work. The species was included in our list as we have authentic records of the animal in Falkland waters - in fact my art work is taken from a photograph of a specimen stranded on one of the west islands. Unfortunately as BAS do not extend their studies to these Islands they would not have been aware of this. Most of our records of such animals go direct to Dr Fraser of the British Museum, to when we have always looked as the expert on such animals; this in turn has led me to take such nomenclature as Peale's Porpoise, which Dr Fraser uses, as opposed to Dolphin.

The question of nomenclature and actual descriptions of species I do view as a slight problem, not only with such mammals but with some of our birds, therefore I feel it might be helpful if I could be permitted to make the following comments.

In the case of the Order Cetacea there are many varying views by 'official' zoologists on the divisions of these animals. Descriptions often vary depending on the areas in which these animals are found and in consequence views can differ on whether or not they belong to one or two distinct groups. For example, although we here accept that Peale's Forpoise is a different species to the Dusky Dolphin (fortunately it seems both Dr Fraser and BAS zoologists also agree) there are other zoologists who would throw out the species of Peale's saying it was the same as the Dusky Dolphin and should therefore not exist on our list!

From this I believe we can see that a similar situation could occur with art work carried out here. Ye must be prepared to accept that many of the subjects, although perhaps of the same species, in appearance or colour may vary from those of other regions. Unfortunately, however, we lack ralkland experts to back up such matters.



Please find endosed herewith the 6 designs/prepared by Ian Strange which have been submitted to the British Museum for appraisal.

On the whole, it would appear that the B, M, Expert is not tuned in to the same wavelength as Mr Strange and I append the following extract from his letter concerning the designs:

"1 SPELLING Accurate except that Cephalorhynchus commersoni, should have only one 'i'. Although Lagenorhynchus australis is a dolphin as opposed Lagenorhynchus australis is a dolpnin as opposed to a porpoise its vernacular name is Peale's porp not Peale's colphin. General remarks In all cases the tail flukes are all but one of the illustrations for the eyes, as well as the bright red used for the interior of the mouth of the Killer whale.

Individual comments

(a) <u>Lagenorhynchus australis</u> Peale's porpoise Flippers and tail flukes too long. White patch by axilla far too big. Dorsal fin should be more upright. Upper jaw gives the impression of being far too broad.

(b) Lagenorhynchus cruciger Hour-glass dolphin The black area on the flank should surround the eye, not finish posteriorly to it. The white area on the ventral surface should end by the vent.

(c) <u>Lagenorhynchus obscurus</u> Dusky dolphin
The outline of the head and mouth is misshapen.

(d) Cephalorhynchus commersoni Commersons dolphin Flippers too long and misshapen. Anterior border of white area on flank should stop short of eye dorsally, but cut through axilla laterally.

- (e) Orcinus orca Killer whale Outline of whole animal, including dorsal fin, flippers and tail-flukes distorted. There should be teeth in both jaws.
- (f) Phocoena dioptrica Spectacled porpoise Lines on tail flukes and flippers give a fin-like appearance (c f fishes). Flippers too far forward. Point of maximum girth too far forward.

I hope that these comments will be of use in enabling you to obtain more scientifically accurate illustrations."

Perhaps you would care to discuss the matter further with Ian Strange. If he violently objects to the comments made by the British Museum This was be I suggest we should refer the designs to the BAS or similar authority Andward to arbitrate.

STAIR DESIGNS

Thank you for your letters dated 23 and 27 November with enclosures - your references P&T/2/35 and P&T/2/37 respectively.

1. DOLPHINS AND PORPOIS S STAMP ISSUE:

I thought we might have a few comments from the British Museum and although some refer to points which might not eventually show on the finished stamps they are helpful.

Regarding some points, colour of eyes for example: these I appreciate do not show as bright red but felt in dealing with such a small image there was some need to emphasise hence the "artist's licence". The red of the Killer whale 's mouth was also emphasised, namally it would appear lighter. I see to my horror I missed the bottom teeth out of the animal!

Unfortunately I do not have earlier letters to hand which refer to this difficulty of variations in animals etc., depending on regions, but I feel we might have come up against this problem a little with this issue. However I think we can find a solution and I will do my best to correct the mistakes and incorporate the points made by the British Museum.

Also in one of my early letters dealing with this issue the question arose of correct vernacular naming. I believe I made the point then that there are two schools of thought on such naming, and actually mentioned the Peale's Do phin and Peale's Porpoise as examples. I personally have always used the name Peale's Porpoise but believe I an correct in saying that one authority corrected us, hence my use of the name Peale's Dolphin on the art work; such is life. If a you do not mind perhaps I can leave you to decide on which name we must eventually use. Perhaps one should decide who is going to be offended least!

One thing which would be most helpful would be a request to the BM asking if they could kindly supply illustrations of the species mentioned. In this way I can see exactly how the various descriptions vary.

2. MAPS AND CHARTS ISSUE:

The suggestions made by Mike Vaughan I feel are good. The elimination of the black and white border would certainly help as he rightly points out to reduce the "cramped" feeling. I have not been over-keen on the bleeding off effect through the perforation which can be seen on some stamp designs, but in the case of this particular issue it might well produce a nice effect - certainly I would be willing to try this.

Peales

The Machin silhouette was shown as I feel it is more in keeping with the designs we are attempting to show. The two examples which were enclosed I felt were too "modern looking" for what might be termed an "antique looking" design. Would it be possible to obtain examples of the Machin silhouette from Mike Vaughan, for the examples of the silhouette used on my rough art work were my own reconstructions of that style and probably far from correct.

Further to your letter of 23rd November. Ref P&T/2/33 and the comments made by the British Museum on the art work for the above issue, I am now able to return the completed final art work.

All comments were followed carefully and in one or two cases completely new art work produced to obtain illustrations that are scientifically accurate. However, I would like to add a few points from the design and art angle so that the problems from both sides can be studied.

The Peales Porpoise which have been studied carefully here appear to have a very dull reddy-brown eye, Commerson's is very similar. In order to give what will finally be a very small image some life, red was purposely added to the art work. In the repainted work the reds have been toned down. The same was correct about the mouth of the Killer Whale. However in this case the design has been slightly altered to show the mouth of this animal closed.

One of the main problems facing the actual design work and the requirement to work to a certain size and shape was that a subject which is generally fairly long in proportion to width, had to be fitted to a stamp shape of different proportions. This was particularly so with the Killer Whale and Spectacled porpoise, but I hope the design modifications are now closer. Looking at the BAT "Whale Issue" I imagine the artist had the same problem hence the special shape of that particular stamp issue.

Besides the modifications suggested by the British Museum I elected to make one small design change myself. In the value tablets the size of the "P" has been changed to a slightly smaller size.

As per your instructions the name Peales Dolphin has once again been changed to Peales Porpoise. I certainly agree to this, only hope one of the groups of experts are not too offended!

The six final art works together with art work for the first day cover are enclosed.
