"DUKE OF EDINBURGH" AND NEW DEFINITIVES

Jeryour derly comments pl DM 13/1/80

Thank you for your programme letter of the 10 October 1980. For the moment, I would like to discuss just the two topics mentioned above. I promised in my lengthy telex of 17 October (last paragraph) that I would give you some more information if you were interested in the "Duke of Edinburgh Award Scheme" issue, which you obviously are. The first thing I would like to settle is where you propose to fit this issue into your programme; I would recommend mid September - The British Post Office are issuing theirs in August, but August is rather a "dead" month for European philatelic sales, whilst by mid September the publicity bandwagon will have penetrated the American market. Please advise me whether OC F you will issue this set before or after "fish", and will you push "surveyors" back into 1982? If so, this may cause a number of changes to your programme letter, bearing in mind that the "Darwin" mini bus is likely to have a release date which will soon be fixed around April 1982.

- 2 Mike Vaughan is handling the overall co-ordination of this omnibus, and each participating Principal will issue four stamps, one featuring a portrait or photograph of Prince Philip, and three stamps illustrating local activities. Obviously we shall need a considerable amount of help from you for these three stamps, and I trust that you will be able to contact the local organiser of the scheme. Meanwhile, Mike is working on introducing a measure of uniformity by means of common features, such as stamp size, layout, style of lettering, and possibly a logo. We are also aiming for a uniform style of First Day Cover.
- 3 Turning to the new definitive, I hope that you will not dismiss the "insects" theme at such an early stage; it has considerable potential, and we have resources that Ian Strange may not have. For the moment I accept Ian's informed opinion that there are not many colourful insects on Falkland Islands (although obviously at this stage we have done no research into the topic) but there is no strict rule that new definitives must be full-colour.

to judge by the likes of Major Stafford, there are one or two people actually campaigning for one-colour stamps again. But seriously, other ways of depicting wildlife are available besides the absolute pictorial realism which became possible with the introduction of fine-screen photo lithography. I enclose a number of sets of stamps which go part of the way towards illustrating what I mean. None of these specimens actually go as far as adopting a totally graphic technique (using very fine details depicted in black with a colour-wash background) but the Botswana insects issue is particularly attractive, and shows what can be done with rather dull-coloured creatures. The latest Bahamas definitive issue managed to achieve an "engraved" look which could be applicable to your new definitive. Unfortunately, we do not have any specimens of this issue at the moment, but you may be interested to learn how this was done; since all details were picked-out in black, using very fine details, these were all put onto an overlay which was used directly by the printer for producing the black plate. This avoided the need for screening, which breaks the image up in to dots. Colour was injected in to the design by means of water colour washes on the base artwork.

Please bear in mind that as on your current mail ships definitive it is advisable to have a distinct colour-difference between each value. With regard to the choice of artist, I would recommend against awarding such a commission to Ian Strange unless you were to choose a subject (such as fish or birds) in which he is a specialist. Whilst I have every praise for Ian's work over the last few years, the fact remains that for a new definitive issue we should consider as large a selection of artists as possible and choose the most suitable in terms of expertise, style, time available, degree of control necessary, and willingness to under-take the kind of research required. If for example you were to keep to the insects theme then probably top of my list would be Ian Loe (provided we could get him) who is an entemologist, and is particularly good at butterflies and work involving very fine details.

5 Anyway, I will leave this matter with you for a while, and hope that you will advise me if you have any further thoughts.







Duke of Edinburgh Award Scheme Issue

Four pieces of rough artwork recently submitted by the Crown Agents were considered. The artist is unknown. Some members expressed concern that the artwork was sub-standard relative to previous Falkland issues and there is an ever increasing necessity to maintain high standards of production to keep within the few top ranking countries. Members however realised that in view of the Falklands agreed participation in this omnibus issue there was little that could be done in the limited time now available, to give continuity in the design.

The following suggestions were eventually put forward:

- 3p Soften the overall colours and reduce the length of the ribbon to allow more of the background view. Possibility of cutting the ribbons length at an angle.
- 10p Tone down the colouring of the girl's clothing, possibility of brown and grey garments preferred with the incorporation of jeans in place of trousers.
- Tone down the brightness of the colour of the sea and reduce the ribbon length so as not to be over dominamt. Ribbon to be cut at angle as in 3p.
- 26p This design was acceptable and members hoped that this portrait would be similar to those for the other territories.

Note. Values to be 10p, 13p, 15p and 26p respectively.

Thank you for your letter of 28 April 1981, concerning the above stamp issue. You requested my comments on some of the points in your letter, which I hope I can answer.

- 2 Everybody here entirely agrees with you about the portrait being something of an "odd man out". You may imagine our frustration when, having produced around ten "Duke of Edinburgh" rough artworks, depicting the Duke participating in local informal activities (e g horseriding, cooking at a barbecue, etc), the designs were rejected. Unfortunately, in order to enable us to use the official logo of the scheme (and thereby increase our sales), we were obliged to submit the artwork to the Board of The Scheme. The rough artworks were then submitted by them to the Duke of Edinburgh, who rejected them out of hand, and insisted on formal portraits for all Principals.
- 3 However, in spite of the extra work and delays which this caused, we have been reassured by our people in the CA Stamp Bureau that the change is unlikely to affect sales; this mix of portrait and activities is perfectly OK, and is still sufficiently attractive to sell a large number of stamps.
- 4 Each Principal participating in this omnibus will have a different portrait of the Duke.

I refer to the above stamp issue and to the recent exchange of telexes concerning Questa's failure to deliver accordingly to the contractual delivery date.

- The supplies were finally despatched to you on a flight leaving London on the 10 September and I trust that by the time you receive this letter you will have also received the supply of stamps. The original release date has not been achieved but apart from the fact that press releases advising a deferred release date have to be issued a release date at the end of September early October will cause no difficulties. One or two other countries in the minibus are releasing at the end of September and indeed one country is releasing as late as November.
- 3 I have asked Questa to account for the delay in the despatch of these goods and I quote from their letter as follows:-

'Owing to the timing of the Royal Wedding, our staff delayed taking of holidays through the months of June and July, to enable all wedding issues to be released before the actual wedding day.

This, unfortunately, lead to a situation that during the month of August we were presented with an anticipated demand for holidays which we felt, owing to the temperamental English climate, we were unable to refuse.

As you are well aware the Duke of Edinburgh issues were all scheduled well before anyone knew that the wedding would take place.

The other reason for our delay on this issue is the fact that we are experiencing far more difficulty in the reproduction of all these Duke of Edinburgh issues than we normally get with our reproduction. This, allied to a shortage of staff through the month of August is the reason for the delay on this issue'.

- 4 Questa extend their sincere apologies for their failure to meet their contractual delivery date. They mention, and I must agree it is quite true, that it is one of the rare instances that the company has let down the Crown Agents or any of our Principals.
