

I should like you to see the final art-work prepared by Mr Strange for a proposed set of five stamps depicting kelp. DCS and myself are very enthusiastic about the quality of these designs and we hope that you, too, will approve of them.

2. Originally we had in mind issuing such a series in 1983, but our provisional programme of issues has gone rather awry so it is now our intention to release these sometime early next year.

4. Because of the deadline against which we are working, we should like to send these designs to Crown Agents by the second post next week.







Stamp Designs

Dear Sir,

Further to our conversation regarding stamp designs covering the theme of Seaweeds, it is understood that the five rough designs submitted to you have been approved by the Stamp Committee and that a request has been made for the final art work to be produced.

I have noted the terms for such work as laid out in (copy of letter from Crown Agents Ref III/FALK IS 4/31594 your ref: Pst/2/26) The fees of 25£ for each accepted rough and £75 for each piece of finished art work are acceptable. I also agree to the fees for First Day Covers ie £20 for rough design and £25 for the completed art work. However on the question of invoicing for the entire work on completion of the commission this is not acceptable. It will be appreciated that a considerable amount of both research and art work has already gone into the rough designs. I would therefore request that fees for accepted roughs be paid at this stage, with final art work fees being invoiced for on completion of that work. This arrangement would greatly facilitate special outlays expected in the production of the final art work.

In our conversation we also discussed the Marine Mammal theme which I proposed some time back. I would be quite prepared to work on this design and submit roughs for your approval, but again feel that the commission should have a small measure of insurance for the artist prior to commencement of the work. I would therefore propose that a fee of £25 might be paid at the time the commission is accepted. This fee to be deducted from payment made for accepted roughs, but should the roughs not be acceptable and the design abandoned the artist would retain this initial fee to help cover a percentage of time incurred.

Should the above be acceptable I would be grateful if you could inform me at your earliest convenience so that final work might be started on these themes this winter.

If it would be helpful to your own plans it would probably be possible to submit roughs of the Marine Mammal theme before the first week in May.



We would point out that there has been a subsequent increase in our artists' fees since that time. Therefore, you may find our letter to Doug Morrison H1/1618 of 9 January helpful in determining the scale of fees now due.

Our comments concerning the early preparation of designs also apply to the Kelp set.

I understand Mr Strange has completed five designs and I would like to see them before the finished artwork is completed.

You will find enclosed a rough design submitted by Mr J E Cooten at the instigation of Major Spafford. I do not know whether you will be interested in it since you have already viewed Mr Strange's work on this subject. However, I enclose it for your comments.

In addition to a status report on each of these issues, I would like to clarify the matter of settling Mr Strange's invoices in respect of his commission.

As you know, it appears we cannot pay Mr Strange direct by airmail transfer of funds because there is no bank on the Falkland Islands. Therefore it would seem best policy if you were to continue the practise of reimbursing Mr Strange locally in accordance with the fees offered in our commissioning letters.

However, if this means of payment is not acceptable, will you kindly let me know and at the same time advise an alternative method of remittance so we may overcome this problem of lack of banking facilities in the Islands.

I now look forward to your advice on these stamp issues.







Thank you for your letter of 7 April .

The designs were sent to the Crown Agents on 12 April with a suggestion that the stamps be produced with the colours going right to the perforation.

We had a telegram last week saying that the absence of a white margin would cause considerable printing problems as all-round colours were only constant on the 3p and 22p; and also that colour-bleed margins were not popular with collectors. In view of this we have agreed with reluctance to abandon our suggestion.

We have changed the 22p stamp (second step of the airmail rate) to 25p (internal parcel rate) as the 25p is more widely used.

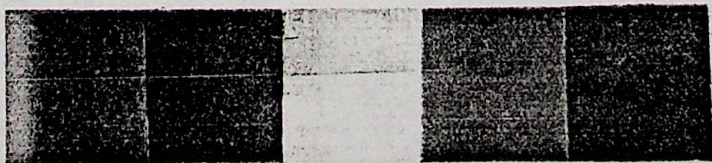

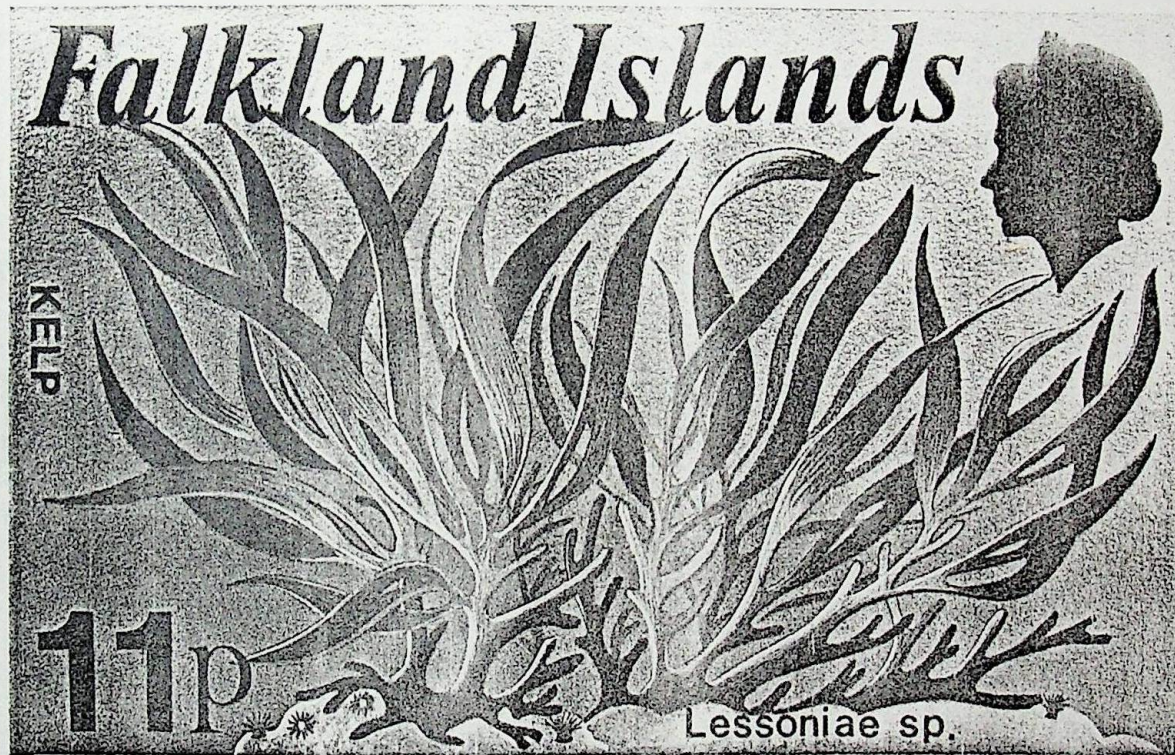

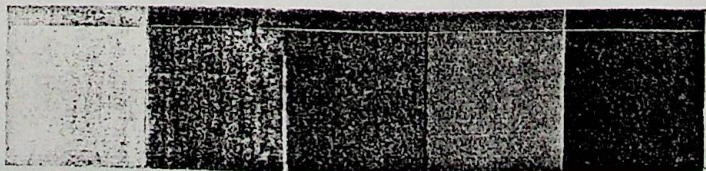

Comments on the proposed issues of stamps from the Falklands

General: the name of the overall series is inappropriate. It should be appreciated that the word 'KELP' has a fairly specific application to large brown algae of the order Laminariales. Amongst those chosen, only Macrocystis and Lessonia are really kelps; the rest, even Durvillea which looks a kelp but belongs to the Fucales, are not. I would suggest changing 'kelp' to 'seaweed'.

Specific:

1. Iridaea: 25p.

- SEAWEED
- Note spelling: generic name is incorrect on overlay.
  - Artistic licence has gone too far; colour is in large part unrealistic. Iridaea does lighten and discolour, apart from the area around and above the stipe, but it hardly reaches the common green appearance of those depicted here. The basal regions and the younger lateral fronds should appear a deep purple to brown red colour, depending on the individual plant (it may on occasion even approach black); this region gradually shades out to the present colour employed (and sometimes even lighter) from the lower half of the plant towards the periphery.

2. Lessonia: 11p.

- KELP
- Note spelling: generic name is incorrect on overlay.
  - Given artistic licence, the form is more or less reasonable; the colour is not. Lessonia is much darker and more brownish to brownish-yellow than shown. It needs looking at again in fresh material in the light of these comments.

3. Durvillea: 7p.

SEAWEED

The comment on colour under Lessonia above applies also to Durvillea. The holdfast region would normally appear very yellowish against the combined background provided by the dun-brown stipe and frond. The flattened distal parts of the fronds would appear very thick in edge view in older, larger plants.

4. Macrocystis: 3p.

KELP

Seems the best of these stamp designs, in terms of accuracy; still, however, a little too greenish in the stipe area. There would normally be more colour contrast between vesicles (yellowish-brown) and adjacent stipe and lamina (dun brown).

5. Gallophyllis: 15p.

SEAWEED

In general reasonable, again given artistic licence. However, the amount of the frond that is depicted as discoloured is overemphasised relative to the normally red-coloured portion. The former would usually be the distal 20-25 percent of the frond, whereas in the drawn plant some 50 percent or so is bleached. The proportions of the drawing are also a little unrealistic.

**KELP ISSUE**

As you know it is our usual practice to submit artwork to generally accepted experts for comment before we go to print, to avoid, where possible, criticism on grounds of accuracy.

2 The Kelp issue was sent to the Natural History Museum for a routine check of specific names etc and unfortunately has been returned with quite a few comments, even allowing for artistic licence.

3 Could you please arrange for it to be returned to the artist, together with these comments, copies of which I am attaching, so that he can make the necessary amendments.

4 I presume you will agree to the title change to "SEAWEED". Although this sounds rather mundane, it must, I regret be accepted as the correct description. I am returning all the artwork including overlays. If you would prefer us to get the lettering alterations done here I shall be happy to arrange it.

5 I am sorry that this should happen at such a late stage, obviously the final decision about whether we go ahead with the present designs must be yours but I strongly recommend that the alterations should be made.

STAMPS : KELP ISSUE

Thank you for copy of Brian Hawthorne's letter of 26 June re kelp issue together with comments from the British Museum.

--  
In the light of these comments on the five different species shown in the designs, I thought I should submit the enclosed colour slides and the specimen of seaweed. Both slides and seaweed may be forwarded to Crown Agents for their interest but I would be grateful if the transparencies could be returned to me in due course.

Corrections to the overlays have been made and some alterations to the art work, notes on which follow:-

1. (25p) Iridaea

Lower section of the plant darkened with outer edges lightened. In plants looked at, colours varied greatly but agree that more emphasis might have been given to the dark purple/black on lower regions.

2. (11p) Lessonia

Please note the enclosed transparencies. Living material was used for the original colour work which also compared very favourably with these transparencies. However in view of comments slightly more emphasis has been given to browns.

3. (7p) Durvillea

The same seems to apply to this species as above and transparencies are enclosed for your interest. Living material was used for the colour work and there is no question that these were in the green spectrum rather than dun-brown. A certain amount of yellow was shown on the art work as many beds of this plant had this characteristic.

Slightly more emphasis has been given to a yellow holdfast, although in living plants looked at, this was green-yellow; only on plants washed ashore and in the process of drying out was the deeper yellow to almost orange-yellow noted.


4. (3p) Macrocystis

More emphasis given to yellow-brown, but please note transparency. For design reasons it was decided to illustrate a growing point. Such sections were generally found to be, as transparency illustrates, with very light yellow-green to yellow-brown stipe and leaves.

5. (15p) Callophyllis

The specimen of weed actually used for the illustration is enclosed. The percentage of creamy-white bleach I calculated at slightly more than 50%, but this has been slightly reduced on the art work.



Thank you for your letter PH1X/FALK IS 7/01833/2 of 26 June forwarding the comments of the Natural History Museum.

I passed your comments to the artist who has corrected the spelling and altered the art work as indicated in his letter of 16th July. You will see that Mr. Strange does not entirely agree with the comments of the Natural History Museum and in support of this he has supplied the attached five slides and sample of seaweed. The word "Kelp" has a clear and long standing connection with the Islands, where in fact seaweeds are known as kelp ((erroneously as we know) and Islanders are known as "Kelpers" derived from the abundant supplies of kelp that surrounds our coasts. (I look out my office window on to Stanley harbour and see a true kelp - macrocystis - 100 yards away). You will see that we are therefore reluctant to discard the name Kelp and have decided to show on each stamp the appropriate name of kelp or seaweed. The issue can be known as the Kelp/Seaweed(s) issue.

I attach the art work and hope that the alterations and information supplied will enable you to take the next step in the process of finalising the issue.

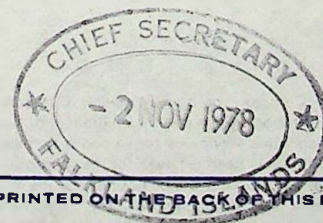

Ian Stranges' revised designs have been viewed with cautious reserve but the consensus seems to be that a reasonable compromise has been reached. I say this with some relief because the designs "went missing" for some time and I feared that the British Museum, after their early "attack" on the designs, had decided to do away with them.

Personally, I find the designs extremely attractive, although I am not qualified to comment on their accuracy and would be more than happy to claim artistic licence in response to any criticism.

Tenders for printing the stamps are expected by 9 November and I now anticipate that the stamps will be ready for shipment by around mid-January 1979.

If there is a vessel sailing to Stanley around this time it should be possible to get the stamps to you by surface means in time for release in March/April without any difficulty.

Further to my letter of 7 November, I can now advise you of the quotations which we received recently for the production of the above stamp issue.

2 Two of the printers declined to quote, on the basis of their inability to meet delivery requirements so soon after the Christmas break. Harrison & Sons Ltd quoted a price of £5,651.24, with a delivery schedule of 5 weeks for production of proofs, and a further 6 weeks for despatch of stamps. This delivery was obviously far too late, and the price was rather high.

3 The contract has been awarded to The House of Questa, at a price of £3,874.45, and there is every hope that this firm will be able to meet our delivery requirements of airfreight despatch by 12 January 1979. I imagine you will agree that there was little doubt as to the action required.

4 Our Shipping Department informs me that after the sailing of the "ANNETTE DINIELSON" there is no vessel sailing to the Falkland Islands until mid-March. Upon the assumption that you wish to release this issue in March/April, I am making arrangements to airfreight these stamps to you by the first available flight after printing is completed; of course, if there is any charter vessel sailing to you which I do not know about, please cable at once.

5 Since the stamps will therefore reach you well in advance of the release date, I will arrange for the First Day Covers to be airfreighted to you as well, for you to affix the stamps; naturally, the stamps for these covers will be packed separately, but included in the same parcel as your main supply of stamps.

6 3,000 First Day Covers were requested by yourself, and the remaining 1,250 are required by the Crown Agents Stamp Bureau. You will notice that 4,300 stamps of each denomination were ordered from the stamp printer - the extra 50 stamps are to take account of the inevitable spoilages. I would be grateful if you could arrange for the stamping and franking of these covers to be done, and would appreciate the early despatch by airfreight



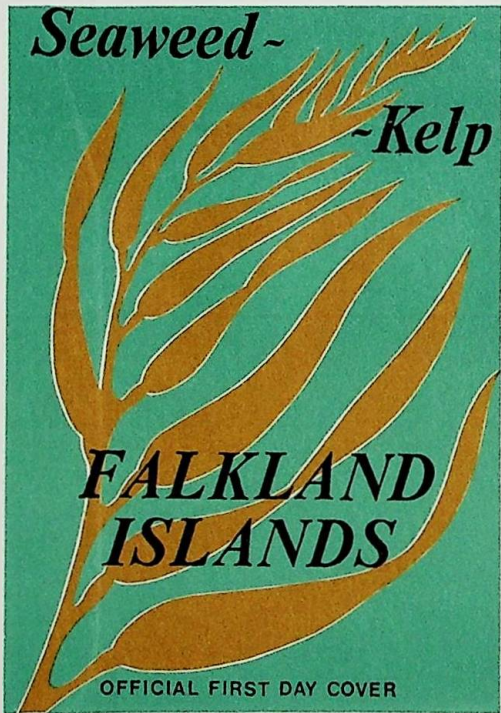
