We had decided upon a Coronation Issue long before g Crown Agents and agreed to participate in the proposed Omnibus Issue lest January - folio 7. Folio 8 is rather vague but it appears that all stamps will be printed in Minature Sheets of 6 stamps. This in itself creates problems as we well know from past experience. A complete Minature/Souvenir Sheet would apparelly cost 21.50 (25p x 6) - rather overdoing it I think. If there is to be a Mineture Sheet surely it should only consist of the three stamps involved? In this respect I would rather see three stamps of 22p (genuine postage rates) rather than 3 at 25p. Further more it would seem to be impossible to affix 6 stamps separated by a 'tab' on the suggested First Day Cover. Even three stamps with the 'tab' would, I think, be too crammed rough cover size etc. attached. I can also foresee the usual problems with the BAT and South Georgia projects. At present we do not know the movements of BAS Shipping during next year but we would have to move very quickly for a release in these territories on 21 st April. Incidentally 21 st April is a Public Holiday in Stanley. Valuable time has already been lost on this project but in the circumstances I suggest we await the return of Mr. Morreson next week - he may possibly have more up to date information.

4. I also suggest you should inform the Crown Agents urgently that we are under some attack as the result of their advice, and ask them to consider, should there be the possibility of wider repercussions in other philatelic journals, what counter measures they should take to advertise our adherence to our declared policy.

5. As I understood it, this policy was intended to mean, in practice, that the Crown Agents would endeavour to increase our philatelic revenues by more extensive marketing arrangements, without the use of "gimmicks"; their comments on this might also be sought.






### 10. CORONATION/CENTENARY OF POSTAGE STAMPS

### COMMEMORATION OF THE CORONATION

I acknowledge receipt of your letter dated 5 November 1976 and note that you are interested in the production of a single stamp for the above to form part of an omnibus issue.

2 We have in mind at the present time a set of three se-tenant stamps all of the same value (probably). The centre stamp would feature Her Majesty set against a local background, bleeding off into the stamps on either side one of which would portray one of Her Majesty's Royal Beasts. (She inherited some 30 such "creatures" when she acceded to the throne) and the remaining stamp would show a local animal or bird (possibly the animal symbol of the country concerned) and the treatment could be either natural or armorial.

3 We are having some rough designs drawn up at present, so that we can judge the effect and full proposals will be submitted at some time in the future.

4 I should be grateful if you would regard the above information as strictly confidential because the theme would be repeated throughout the omnibus and it would be most unfortunate if the idea were taken up outside the omnibus also.

5 Obviously we have to clear the proposal with Her Majesty, but if on the basis of the above you would be willing to include BAT, S Georgia and the Falkland Islands in such an omnibus I should be grateful if you could give your assent now, so that we can proceed with rough designs without delay once Her Majesty's approval has been given.

6 Consequently I look forward to your reply.

As I am sure you know, next year is the 25th anniversary of the coronation of HM the Queen. We feel sure it will be an ideal opportunity to complement the tremendous interest aroused by The Silver Jubilee omnibus issue.

We have now received general approval from Her Majesty the Queen through the Foreign & Commonwealth Office for our overall proposals for the Coronation omnibus. The idea is for each participating country to issue a se-tenant strip of 5 stamps, the cen tre stamp bearing the same portrait of the Queen, flanked on the left hand stamp by a Royal Beast and on the right by either a supporter from the coat of arms or an animal indigenous to the country heraldically portrayed.

The Royal Beasts are heraldic devices inherited by Her Majesty from the badges of her forebears and to a great extent echo history. Some are real animals heraldically symbolised, such as the lion and the bull, These beasts have from other are fabulous, like the dragon and the yale. time to time been used as supporters to shields of the various dynasties and our idea is to treat them similarly for the stamp issue. As you will realise, to achieve a good result in the short time available, we have to some extent to "allocate" designs. The Accession omnibus marked a distinctive innovation from previous royal omnibuses in that the series as a whole set out to tell a story. Again, for this Coronation omnibus we are setting out to tell a story - two related stories in fact. Firstly, the historical basis of the monarchy is explored in the various royal beasts. Secondly, the constitutional relationship of each participating country is symbolised by the common portrait of Her Majesty and the local symbol.

Since, however, the story line is not quite as strong as in the Accession omnibus, it will be necessary from a marketing view point to strengthen the design similarities across the series. We propose therefore the following constant design features.

- 1. Three stamps per issue printed se-tenant in miniature sheets of six stamps per sheet separated by a stamp sized tab showing a coronation scene.
- 2. Each stamp will have the same value. This should be about 25p or its equivalent per stamp.
- The stamps will be the same size as for the Accession omnibus - 31.75nm x 48.26mm in vertical format.
- 4. Lettering will be in a common style.
- 5. The portrait of the Queen will be the same in all cases.
- 6. Both beasts will have the same design treatment facing inwards towards the Royal portrait and given the appearance of stone figures.

In addition to these essential elements, we are intending to repeat the highly successful FDC project for the Accession omnibus using the same size and quality of envelope. Details of this aspect of the project will be sent to you separately.

We hope to release as many issues of the omnibus as possible on the 21 April, which is the Queen's birthday. You will appreciate, therefore, that time is unfortunately short and in order that we may move ahead as quickly as possible and at the same time give you a visual impression of the design approach we are, at our own expense, commissioning finished artwork. An impression of the final layout of the stamps is on the enclosed photocopy. You may wish to alter this (we hope not!) but if so, we ask that the changes you make remain within the design constraints I have outlined above.

Much of the success of the Silver Jubilee Issues was due to the considerable effort and planning that was put into the various promotional schemes in which you kindly supported us with specimen sets of stamps. Whilst we again expect good sales it will undoubtedly be a much tougher selling operation than the Jubilee and we would ask your support for this operation by providing us with 4000 sets of stamps for promotional purposes. In summary therefore we need your decision as quickly as possible on four specific points.

- 1. Do you in principle wish to join this omnibus given the design constraints I have outlined?
- 2. Do you approve the design ideas we have sent to you?
- 3. Do you wish us to prepare FDCs as outlined in paragraph 6 above.
- 4. Will you support our promotion exercise?

We would appreciate your decision to these proposals quickly.

THIS IS no place to consider the symbolism of the dragon in any detail. It will suffice to say that in Western mythology it was ever an evil beast. Alike in the classical legend of Perseus and Andromeda and in the Apocryphal story of Bel and the Dragon, whether as the Tarasque tamed by St. Martha at Tarascon or the Gargoyle subdued by St. Romanus at Rouen, whether transfixed by St. Michael or speared by our own St. George, whatever its guise the dragon was the very per-sonification of evil.<sup>1</sup> Yet evil though it was, it was a creature of strength and wisdom and power and was deemed a fit emblem for king or emperor. Among the Teutonic tribes which settled in England a dragon was from the

first a principal device. A dragon standard was borne by Edmund Ironside in his fight against Canute. The dragon is borne on flags and shields by English and Normans alike in the Bayeux Tapestry. Richard I, Henry III, Edward I and Edward III each had a dragon standard. Those however were Saxon dragons and they can scarcely be regarded as heraldic.<sup>2</sup> The dragon which Henry VII used

was a Celtic beast and it must certainly be counted a part of his armorial ensigns. It is not clear when the dragon first came to be used armorially by our English kings. The treasure taken over by Henry IV in 1399 included a pair of basins engraved with dragons with, "ove," the arms of the King and Emperor " parties " (impaled), and another pair were embossed with a rose and engraved with dragons and the impaled arms of the king and queen.<sup>3</sup> In both descriptions the dragons seem to be associated with the arms, and if that be so the armorial use of the creature dates back at least to the time of Richard II and Anne of Bohemia. In any case the dragon was used armorially in the time of Henry VI, for on his seal for the Principality of North Wales the shield is as it were supported on the backs of two four-legged dragons each of which upholds in one fore-claw an enormous ostrich feather.4

Dragons are of many different shapes and colours. In form they were evidently inspired by such antediluvian creatures as the dinosaur and the pterodactyl, perhaps with some help from the alligator in more recent times. The dragons of the Bayeux Tapestry and their counterparts in illuminated manuscripts resemble snakes of Falstaffian proportions with two short, sturdy legs and wings which are usually much too small to lift such a body.<sup>5</sup> In heraldry these developed into the fire-drake or wyvern, familiar as the arms of Brent and Drake, and as the badge of the Wessex Division in the Second World War. This is a two-legged creature with bird-like claws, bat's wings, a large comb on neck and spine, and a long tail which like the tongue may or may not be barbed; the neck and upper parts are scaly but the under parts form a series of large rolls not unlike that comic fellow Bibendum whom the Michelin Tyre Company's advertisements have made so familiar. The Tudor dragon was similar but had four legs like those on Henry VI's scal for North Wales.

The dragon appears frequently in early Welch chronicles. Gildas in the 6th century described King Maelgwn as Insularis Draco, the Dragon or leader of the Isle of Britain, and later traditions told of the red dragon of Cadwalader, last of Maelgwn's line and last native ruler of Britain.<sup>6</sup> In the late 13th century we read of two dragons fighting, one red representing Wales, the other white representing the hated Saxon,<sup>7</sup> and there are many other pre-Tudor references to the red dragon as a Welch emblem.

Henry VII's grandfather, Sir Owen Tudor, took a dragon as his device in token of his supposed descent from Cadwalader; and his sons Edmund, Earl of Richmond, and Jasper, Earl of Pembroke, took dragons as crest and supporter when they abandoned the ancestral arms of Tudor (Gules, a chevron between three helmets argent) in favour of differenced versions of the royal arms granted to them by Henry VI.8 At a time when but little of his territory was left to him Cadwalader had been consoled by a prophecy that in days to come one of his seed would wear the crown of England. Many must have seen the fulfilment of that prophecy in Henry VII's accession, and we may well believe that he himself was not slow to encourage the idea and to point to the dragon as evidence therefor. In any case one of the standards borne at Bosworth Field and afterwards offered in St. Paul's Cathedral was a red fiery dragon beaten on white and green sarcenet.<sup>9</sup>

One of Henry's first acts after his accession was to institute two new pursuivantships of arms, and one of these he entitled Ronge Dragon.<sup>10</sup> The dragon was moreover used as a supporter by all the Tudor sovereigns. It was displaced by the Scottish unicorn in 1603, but in spite of that it continued to be used on various departmental seals. Queen Anne's use of two dragons on her seal for Chester has been mentioned already (note 4 above). A liou and a dragon support the royal arms on James I's and Charles I's seals for the Court of Wards, on James's seal for the same Court in Ireland and on William IV's seal for the Court of King's Bench.<sup>11</sup> On the seals of the Court of Common Pleas under James I and Charles I12 and also under George III13 the supporters are a dragon and a greyhound, whilst the seals for the Court of Great Sessions for Carmarthen, Cardigan and Pembroke under James I and Charles I have a dragon and a yale as supporters.14

In an inventory of Henry VIII's regalia and plate the dragon occurs not only as a supporter of the royal arms but also in a merely decorative capacity.15 It was moreover used freely in those days as a badge. Sometimes, as on one of Henry VII's standards, flames belch from its mouth,<sup>16</sup> and it is probably to this rather than to the coloration that we should refer the adjective "fiery" which is found in some early descriptions.

Dragons innumerable may be seen on the roof-bosses and elsewhere in St. George's Chapel. The dragon was one of the royal beasts on Rochester Bridge, on the Greenwich landing-stage and in all the other groups mentioned earlier in this book (page 7). Of the beasts which top the royal pavilion in Cotton MS. Augustus 3 three are dragons; they are gold purfled, or picked out with red. Two dragons stand on the bridge at Hampton Court; one bears the King's arms, France and England quarterly; the other holds a shield with an uncrowned portcullis. The dragons which were replaced on the St. George's Chapel buttresses in 1925 were also given a portcullis to hold, but in their case a Tudor rose is set in its midst after the model of that carved inside the Chapel over the entrance to the Urswick chantry. 16a

The shield held by the Coronation dragon is: Quarterly or and gules, four lions passant gardant countercoloured. This is the coat of Llewelyn ap Iorwerth, Prince of Wales (d. 1240), of his son Gruffydd and of the latter's son Llewelyn ab Gruffydd.<sup>17</sup> Still later it was worn by Owen Glendwr (d. 1416) as Prince of Wales, his crest being a two-legged dragon.<sup>18</sup> On Owen's seal the four lions are rampant,

and it would seem that the attitude of the lions was freely varied for some rolls of arms give lions rampant, some passant and some passant gardant. Those oft-cited Tudor manuscripts in the College of Arms, I.2 and Prince Arthur's Book, shew lions passant gardant and that is the version which was assigned to the Prince of Wales in 1911 and which is held by the Queen's dragon.

As to the modern use of a red dragon as the badge of Wales we can but repeat in substance what was written in *The Queen's Beasts*. At the Union of the Parliaments of Great Britain and Ireland in 1807 a red dragon passant on a green mount was declared to be the King's badge for Wales, and a century later King Edward VII assigned the same differenced by a silver label as a badge to be borne by the Prince of Wales in addition to the ostrich feathers of the heir apparent. It was however represented that the heir to the Crown ought to bear in his arms, and not as a mere badge, some symbol of the Principality whence he derived his chief title. In 1911 therefore King George V ordained that Prince Edward (now the Duke of Windsor) and his successors as Prince of Wales should set in the centre of their princely shield a small shield like that held by the Queen's Coronation Dragon. Finally, by an Order in Council signed on March 11th, 1953, Her Majesty ordered that the Badge of Wales should be augmented "for the greater honour and distinction of Wales." The augmented badge consists of a shield party fesseways argent and vert, charged with a red dragon passant. Around the shield is a circular riband of white with gold edges bearing in green letters the motto: Y DDRAIG GOCH DDYRY CYCHWYN—The Red Dragon gives impetus, or as some prefer, gives the lead.19

The Welch dragon of these modern days is red, and both Welch and Saxon dragons are often so described. But Owen Glendwr used as his standard a gold dragon in a white field, 20 and Elizabeth I's dragon supporter was sometimes gold.<sup>21</sup> Both the Tudor dragon and its Welch forerunner were often described as of ruddy gold, and in Tudor manuscripts the dragon, alike as badge and as supporter, was painted with head, back and wings of red and the underparts gold.<sup>22</sup> That is how the Tudor dragon should be coloured; that is how the Queen's dragon would have been coloured had colour been allowed, and that is how it is described and how Mr. Keeling coloured his drawing of the dragon in The Queen's Beasts even though the creature was entitled "the Red Dragon of Wales."

## VI.

### THE BLACK BULL OF CLARENCE

THE NEXT two beasts to be considered, the Black Bull of Clarence and the White Lion of Mortimer, came to the Queen through Edward IV and his daughter Elizabeth, queen of Henry VII. There is in the Bodleian Library a very interesting manuscript which appears

There is in the Bodleian Library a very interesting manuscript which appears to date from something before 1460, and which gives the names of the lordships and badges pertaining to the Duke of York. The badges are:—

- (1) for the Duchy of York the falcon and the fetterlock;
- (2) for Coningsburgh a falcon with a maiden's head, her hair about her shoulders and a crown about her neck;
- (3) for Clifford Castle a white rose;
- (4) for the earldom of March a white lion;
- (5) for the earldom of Ulster (" Wolster ") a black dragon;
- (6) for King Edward [III] a blue boar with tushes, hooves and member of gold;
- (7) for King Richard [II] a white hart, and the sun shining;
- (8) for the Honour of Clare a black bull with gold horns, hooves and member; and
- (9) for the Fair Maid of Kent a white hind.<sup>1</sup>

Among the other badges given in later versions of the list,<sup>2</sup> we will only mention the white boar; this is variously attributed to the Honour of Windsor and to the duchy of Gloucester; it was certainly used by Richard III both before and after his accession.

It was as the heirs of March (Mortimer) and of Clarence that Edward IV and his father claimed the throne. Richard II had no child, and William of Hatfield, his eldest uncle, died in childhood. The heir to the Crown was therefore Roger Mortimer, heir, through his mother Philippa of Clarence, of Lionel Duke of

Clarence, the third son of Edward III. Roger's claim was however rejected by Edward's fourth son, John of Gaunt, who as Duke of Lancaster was hardly less powerful than the King himself, and in 1309 Gaunt's son Henry forced Richard to abdicate and was declared King of England. He was succeeded by his son and grandson, Henry V and VI. In the meantime Roger Mortimer had been slain in Ireland and both his sons died without issue leaving their sister Anne as the heiress of Clarence. Anne was the mother of Richard Duke of York and on his death in 1460 his son, presently King Edward IV, was left as the Duke of Clarence's heir and representative. He was also the heir of Edmund of Langley, Duke of York, Edward III's fifth son, but that gave him no right to the Crown. This excursion into history and genealogy will explain why the bull and the lion were chosen to stand among the Queen's Beasts.

As we have seen, the Black Bull pertained specially to the Honour of Clare or Clarence. That Honour was carried by Elizabeth de Clare, foundress of Clare College, Cambridge, to the Burghs, Earls of Ulster, and their heiress, Elizabeth de Burgh, was the wife of Lionel Duke of Clarence. Whether or no the bull was given as a badge or used as a supporter by the Clares or the Burghs, it was certainly used by the Duke of Clarence, on whose seal two bulls support the shield.<sup>3</sup> It was also-used not infrequently by Edward IV and sometimes by Richard III, although the latter preferred the white boar.4

At Windsor the white hart, black bull and black dragon were all included as Yorkist beasts in the 1925 restorations (see chapter XIII). The bull is also one of the King's Beasts at Hampton Court where it holds a Tudor rose. At Westminster the bull's shield displayed the royal arms as borne by Edward IV.

From 1195 to 1340 the Kings of England wore only the three golden lions of Richard I. In 1328 King Charles IV of France died and as he had no child the crown was assumed by his cousin Philip of Valois. Edward III however claimed that as Charles's nephew he was really the nearer heir, arguing that, although French law precluded Charles's sister Isabel from reigning, there was no legal obstacle to his own succession, he being Isabel's son and heir. In 1340 therefore he assumed the title of King of France and quartered the lilies of that kingdom with his own English lions. The royal arms of France were then Azure semy of golden fleurs de lis, but King Charles V reduced the number of lilies to three, and in 1405 his example was followed by our King Henry IV. Thereafter the royal arms of England were: Quarterly, 1 and 4. New France, Azure, three fleurs de lis or; 2 and 3. Gules, three lions of England. That is the shield which was borne by all the later kings and queens of England until the death of Elizabeth I and the accession of James I in 1603, and that is the shield held by the Queen's bull at Westminster.5

Sir John Beaufort also took an cagle and a yale as supporters (p. 34 above) and his cagle too is silver with gold beak and claws and crown, but, in contrast to Bedford's it wears its crown on its head instead of round its neck. For Beaufort the cagle would be doubly significant, symbolizing at once his descent from Gaunt and his tenure of the carldom of Kendal. However, at the time, 1557, when these six "Beasts Royal" were set up it is perhaps more likely that the cagle was intended as Lady Margaret Beaufort's badge (p 34). There does not seem to be any contemporary document shewing the colour of Lady Margaret's cagle, but at Cambridge it is and has long been coloured gold.

### 6. St. George's Chapel, Windsor Castle.

In St. George's Chapel a distinction must be made between the royal beasts carved in various parts of the interior, which are original 16th century work, and those on the roof, which are modern replacements.

In the interior three series of beasis are noteworthy, on the roof-bosses, on the canopy of the Queen's Closet, and on the cornice below the windows of the Beaufort Chantry. On the roof-bosses we see the antelope and panther of Henry VI, the white lion of Edward IV, the lion of England, and, most numerous of all, the Tudor greyhound and dragon. All these are represented sometimes alone, sometimes in pairs; now they support a shield of the royal arms or a royal badge, and now they bear a badge-charged banner; but often they have no burden.<sup>16</sup> The lion, dragon, greyhound and antelope also appear on the Queen's Closet.

The badges on the cornice of the Beaufort Chantry are of uncommon interest, and have been described by Canon E. M. Venables in the 1952 Report of the Friends of St. George's Chapel, pp. 18, etc. and pl. V. They include four dragons, three greyhounds, a lion of England, a swan and a falcon with a maiden's head. That last is presumably the badge which was mentioned on page 25 as given by the Dukes of York for Coningsburgh Castle.

The beasts on the roof were, as already stated, only crected in 1925. They were described by me in the Report of the Friends of St. George's Chapel for 1953, "The King's Beasts on St. George's Chapel," pages 11-18 and plates I-XIV. These beasts, which are about 4 ft. 6 ins. tall, number seventy-six in all, and it is a great pity that it is so difficult to see them from the ground, many details being invisible unless one is privileged, as I was, to mount to the roof and examine them at close quarters. Of the seventy-six heasts forty-two in the upper tier hold small vane-like flags and stand on the pinnacles of the clerestory parapet. The remaining thirty-four stand about twenty-four feet lower, twenty-four on the flying buttresses, eight in niches on the walls of the transepts and two on the parapet at the west end. There are, however, only fourteen different beasts, these being repeated as necessary to make up the seventy-six. The fourteen are divided into two series, illustrating the descent of the Crown from Edward III to Henry VIII through the Houses of Lancaster and York respectively. The seven Lancastrian beasts are a crowned

lion and a unicorn for Edward III, the swan and antelope of Bohun, the panther of Henry VI, the Beaufort yale and Henry VII's red dragon. In the Yorkist series are the falcon of Edward III, Richard II's white hart, the black bull of Clarence, the black dragon of Ulster and the white lion of Mortimer, a white hind for Edward  $\hat{V}$ and lastly a greyhound for Elizabeth of York. With the exception of Edward III's unicorn and Edward V's hind all these beasts appear in both tiers, those on the lower tier holding shields charged either with arms or with a badge, thus:-

The crowned lion: arms of England, Gules, three lions passant gardant or;

The swan: arms of Bohun, Azure, a bend argent coticed and between six lions or; The antelope: Old France and England quarterly.

The panther: arms of Eton College, Henry VI's foundation, namely: Sable, three lilies argent and on a chief party azure and gules a gold fleur de lis and a lion of England. This panther is not the fire-breathing creature of modern armory, but as usual in the 15th century resembles the natural beast save that it has prominent boar-like tushes, and is spotted with round disks. Manuscripts of the period make it silver with roundels of red, blue, green, black and yellow.

The yale: arms of Beaufort, New France and England quarterly in a border gobony argent and azure.

The red dragon: a double rose charged with a portcullis.

The falcon: arms of England.

The hart: a shield charged with a sprig of broom-cods as engraved on Richard II's effigy in Westminster Abbey.

The bull: a rayed white rose.

The black dragon: arms of de Burgh, Earl of Ulster, Or, a cross gules.

The white lion: arms of Mortimer, Earl of March, Barry, the chief paly and corners gyronny or and azure, with a scocheon argent over all.

The greyhound: arms of Nevile, Gules, a saltire argent. Only one of these beasts, the hind, calls for any comment here. A white hind was a badge of Queen Philippa, consort of Edward III. It was also given by her ward, Joan the Fair Maid of Kent with the addition of a gold crown about its neck and pendent chain. This crowned and chained beast passed to Joan's eldest son by her first marriage, Thomas Holand, Earl of Kent, but it was nevertheless claimed as a Yorkist badge. Edward V's hind has no crown or chain, neither here, nor on his portrait in the south aisle where it is the sinister supporter of his arms<sup>16</sup>°.

At the same time that the beasts were reinstated on the roof of the Chapel, a lion and a unicorn were crected at the foot of the great stair-way leading to the West door, but these had no Tudor prototypes and they are not counted in the seventy-six. They are the modern supporters and hold shields of the Royal Arms as they are borne to-day. They were set there for King George V and to commemorate the restoration of the Chapel in 1920-30. These two beasts and those

on the roof were designed by Joseph Armytage and were carved in the studios of Sir Frederick Minter, K.C.B.

### 7. Hampton Court Palace.

No sooner had Henry VIII acquired Hampton Court than he began to plan improvements and additions, and, to mark his ownership of the palace, he set his arms and beasts and badges in every possible place. The building accounts for 1530-1-2 abound with references to these, and shew that they were painted and gilt in the richest manner whether within or without the buildings.


In regard to the arms, several examples of which still remain, it is notable that they are supported by the dragon and greyhound, thus shewing conclusively that there is no basis for the oft-repeated assertion that Henry VIII only used those supporters " in the beginning of his reign."17

The best account of King Henry's earlier works is that given by Ernest Law in The History of Hampton Court Palace.<sup>18</sup> Royal beasts were everywhere. The lion, dragon and greyhound were commonest, but a hart, a yale and a bull were set on the fountain in the inner court,<sup>19</sup> and hinds and antelopes, panthers and leopards were also to be seen, the leopard being Anne Boleyn's beast. Most of these creatures held vanes charged with the arms of the king or the queen or with one of the roval badges


The royal beasts were particularly numerous on the Great Hall. A lion and a dragon stood on the gable ends holding vanes of the king's and queen's arms respectively. Sixteen more cavorted gaily on the slanting coping stones of the gables, and yet another sixteen, six lions, four dragons and six greyhounds, stood on the battlements. Twelve more, four lions, four dragons and four greyhounds, capped the columns of the louvre and on the summit of that stood "a greate lyon crownyd baryng a great vane." Vane-bearing greyhounds also stood on two of the three corner-turrets, only the third being topped by Anne's leopard. Beasts and badges innumerable were also to be seen within the Hall, both in the windows and carved and painted on the walls.

Nor were the beasts confined to the palace itself. The path to "The Mount" was lined with figures of the king's beasts, lion, greyhound and dragon, hind and buil, antelope and hart; there too was Anne's leopard; all held vanes. In the gardens the beasts were to be counted by the score. Though these gardens were planned in Anne's lifetime and her leopard was among the original beasts, the work was not completed until after her fall, and one item in the accounts includes the provision of four dragons, six lions, five greyhounds, five harts and "foure Innycornes," all carved in freestone. These "innycornes" can only be Jane Seymour's beast and their inclusion shews that the order must have been given after Henry's marriage to her. Indeed Dorling refers to an entry in the Exchequer accounts describing a systematic and careful alteration of Queen Anne's arms and badges into those of Queen Jane. The change was however made with a due

We also have to bear in mind time constraints plus the fact that the heraldic treatment, balancing the Black Bull of Clarence, allows some licence.







As you know as an adjunct of the Coronation omnibus issue we shall be arranging a first day cover project, similar to the very successful one we had for the Silver Jubilee. We have ordered a similar quality envelope and hope to conduct the exercise in a similar way.

There are three alternative methods of carrying out the first day cover exercise and we should appreciate your letting us know as soon as possible which method you prefer.

Alternative 1 We will bear all production design, printing and affixing costs plus airfreight despatch charges to you, and simply charge you 15p per cover for your requirements. We would expect you to bear the cost of returning covers to us.

Alternative 2 We will in the first instance pay for all the first day covers, affix stamps and pay outward freight for our requirements only. Any envelopes you need will be debited to you at cost and sent out unstamped for local affixing.

Alternative 3 We will order the envelopes on your behalf and debit all charges to your account. You will affix the stamps and return our requirements to us. We will sell the covers at the rate fixed by you.

Can you please cable us with your choice out of these three alternatives or alternative proposals and also let us know if you would like us to order cancellation cachets, at our expense, for use on the official covers. Please bear in mind when reaching your decision the possibility of a tight printing and production schedule.







I am most grateful for your very kind and encouraging letter of the 29th. October, forwarded to me a few days ago by the Foreign and Commonwealth Office. I, too, feel that it was a pity that we were unable to talk about stamp matters, whilst you were in this country; it always seemed that there were probably more important things for you to talk about, and anyway it appeared that the philatelic policy was safe. However it seems that things had been going on in the Islands, whilst your back was turned. I only hope that they are not irretrievable.

After you wrote to me, you will have received the September issue of The Upland Goose, followed almost immediately by a letter from me complaining about the format of the new Falkland Islands booklets, which I was somewhat distressed to write.

Since then, it has been announced in the philatelic press in this country. that the Crown Agents have organised another Omnibus Issue to mark the 25th. Anniversary of Her Majesty's Coronation. Although that seems rather like "jumping on the bandwagon", I am really horrified to learn that the stamps are to be issued in "sheetlets" with marginal inscriptions on the intervening selvedge. This is completely abhorent to me and to all serious philatelists: it is just the sort of bad thing which that hated agency IGPC and Joe Urch issue, and precisely what we have been fighting against.

I telephoned Mr. Freeman of "H' Division, the Crown Agents, and confirmed May suspicions that this was the brain child of the Crown Agents; however, I understand that there has been considerable discussion and argument within the Crown Agents about the advisability of this complete face change in policy on their part. Of course, Mr. Freeman said that the Falkland Islands Government had fully agreed with the idea and format, and had placed the order, so the Falkland Islands have to carry the blame, in spite of what, we consider, to be terrible advice.

I am aware that Mr. Trevor Pepper was in favour of "sheetlets", because he kept asking me why we did not like them, and then I heard that he had convinced one member of Legco. in their favour. My final written reply to Mr. Pepper can be found on the files in the Secretariat, as I copied my letter to him, sending a copy for the files there. However Mr, Pepper is not a philatelist, although he is a coin collector - and I wish he had directed more of his instant money making ideas onto numismatics, rather than on philately, which he knows fittle about: perhaps, in his case, it really is a matter of "a little knowledge is a dangerous thing"!

I think I can say that serious philatelists would accept, with grace. se-tenant stamps and, with resign, yet another Omnibus issue, but in normal sheet form; what I am certain they will not accept is either this Miniature Sheet/ Souvenir Sheet/Sheetlet format or the marginal inscriptions. This is utterly contrary to all the past excellent philatelic traditions of the Falkland Islands, and I fear the worst.

I regret that you will not like my Editorial in the December issue of The Upland Goose, which is now at the printers, but as I wrote it before hearing about

the format of the "Queen's Beasts" issue, it will probably be considered mild compared with what I shall feel obliged to write in my Editorial in the March 1978 issue, if I am still Editor of The Upland Goose at that time. I do not heitate to say that I hata writing sour Editorials!

Because I now feel completely betrayed and my credability as a philatelist and a journalist eroded, I shall have to consider whether I am able to remain as Editor of The Upland Goose, apart from the fact that it could be said that I have been guilty of misleading collectors in the United Kingdom and the United States about the future philatelic policy of the Falkland Islands. It will all depend on what can now still be redeemed.

If this "Queen's Beasts" issue comes out in the format as now announced, I foresee, with some conviction, a steady drift away from Falkland Islands philately by the serious philatelists, and no doubt we shall be able to observe this in a drift away from our Society membership: I do not know whether it will be an avalanche or a steady trickle. The Falkland Islands will now have to look for a new type of customer to buy their stamps - these will be gimmick collectors, not philatelists, who have to be won by hard selling advertisements, free gifts, back handers, promises of instant wealth etc. The Falkland Islanders may well have their "jam today", but there will be "none tomorrow", because, in the eyes of the philatelist, the Falkland Islands will be considered to be just another "Banana" type Colony, competing with all the rest and having nothing special to offer, their tradition and heritage cast away. It will be little good even pretending that this is a "one off" experiment, because any stamp issue goes into the catalogue indelibly, and befouls a "catalogue complete" collection.

I think that there is now only one possible course of action for the Falkland Islands to take, on the "Queen's Beast" issue, hoping that with a proposed issue date of June, it is still not too late! This is to issue the stamps, but in only normal sheet format, of 25 stamps to a sheet - se-tenant if needs be - and without marginal inscriptions (that is, no inscriptions describing the stamps on the selvedge, as the present advertisements show). It may annoy the Crown Agents, being out of line with the other Colonies making the issue, but it would have the added bonus that the Falkland Islands, alone, stand out for the best traditions in philately. I do not think that you would loose any sales thereby, and the Islands would protect themselves. In the eyes of the Crown Agents the Falkland Islands are a prestige Colony which is very important for them to retain for their future work on stamps in any field, therefore they cannot afford to be awkward.

I hope that you feel that until now I have kept my part of the bargain to help promote Falkland Islands stamps; I would like to feel that I can continue to do so, but it now must depend on the direction which the stamp policy is going to take.

I am sorry to have written at such length, and I hope that this is not too emotional, on what to me is rather an emotional matter. I do hope that it can still be put right. I wish that I was able to come out again and explain it all in person, but I am afraid that it is beyond my financial means.

#### Dear Jack,

Because of the turn Falkland Islands Philately now is taking with the announced new policy of Ministure Sheets make up into booklets and Sheetlets with marginal inscriptions next June, I regret that I feel entirely unable to write an article on Philately for the Falkland Islands Journal. The whole of the issuing policy is now going completely against all I have ever stood up for and following the line that I and other philatelically speaking. I am therefore faced with the alternatives of castigating the Islands or turning down offers to write. I therefore feel that anything that I would write on Falkland Islands Philately, bearing the present policy in mind, would be entirely unaccentable to you in a Falkland Islands Journal.

The Falkland Islands philatelicaly speaking will become just another banana island if this policy in fact takes place. They will loose a wast amount of support, and possible enmity from our overseas members. It is easy for love to turn to hate in such circumstances.

Regarding my own position, I am uncertain. I am very unsure if I can carry on as Editor of the Upland Goose - it rather depends on what the Governor is prepared to do to correct the situation. If the Falkland Islands actually do carry out their announced intentions by the sheetlets with Marginal Markings next June, then they may have "killed me" off too. I feel very bitter, at this knife in my back, and apart from personal pride, I became so personally involved in helping to promote a good sound policy that I may have lost all respect in the eyes of the philatelic world and therefore no loner acceptable. This new policy will of course be seen in the philatelic world, as greed 69 the Islanders. Without doubt the FI Government must accent responsibility, because nothing can be done in the way of stamp issues without their positive order being make to the Crown Agents.

I fear that we shall now find a large drift away by our Study Group Members and consequently this will mean a decrease in finance resulting in a much smaller and poorer front of the Upland Goose. I even wonder if the Study Group and The Upland Goose will be able to continue much longer. The Falkland Islands will have to now look to sell otheir stamps to a completely different market, which is not composed of real rhilatelists, but junk collectors. I will have no part in helping to promote such junk, and I suspect that neither will the others.

Perhaps even forgetting the booklet, if they now just cut out the sheetlets and <u>Marginal inscriptions</u> next June, and just issued the Queens Beasts in normal sheet form, they would get away with it. Presumably such a variation in the ord r would not be too difficult to bring about; if action was taken now, before wrinting starts.

I am sorry about all this. It really breaks my heart.

Pleese do not think that I underestimate the great honour on being asked to write for the Falkland Islands Journal. To me, it would have been a great privilege, but I feel that you would not wish to print, what I, as I hone a writer of integrity, would feel I had to write.

Should the Governor manage to vary the order for the stamps next June to cut out the Sheetlets and Marginal inscriptions, so that the three stamps are printed on normal sheet form, as in the past, and keep the policy on the right road, then I would be very pleased to accept if asked again to write for the Falkland Islands Journal.

After our carlier, and to me, congenial exchange of correspondence, I was distressed to learn, from your letter of 20 November, that you hold very strong and critical views on the format of the forthcoming Coronation issue, even to the point of suggesting we may be embarking on unacceptable philatelic policies.

I am asking the Chief Secretary, John Massingham, who is Secretary of our Stamp Committee, to reply to you on the technical matters you raised. What I would like to stress is that, while we must have a prior care for the needs of our people in relising adequate revenue for the support of our development, we have no wish to make short terms gains at the expense of a lasting and steady income, or to diminish, by unworthy marketing techniques, the confidence that our loyal and specialist collectors have in us. In pursuing the respectable, and widely welcomed pelicy that I announced earlier this year there may inevitably be differences of expert opinion about the means by which we can widen our sales in reputable markets, but we are of course bound to be guided by our approved advisers, the Grown Agents, with Whom it is our declared policy to continue to work. I hope you will feel able to reas ure your readers of this, and that we will continue to enjoy the support and personal encouragement you have so generously afforded us in the past.

Thank you for your letter of 20 November about the proposed Omnibus Issue to mark the 25th Anniversary of Her Majesty's Coronation.

I am naturally sorry that you should feel so strongly the the marginal inscriptions on the sheetlets should be philatelically quite unacceptable. Everyone here is very conscious of the need to maintain the deservedly high reputation that Falkland Islands stamp issues enjoy in the philatelic world, whilst also attempting to augment the funds that we derive from stamp issues that are so necessary if the Falkland Islands Government is to play its own full share in stimulating and funding development projects. Clearly this is not an easy policy to accomplish satisfactorily.

I am satisfied, however, that most careful consideration was given by all concerned to the proposals put forward by the Crown Agents for the Coronation Anniversary Issue. Account was taken not only that all appropriate approval had been obtained for the project but also that considerable care had gone into its planning to ensure that it would be an acceptedly designed issue worthy of the occasion that it would be commemorating. Mindful of the guide-lines laid down earlier this year for our philatelic policy, it was only after a specific assurance had been received from the Crown Agents that there was a demand from reputable philatelic sources that the order went ahead. (Consideration was also given to the fact that had we not participated in an Omnibus Issue of this nature it would have looked, at best, distinctly odd.) The frontiers of philately seem ever to be expanding and the innovation of today seems rapidly to become accepted practice. Nuch as I regret that you should feel that we are drifting into areas of "gimmickry" I assure you that there has been no departure whatsoever from the stamp policy announced in March this year and that we continue to have every confidence in our official advisers, the Crown Agents.

The significance of your representations on this occasion and the terms in which you have made them deserve, I feel, to be drawn to the Crown Agents' attention and I am therefore copying our exchange of letters to Mr B W Hawthorne, who has been dealing with this issue, for his information.

You will have already received the Governor's letter of 7 December) in which he mentioned that I would be getting into touch with you - as Chairman of the Stamps Committee - about some of the points that you had raised in your recent letter to him about the forthcoming Omnibus Issue to mark the 25th Anniversary of Her Majesty's Coronation.

2. I doubt whether I can usefully add anything to Mr Parker's letter that would satisfy you about the acceptability of the proposed sheetlets. However, the Committee is very conscious of the need to maintain the deservedly high reputation that Falkland Islands' issues enjoy in the philatelic world, whilst also attempting to augment the runds that we derive from them for development purposes. Our guide-lines are, of course, those laid down in the philatelic policy statement of March this year, for it is well understood that any drift into irresponsible issues would only dissipate long-term and remunerative interest in our stamps.

Thus it was against such a background that we considered the Crown 3. Agents' original proposals with cautious interest. We noted that they had obtained all the appropriate approval and authority for a project of this nature. We took into account the fact that special care was apparently being taken with the design of the stamps to ensure that there would emerge an acceptably designed issue worthy of the occasion that it would be commemorating. We were no less aware that you yourself that this was another Omnibus issue coming very soon after this year's "Silver Jubilee" one. However, it was not a question of our "jumping on the bandwagon" - to use your own phrase - rather did the Committee reflect upon the possible repercussions of our failure to participate. Given the nature of the issue our opting out would have looked, at best, distinctly odd and would almost certainly have provoked undesirable comment and speculation. In all the circumstances and bearing in mind the knowledge that all the other dependent territories would be participating - among them stamp issuers of impeccable standing - we were satisfied that we ought to go ahead.

2

4. That then brings me to what I understand is the essence of your objections: sheetlets with marginal inscriptions. Mindful of the policy guide-lines to which we work, it was only after we had received a specific assurance that there was a substantial demand from reputable philatelic sources for such sheetlets that the order was finally confirmed. It seems that the frontiers of philately are expanding with the ever-growing interest in it both as a hobby and as a source of investment. Consequently the innovation of today seems rapidly to become accepted practice. We felt unable, therefore, either to ignore specialist advice or assured demand from reputable sources.

5. My colleagues and I naturally regret that you should feel so vehemently that we are drifting into areas of gimmickry, but I can only repeat that there has been no departure from the declared stamp policy of the Falkland Islands Government and that we have every confidence in our official advisers, the Crown Agents. Moreover, we shall continue to welcome the scholarly interest that you have taken in our philatelic affairs in particular. You may like to know that I am taking informal steps to establish contact with a cross-section of local people who have a keen - though possibly varying - interest in our stamp issues; and thus attempt to ensure that the Committee's deliberations take due account of specialist interests, knowledge, and views.

#### CORONATION STAMP ISSUE

To celebrate the 25th Anniversary of the Coronation of Her Majesty the Queen, twenty-one countries represented by the Crown Agents are participating in an omnibus issue which will feature a portrait of Mer Majesty, Royal Beasts and Local animals.

The Accession combus, known as the Jubilee Issue, was a distinct departure from previous royal committee issues in that the series of stamps set out to tell a story. The Coronation issue will also tell a story - two related stories in fact; first, the historical basis of the monarchy is explored through the various Hoyal Beasts; second, the constitutional relationships of each participating country is symbolised by the common portrait of Her Majesty and the local symbol.

The Royal Be sts are heraldic devices inherited by Her Majesty from the bodyes of her forbears and to a great extent reflect the history of the monarchy. Some of the Royal Beasts are real animals heraldically symbolised, such as the lica and the bull, while others, such as the dragon, are from fables. These Beasts have from time to time been used as supertors to shields of the various dynasties and the idea is to use them similarly in the stamp is we. As there is a limited number of Royal Beasts they have had to be allocated to the various participating territories: The Falklands have the Red Dragon of Wales based on the James woodford sculptures which sat outside Westminster Abbey during the Coronation; the local animal will be the hornless ram heraldically symbolised as a stone supporter; the British Antarctic Territory will have the Black Bull of Clarence, also by Woodwara, and the emperor penguin; South Georgia's Royal Beast will be the Panther of Henry VI from the chapel of St George, Windsor Castle, with the fur seal as the local symbol.

Each country will issue three stamps of the same denomination in so-tenant format which will be in sheetlets of six stamps, is two so-tenant strips of three stamps with the strips separated by a gutter featuring a line drawing of the central part of the Coronation procession - the gold coach and herses. Notes on the origin of the Hoyal beasts and brief facts about the local boasts are also included on the sheetlet.

The stamps of the Falklands, South Georgia, and the Britiah Antarctic Territory will be 25p each or 21.50 per sheetlet; although the stamps are in sheetlets of six it is emphasized that there is no obligation to buy a sheetlet; single stamps may be purchased.

bost of the icsues will be released on Mer Majesty's birthday, the 21st April of this year; but ours will be released on the 2nd June, ie the anniversary of the Coronation, along with the british Antarctic Territory and South Ceorgia.

Further to my letter of the 7th concerning the forthcoming Coronation Sheetlet issue. At that date of writing I was unaware of the proposed face value of the stamps, and was assuming that they would be of current postage such as 3p llp etc., hence my saying that I was of the opinion that the issue is just acceptable. I am appalled that the value is to be of 25p, thus pricing the sheetlet at £1.50 each. This stamp can only be of practical use on inland parcels of 4lbs. and I would be interested to know just how many such parcels are handled weekly. This pointless face value puts the issue as a pure gimmick of the worst type, reducing our stamps to the same trash class as countries such as St.Vincent and Tonga.

It may be a bit late, but I would suggest that the Crown Agents are asked to at least change the face value of the stamp of this issue to make it a bit more acceptable and also that in future we do not want any more issue of such type and form.

In its present form I for one may buy a single stamp for my collection but certainly not the sheetlet and will advise anyone else who asks me likewise.

Postage stamps are primarily for the pre-payment of postage on mail but we must face the fact that we hope to enhange the Colony's Budget from the sale of stamps. Post Office Revenue would look very meagre indeed if it relied solely on assets from genuine postage.

I cannot agree the issue is reduced to mere 'trash' simply because we utilize a 25p stamp. The 25p value is similar in all the 24 participating territories. The whole aspect of this issue has had the blessing of Her Majesty the Queen and the F.C.O., and I cannot imagine Her Majesty approving 'trash' for such a Royal Occasion.

The question of the price per sheet has hardly any bearing on the matter. One may as well agrue that 50 stamps per sheet, in our current definitive, is too many because it cost £150 to purchase a sheet of £3 stamps. There is no question of forcing people to buy complete sheets and the Coronation Ixxxxx stamps may be purchased singly like any other stamps from the Post Office. Similarly, as with other issues, complete sheets are available for the speculator or those who may wish to purchase complete sheets.



Thank you for your letter of 16 January about the Coronation Anniversary Omnibus issue of stamps. We had a brief word about this at the last ExCo meeting and I confirm that we seem to have mislaid your earlier letter of 7 January. However, that should not affect my reply to the points that you have since made.

I myself originally shared your doubts about the practicality of issuing 25p stamps. I expressed my misgivings about this when I became aware of this issue at my first meeting of the Stamps Advisory Committee, which I chair. The Committee readily agreed that the matter should be raised with the Crown Agents; and so it was, by telegram. But it was already too late (23 December) to make any change.

Now that we have re-examined the matter at your prompting, my earlier misgivings have largely been dispelled. You asked specifically how many 41b parcels the postmaster handles in a week. He is not able to provide an accurate figure but we thought it would be fair to let you know the number of local parcels held in the Post Office on 9 February - the date on which the Postmaster fortuitously happened to answer my enquiry, on your behalf, about parcel traffic. The figures are as follows:

Those figures are, I submit, very revealing and suggest that a 25p stamp has a very real practical use indeed in the Colony for all parcels of 4 lb and above as well as for Overseas parcels. 70% of local parcels on that count could usefully and appropriately bear 25p stamps.

I really do feel that you are exaggerating when you claim that our stamps are being reduced to the "same trash class as Tonga etc". You might be interested to see the enclosed copy of a letter which I wrote to konnie Spafford about this issue on 13 December. I cannot usefully enlarge on it except just make three points:

- Omnibus issues are quite exceptional and we expect only to participate in them on those Regal occasions which it would be difficult to ignore without attracting adverse comment. I imagine that the next such issue would conceivably be to celebrate the marriage of the Meir to the Throne.
- (2) Contrary to general allegations, the demand for omnibus issues does seen to come from reputable dealers, though those of less good standing are naturally also interested.
- (3) The frontiers of philately do seem to be ever-ex anding and changing. Souvenir sheets may, therefore, soon acquire (if they have not already done so) a general respectability.

Probably I have still not managed to convince you. But I do hope to have at least satisfied you that stamp policy is a matter that is not treated lightly. We are faced with some tricky problems and try to resolve them in the Colony's best overall interests. As perhaps you have heard, I have constituted the holding of periodic consultative meetings with a wide range of people (interested for various reasons in our stamp issues). When next we have one, I shall let you know. It would be good to have you with us.

I am writing to you with a few thoughts concerning Falkland Island stamp issuing policy for the future, with a view to increasing revenue <u>without</u> wering the standard and reputation of our stamps in the world.

<u>Booklets</u>: It was a pity that the Jublice Booklet was in shectlet form but that is now all water under the bridge. For future issues, booklets can be a useful source of revenue as well as of practical benefit to the public.

I would like to suggest that we issue booklets of the new "mail boat" issue containing stamps of current use, namely 3p, 6p, and 11p, either all in one booklet or seperate. The stamps must be in their original form, i.e. normal sheet stamps without a special surround - they have the edging on one side only for attatchment to the booklet. The booklet itself can be attractively printed and contain such as a description of the Islands, current postage rates etc. For your information I enclose a booklet of 7p stamps from Britain. An alternative to this form could be like the earlier U.K.stamp booklets which were stitched together through the stamp edging.

Minature or Souvenir Sheets: I am not in favour of these at all. Britain is producing one in 1978 but purely to raise money for financing the International stamp exhibition in 1980. In other words this sheetlet is for a specific philatelic event and as such is accepted by philatelists. I think that the forthcoming Grown Agents Omnibus sheetletissue for the 25th Anniversary of the Coronation just falls within the limits as it is not just a one country affeir, it is being organised by a group of Commonwealth terretories. Also I am very conscious of the estimated £250,000 revenue that we can expect. However I would suggest that the Grown Agents are asked to be very careful about such types of stomp i sues in the future.

Presentation and Souvenir Packs. This is something which we should get moving on as soon as possible. The point to remember is that in such a pack, containing normal sheet stamps, nothing has been done to interfere with the stamps or the printing of them: what is done is to package and market them in an attractive form. I fully support the recommondations made by the Pepper Report in this area. As an example I enclose three such packs produced by the G.P.O. in Britain. Such packs would I feel be widely purchased by tourists visiting the Islands and also sell well overseas, particularily at stamp exhibitions - I also would like to see the Falklands represented at international exhibitions. Not only should this increase our revenue but it will also get us more international ,ublicity which would help us in other areas as well as philatelic revenue.

I hope that my views may be of some use to you and the Committee.

I have just seen that, in your Editorial in the March edition of "The Upland Goose", you cast doubts upon the practical uses of a stamp of 25p face value. Indeed, you asked how many 41b parcels (bearing such a stamp) the Post Office handles in one day.

2. This is a question that had exercised the Stamp Committee when we received the proposal that the Coronation Issue should comprise 25p stamps. Subsequently my colleague, Councillor Tim Eiller, asked about this in a formal letter of enquiry. He, in fact, asked specifically how many 4 lb parcels the Postmaster handles in one week. Accordingly, we did a spot check in the Post Office on 9 February upon parcel traffic. (The day happened to be the one on which I had passed on Councillor Miller's query). The figures were as follows:

3. That sample, we are satisfied, was quite typical of the normal flow of parcel traffic. I think that you will agree that the figures are very revealing and do show that a 25p stamp has a very real practical use in the Colony for all parcels of 4 lb and above as well as for parcels going overseas. 70% of local parcels could usefully and appropriately bear 25p stamps.

4. This knowled e has prompted us to have another lock at the values that we generally cover in our short commonorative issues, and the Stamp Committee has decided that, in future, we Should normally substitute a 25p stamp for the 22p stamp which we have been favouring, and for which there is now little demand. (The introduction of aerogrammes and the improved frequency of flights to the mainland scemed to have reduced significantly the weight of airmail letters.

5./

5. I very much hope that you will feel able to publish the gist of this letter in your columns, for it has been sent, not to score a debating point in the controversy about the Coronation issue, but to draw attention to the facts that determine stamp values. We are trying to ensure that the values relate to realistic values. We are keen also that commemorative issues should - so far as is possible - be used and seen locally. All too often it is only overseas recipients and collectors who seem to see specially issued stamps.



I very much regret to say that an error has been brought to our notice in the narrative on the sheetlet of the South Georgia Coronation omnibus issue. The text describes the design of the Queen's Beast as being the Panther of Yorkist Henry VI instead of Lancastrian Henry VI.

By the time the error came to light a fortnight ago it was unfortunately much too late to consider a reprint. Comment on the error has so far been limited to one UK national newspaper, the "Daily Mirror", and it now seems unlikely there will be any further comment on that scale, although the philatelic press may refer to the error in the weeks to come.


Please accept our sincere apologies for the mistake. We are certain that sales of the issue are in no way adversely affected.






I understand that you already know about this problem which is a matter of serious concern to us. You no doubt appreciate just how important the issue of stamps is to us, for we derive from it very considerable revenue. To have such a large consignment - 14,000 Coronation covers - from a leading North American dealer held up is a matter of serious concern to us. We stand to lose a considerable amount of money by this delay.

I should be very grateful, therefore, if you would be kind enough to look into this matter during your forthcoming visit to Buenos Aires to see whether there is anything you can do to obtain the release of this freight consignment.

I understand from the final paragraph of the enclosed memorandum from the Postmaster that there may be a further package similarly held up which had been consigned to us from New York. If you could also manage to obtain the release of this one also I should be most grateful.
