ii) POSTMARKS

Another new idea and again we are not certain exactly what is proposed. That is whether the intention is to reproduce the actual first cancellation postmark or the first postage stamp. The latter is to be used this year in the "Centenary of the First Issue of Postage Stamps" and thus any duplication must be avoided. However, without knowing your plans, we would say that our initial reaction to this topic is guarded because 'postal' anniversaries are appearing with some regularity.

Postmark Issue: It was agreed that Mr Halliday should chair a design sub-committee to put forward ideas for this issue which could be very attractive to collectors with an interest in these Islands. There is plenty of evidence available based on Mr Andrews' definitive work on this subject, and the Chairman mentioned that his attention had recently been drawn to an appealing issue by another country on this theme.



2. The colours to be a pastel shade deeper (like the small stamp size design) at the outside and becoming lighter in the middle of the stamp.
3. We have submitted 5 franks but in different formats.

LONDON 1980 STAMP EXHIBITION

Please refer to para 4 of my letter of 19 March.

2. I attach some rough art work showing how we think our Postmarks issue should be dealt with. The designs were prepared before we decided to use them for the Stamp Exhibition, so they will need changing to make room for the Stamp Exhibition symbol.
3. We more or less agree on your suggestion for a six-stamp issue in the form of a miniature sheet with stamps of all the same value. What we have wondered is if we would get a better return if we had six different values rather than the six 11p stamps we propose, and I should welcome your views on this. On the other hand we don't want to be too out-of-step if other territories are settling for six stamps of all one value.
4. You will find illustrations of the Postmarks in James Andrews' book "The cancellations of the Falkland Islands and Dependencies", published by Robson Lowe 1956.
5. The Postmarks to be depicted are:
 - (i) the first 1878-1899 Falkland Islands frank;
 - (ii) the first Port Stanley frank - not attached but Andrews' book on postal franks will show a sample;
 - (iii) the New Island 1909-1917 frank;
 - (iv) the 1914-1948 Fox Bay frank;
 - (v) the 1952 First Overseas Airmail frank;
 - (vi) West Falkland frank 1899-1904 - Andrews' book will give an illustration.
6. We would like the colours to be as near as possible to those in the small strip. Please ignore the designs in the colour strip as they do not relate to the designs we want as one was an obliterator and not a frank. This will leave one colour to be chosen, and I leave this to you or your artist to select. We would like the colours to be deeper at the outside, becoming lighter towards the centre.

POSTMARKS ISSUE

This meeting was held to consider the designs submitted by the Design Committee together with two designs prepared by the Postmaster.

The designs were prepared prior to the decision to release the issue in connection with the 1980 Stamp Exhibition, and the Committee noted that the designs would need to be changed to include the Exhibition symbol.

It was agreed to accept the designs of the Design Committee with the exception of the FI obliterator which was not a true postmark. It was also decided to include the West Falkland postmark and the first Port Stanley to make a six-stamp issue as suggested by the Crown Agents.

It was decided that the basic design should be that depicting the New Island frank with Falkland Islands at the top; the value in the top left-hand corner; and Her Majesty's profile in gold in the top right-hand corner.

It was agreed that the issue should be produced as in the colour sample produced by the Design Committee with the deeper outer edge becoming lighter towards the centre.

As there was some doubt as to the exact period in which the postmarks were used, it was decided to amend the dates as far as was known, which would be preferable to leaving the designs without dates.

It was agreed to ask the Crown Agents if we would secure a better return if we had six different value stamps as opposed to the Crown Agents suggestion for six same value stamps which, in our case, would be the 11p airmail stamps. It would also be of interest to know the policy of other participating territories with regard to the suggested block of six stamps.

The Committee agreed with some reluctance to the release of a miniature sheet but noted that this would still be in accordance with the policy of having one souvenir/miniature sheet a year. The Committee noted that a change in postage rates may necessitate an alteration in the stamp value at a later date.

The Chairman thanked the Design Committee and the Postmaster for the designs submitted.

2. Mr. Halliday renewed his request to resign from the Committee as he said that his contribution to the Committee was limited by the lack of time he could devote to stamp matters. It was agreed to consider his request.

3. OTHER BUSINESS

As this was the last meeting that Mr. Massingham would attend, the Deputy Chief Secretary thanked him for his interest and guidance during his period as Chairman.

1.9 Postmarks Issue - 1980

The rough designs and the committee's suggestions have been forwarded to the Crown Agents. It was assumed that the Crown Agents were working on these, and comments are expected shortly. This issue is to be released in connection with the 1980 London Stamp Exhibition.

LONDON 1980 (POSTMARKS)

... Please find enclosed the finished artwork for the above stamp issue. If you refer back to your letter dated 27 March 1979 to Brian Hawthorne, you will see that the artist has managed to carry out most of your instructions, to produce an attractive set.

2 Your suggestion of having six different values rather than six 11p stamps was not such a good idea, since it would obviously cause trouble with sales for postal use in the Post Offices; it only needs a rush on one particular value, and you will have part-sheetlets scattered all over your Post Offices!

3 The artist, Glyn Hutchins, has used an air brush to give the required gradation of colour towards the outside of each stamp. As requested, the profile of Her Majesty will be printed in gold; the "London 1980" logo will be printed in black, and the words "FALKLAND ISLANDS" will be printed in a deeper version of the background colour in each case.

... 4 I also enclose a first day cover design (finished artwork). Although the artist has designed this to be printed in one colour (black), it would be perfectly feasible to instruct the printer to print the bisected stamp shown on the cover in the correct colour - it is either the 1d red/brown or 1d claret bisect of 1891, and if you have any preference, please let me know. Please also let me know whether you will be removing the borders from around the sheetlet when you affix stamps on to the covers. If you intend to do this, I can use a slightly smaller envelope, but if you intend affixing the sheetlets including the margin, I must keep to the 110 x 220mm size.

5 I hope that you like the designs, and can return them to me fairly shortly.

POSTMARKS ISSUE 1980

Thank you for your letter of 19 September forwarding the artwork of the Postmarks issue.

2. I return the artwork which we find acceptable. The only things we would like changed are:

- (i) the insertion of ^athe date the right way up in the 1899-1904 West Falkland date stamp. We realise that date shown is authentic, but there would be no end to the criticism about this if it remains as in the artwork, so I must ask you to select a known date with the date the right way up. There will be sample covers somewhere to guide you so that you don't pick a date when there was no franking of mail. James Andrews Cancellations of Falklands may help.
- (ii) We think the stamps will be improved by eliminating the white around and inside the date stamp and substituting the background colour. The white surrounding the logo "London 1980" "Falkland Islands" and the value tablet would seem better left undisturbed.

3. I regret that the FDC design is unacceptable. Having said that, I have not been able so far to provide an alternative, but will do so ~~as~~ soon as we are clear in our minds what we want on the FDC design, and that is a picture of the present Stanley Post Office. It will really be no more than a picture of the entrance to the Town Hall which houses the Post Office, but this should be all right for a FDC.

4. You ask if the Post Office will be removing the borders from around the sheetlet when affixing stamps to the covers: what the Post Office intend doing is affixing the sheetlets including the margin, so you will need to keep to the 110 x 220 mm size.

The rough designs of this issue together with a FDC design were submitted by the Crown Agents for consideration.

Whilst the colour and designs of the stamps were accepted, together with noted comments from the Crown Agents it was agreed the background colour should be substituted for the white in and surrounding the postmarks. The top right hand stamp should show the date the correct way up but care should be taken that a date known to have been used was inserted.

The FDC design was not acceptable.

Members agreed that the FDC should feature the present Stanley Post Office.



The contents of this telex has been discussed with the Postmaster, and Mr. Stephenson who are of the opinion that if the Crown Agents have adequate reference or examples of the 8SP04 date being used in the correct manner we should substitute this for the former design.

If the Crown Agents are unable to provide proof of this date in the correct manner we should continue with the former design. Andrews book on postmarks is accepted worldwide by philatelists for reference and we should not experience criticism in the portrayal of an inverted postmark.

Undoubtedly they are not the best as polaroid prints never depict the finer detail, but they do I think resemble the present colouring and condition of the building today. Photographs 1 to 4 were taken during Sunday afternoon, with the sun at its highest while 5 was taken towards sunset at 7.30 p.m. (the time on the clock will need altering if this photograph is used). If these photographs are used the neon sign will need altering. There is a good black and white photograph in 'The Postal Service of the Falkland Islands' by Robert Barnes page 45, which depicts the old Post Office sign.

As we have never issued low value stamps in sheetlet form before, I think our requirements will need to be raised a little and therefore recommend we require 10,000 sheetlets.


We have decided that the FDC design should show the present Post Office which is situated in the Town Hall.

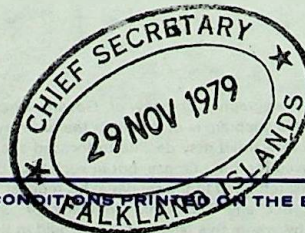

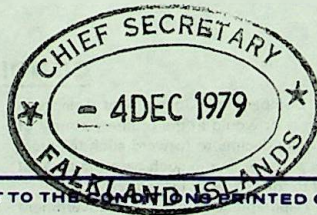

Dear Mr Parker

I regret that I must be snowing you down with correspondence. However I have just heard that the Falkland Islands are in the late stages of preparing to issue a set of stamps which once again will be in a format distasteful to us collectors. I heard the rumour from four other members of the Committee of our Philatelic Study Group, and all voiced their protests to me. I have telephoned the Crown Agents this afternoon and our worst fears are confirmed.

The designs of this future issue sound attractive: historic postmarks of the Falkland Islands and, presumably, these would be well received by philatelists. What is wrong is that:

- a. each of the six stamps have the same face value - 25p?
- b. they are to be printed together into a sheetlet, no doubt with all sorts of marginal inscriptions!

Thus it is intended to ruin a nice idea by gimmickry.

The Crown Agents tell me that they believe that this format will look nice on their sales stand at the International Stamp Exhibition LONDON 1980! Hardly the first priority, I would have thought.

The Crown Agents say that they are appealing to a new market! Yes, but by this type of gimmickry, the Falkland Islands will be well on the road to losing their present market. Is this really a desirable state of affairs?

I understand that, as yet, the stamps have not been printed, although they have been approved in design and format by the Falkland Islands Stamp Design Committee. Therefore, since the issue is due to be made in May, there is still yet time to correct this gross error in understanding what philatelists will want and will buy.

My request is that the Falkland Islands Stamp Design Committee should think about the matter again.

What Falkland Islands stamp collectors will want is:

- a. each stamp to carry a separate face value, appropriate to useful postage rates.
- b. each stamp to be issued in normal full sheet format (2 X 25 stamps per sheet).
- c. the abandonment of the sheetlet format.

I do wish that the Crown Agents would consult with one of the Post Office's chief customers: the philatelists. It is quite obvious that the Crown Agents staff at H Division have just no idea of what is or is not desired by philatelists, and it seems to me quite stupid that there should be all this friction, when all sides wish to achieve the same aim. Why cannot we get together with the Crown Agents and discuss the problems?

I hate writing sour editorials in *The Upland Goose*, and urging collectors to boycott Falkland Islands stamp issues: our views have been stated so plainly over the past years and to boycott issues to which we have an objection is our only weapon in the final stage; this must have a detrimental affect on the badly needed revenue to the Falkland Islands Treasury. One has to wonder if the Crown Agents can really be so ignorant, or if, indeed, they are being deliberately perverse. Yet we have tried deperately to hold out the hand of friendship to the Crown Agents!

As I understand the situation, the stamps have not yet been printed, and the change to a reasonable format to which we would give our 100% support could still yet be made.

Please may I, therefore, beg for a reconsideration of the format of this planned stamp issue, and beg that our wishes be taken into consideration in the future, perhaps on an on-going basis. I feel sure that the Falkland Islands will greatly benefit financially from such an arrangement, and for the long term.

Since your requirements for a First Day Cover for the above issue were rather drastically changed, I have commissioned the artist to produce a new rough design; This has now been completed, and I enclose it for your approval.

2 Whilst I generally approve of the design, in which a rather unexciting building looks attractive, there are several comments I must make. The first comment is that the area left for affixing of the stamp sheetlet is too small (the artist has not allowed for the border around the stamps). This must obviously be corrected at finished artwork stage. The second comment is that we have only just managed to get hold of a copy of Robert Barnes' book "The Postal Service of the Falkland Islands", which has been out of print for a while, and is currently being reprinted. I have just received a copy from the publishers, which will be sent to the artist for his reference at the stage of producing finished artwork.

3 Finally, you will notice that the artist has restricted himself to the use of three colours; whilst we would generally applaud such a restriction, you may feel that a further colour (green) should be used for the area in front of the Post Office.

4 I look forward to hearing your verdict on this design.

I return herewith the rough design (FDC) of this issue.

Generally speaking the design is colourful and attractive but the artist has substituted blue for green in all the window facings, gutter pipes and roof of the building and the grass verge. To bring out the pavement surround I suggest a grey colouring is used for the street.

The PC door should be in the third bay from the left and not the fourth. As the entire frontal view of the building has been portrayed the clock should I think be viewed. *shown*

The C/A comment on the area required for affixing the sheetlet is noted and it may be better off to provide a slightly longer envelope to accommodate the sheetlet border rather than reduce the size of the design. Consideration might be given to have the design and inscription embossed.

Expensive

I also note the reprint of the Robert Barnes book and if this contains more up to date information than the previous edition it would be worthwhile obtaining one for reference purposes.

You will recall that I telephoned you yesterday afternoon regarding the use of the word "frank" in the 1980 Stamp Programme when describing the cancellations used in the design of the stamps forming the POST MARK ISSUE.

The term "frank" in correct philatelic terminology is a marking to indicate "free postage" and has never been used in the Falkland Islands. The use of the words "Red Frank" and "Black Frank" are misnomers and that is why they are usually put in inverted commas. It is appreciated that the term "frank" is loosely used by the general public and even sometimes by the Post Office in England, but it would be a pity if the incorrect use of the word crept into publications which will be read, in the main, by philatelists.

All the illustrations on the stamps are "cancellations" or "Obliterations" and are of course "Post Marks" as the name of the issue implies.

Could it be possible to have the 1980 Stamp Programme altered to show the correct terminology i.e. the removal of the word "frank" and the insertion of the word "cancellation" as I do not think that it would be good for our philatelic image to appear ignorant on this point.

Thank you for your letter of 21 December enclosing the artwork for the FDC.

2. Your artist has certainly made the FDC colourful - so much so that you will have to ask him to get away from the blue and substitute green for the window facings, gutter down-pipes and the roof. The grass in front of the building should also be green: in other words, your artist should follow the photograph.

3. There are two other things wrong and they are:

i) the door is too far along the building; it should be shown in the third bay from the left end; and

ii) the Town Hall clock should be shown.

Would it not be better to provide a longer envelope to accommodate the stamp sheetlet, rather than reduce the size of drawing? But I leave this to you: our main concern is that there is ample room for the sheetlet.



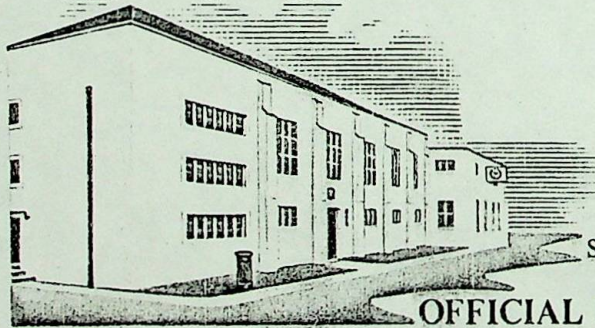

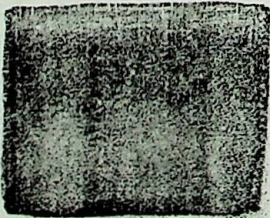
