The Postmaster General directs me to acquaint you that His Majesty's Government, in connexion with a possible revision of postage rates, is considering the practicability of reducing the postage on postcards posted in Great Britain and addressed to any part of the British Empire to \$\frac{1}{2}d.\$, concurrently with a reduction of the letter rate to 1d. per ounce. The Government has at present come to no definite conclusion on the matter; but I am to request you to be good enough to inform the Postmaster General by telegraph whether, in the event of it being found possible to make this concession, you would be prepared to treat as fully prepaid postcards properly prepaid at the reduced rate.
