

With reference to your letter dated the 16th June 1914, formanding a sum of 17/9 in payment for certain posté age stamps of this Colony, I beg to express regret that oving to your order having been inadvertently mislaid the order was not complied with sconer. Soon after your order was received it became necessary to take steps to safe guard all documents &c. in case the Colony was attached. The Officer responsible for dealing with stamp orders inadvertently mislaid your order when complying with my instructions as to the safety of Postal Correspondence.
