I attach a list showing the quantities
10. I consider should be ordered for sale locally.

I estimate that the cost should be in the neighbourhood of £200. (Dies at £13. 10/- ea - £162 cost of printing and paper £38)

The quantities given do not include the stamps the Crown Agents will sell to dealers when the issue is first put on the market. I think it is the practice of the Crown Agents to inform the principal dealers before the stamps are released and obtain their orders in advance. On the last occasion they were asked to order and retain such quantities of each denomination as were estimated to meet the demands of dealers (See Red 19 - M.P. 457/27) and I would suggest that on this occasion a similar request should be made to them. They might also be asked to retain the necessary specimens for distribution to members of the International Postal Union.

I have based the estimate of quantities required for sale locally on the actual sales of the pictorial issue for the period September, 1929 to August, 1930. Due allowance has been made for the absence of a 2½d value and the additional 1D stamps that will be required to make up foreign postage in conjunction with the 1½d stamp. Additions have also been made for a possible extra demand just before the issue is about to be withdrawn from circulation.

I would suggest that a letter on the lines of Red 19 - M.P. 457/27 is all that is required, but if an indent is preferable I will furnish one.

Submitted. This is a most unusual request. In effect the Col. Postmaster asks for the return to her of a specific amount of revenue and I fear such a request would not commend itself to the S. of S.

2. Mrs Carey undoubtedly took a great personal interest in pushing the sale of Centenary stamps. On the other hand this was considered when she was recommended for preference as Col. Postmaster on increased scale £250 - £10 - £300, plus a personal allowance of £30 p. a.

3. There should have been no errors or shortage in executing orders for stamps. It was always the practice for some other officer to check stamp orders and initial such as to its correctness. Apparently the Col. Postmaster has

I have the honour to attach, in duplicate, suggested designs for the Centenary issue of postage stamps as selected from the number submitted to the Centenary Committee, together with such photographs, charts, etc, as are obtainable, for the information of the Colonial Office.

2. The work involved in preparing and designing these stamps has been heavy and has occupied the major portion of my spare time for four months. Out-of-pocket expenses have been incurred for materials to the amount of £2. 16. 9.

3. I hope that the set will be accepted and that it will be the means of increasing the revenue of this Colony in 1933.

FALKLAND ISLANDS CENTENARY STAMP ISSUE.

On January 1st, 1933, the Falkland Islands Government will place on issue a commemorative set of postage and revenue stamps on the occasion of the Centenary of the establishment of the Colony.

The set will consist of twelve denominations representing objects and scenes of interest connected with the Colony and with the Dependencies. It will be on issue for twelve months only after which any stocks remaining will be destroyed. The currency of the Falkland Islands is the same as that of the United Kingdom and the value of a full set will be £2.

The following designs have been chosen for the several denominations :

The half-penny stamp has for its subject a Romney Marsh Ram of the type characteristic of and predominant in the sheep flocks of the Colony the prime industry of which, namely wool, is thus fittingly represented. -

The penny stamp is a reproduction of a photograph of a tabular ice-berg broken off from the Great Ice Barrier such as commonly encountered in the waters of the Dependencies and generally in Antarctic seas. -

The penny and a half-penny stamp similarly is a reproduction of a whale-catcher or vessel of the trawler class as used for the actual hunting and killing of the whale again in the Dependencies and in the Antarctic.

The two-penny stamp gives a view of the original settlement and old capital at Port Louis in Berkely Sound taken from a view by William Langdon, R.N., published in G. T. Whittington's "Falkland Islands" in 1846.

The three-penny stamp is a map of the Colony reproduced from the existing Admiralty Chart.

The four-penny stamp shows a scene typical of wild and mountainous South Georgia, the most important of the Dependencies. In the background is the whaling station maintained by the Compañia Argentina de Pesca at Grytviken in Cumberland Bay.

The sixpenny stamp ^{pictures a lake and the} ~~illustrates a river of stones or stone run, that curious geological feature of the Colony the exact origin of which is disputed.~~

~~The~~ shilling stamp gives a view of Government House at Stanley, the capital of the Colony.

The two shilling and sixpenny stamp is a reproduction of a photograph of the Battle Memorial at Stanley erected by public subscription and unveiled in February, 1927, in commemoration of the naval victory gained off the shores of the Colony by the British Squadron under the late Vice-Admiral Sir Doveton Sturdee, K.C.B., on the 9th of December, 1914.

The five shilling stamp portrays a King Penguin, which magnificent bird breeds in the Dependencies and is an occasional visitor to the Colony.

The ten shilling stamp displays the modern Arms of the Colony, as granted by Royal Warrant dated the 16th of October, 1925, to wit : a Sea Lion and a representation of the ship "Desire" in which John Davis sailed when he discovered the Falkland Islands on the 14th of August, 1592.

The one pound stamp is a portrait in uniform of His Majesty King George the Fifth.

With reference to your despatch No. 129 of the 18th of November, 1931, conveying your approval of the action contemplated in connection with the celebration of the Colony's Centenary in 1933, I have the honour to suggest that it would be fitting to mark the occasion by the issue of a commemorative set of postage and revenue stamps.

2. I forward therefore for your approval a series of designs, together with duplicate copies and specifications proposed for such a set which has been elaborated by Mr. G. Roberts, Director of Public Works, and recommended by the Centenary Committee. 

These supplies and the specimens for distribution will be released on the 1st January 1933 but in order that the release of the stamps here should coincide with the placing of the issue on sale locally, we shall be glad if you will cable us confirmation of this issue date in due course.

3. With regard to the colours for the borders of the stamps specified in the specification accompanying the Governor's despatch No.38 of the 22nd February, it is considered that the borders for the 6d. 5/- and 10/- denominations in more contrasting colours would improve the appearance of these denominations and we have arranged with the printers that they should submit to us a selection in alternative colours for our approval in respect of these three values. The *penny* stamp is a reproduction of a tabular ice-berg broken off from the Great Ice Barrier such as commonly encountered in the waters of the Dependencies and generally in Antarctic seas.

The *penny and a half-penny* stamp similarly is a reproduction of a whale-catcher or vessel of the trawler class as used for the actual hunting and killing of the whale again in the Dependencies and in the Antarctic.

The *two-penny* stamp gives a view of the original settlement and old capital at Port Louis in Berkeley Sound taken from a view by William Langdon, R.N., published in G. T. Whittington's "Falkland Islands" in 1840.

The *three-penny* stamp is a map of the Colony reproduced from the existing Admiralty Chart.

The *four-penny* stamp shows a scene typical of wild and mountainous South Georgia, the most important of the Dependencies. In the background is the Whaling Station maintained by the Compania Argentina de Pesca at Grytviken in Cumberland Bay.

The *sixpenny* stamp pictures a whale and the *shilling* stamp gives a view of Government House at Stanley, the capital of the Colony.

The *two shilling and sixpenny* stamp is a reproduction of a photograph of the Battle Memorial at Stanley erected by public subscription and unveiled in February, 1927, in commemoration of the naval victory gained off the shores of the Colony by the British Squadron under the late Vice-Admiral Sir Doveton Sturdee, K.C.B., on the 8th of December, 1914.

The *five shilling* stamp portrays a King Penguin, which magnificent bird breeds in the Dependencies and is an occasional visitor to the Colony.

The *ten shilling* stamp displays the modern arms of the Colony, as granted by Royal Warrant dated the 16th of October, 1925, to wit : a Sea Lion and a representation of the ship "Desire" in which John Davis sailed when he discovered the Falkland Islands on the 14th of August, 1592.

The *one pound* stamp is a portrait in uniform of His Majesty King George the Fifth.

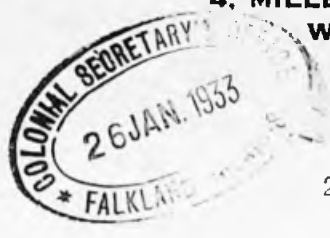

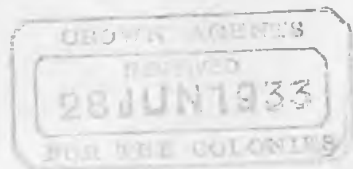
