At the request of the Colonial Office I had an interview with Mr. H.H. Baker, the Government Geologist for the Falkland Islands, before his departure from this country, and subsequently furnished him with particulars of the minerals from the Colony and its dependencies which have been examined at the Imperial Institute.

In reporting the interview to the Colonial Office I pointed out that in several cases further samples of the minerals were required in order that their commercial possibilities might be ascertained, and I asked that Mr. Baker might be instructed to collect and forward the material required.
