# NOTES ON PEAT, GUANO AND MINERALS IN THE COLONY.

# PEAT.

- (a) Peat is found practically all over the Colony but there are no deposits of large area.
  - (b) Peat is not produced on a large scale, 52,000 cubic yards being cut annually for the requirements of the only town in the Colony.
  - (c) Peat is air dried.

### GUANO.

No detailed information as to the extent of the guano deposits in the Colony is available.

### MINERALS.

There are no minerals of economic value in the Colony.
