Bonds of the Old Hungarian Government Debt in Italy are requested to send their Bonds, together with the relative Coupons, by registered post to the Administrator of Hungarian Property, Cornwall House, Stamford Street, London, S.E. 1, no later than 3 p.m. on Friday, 14th April, 1922, accompanied by a memorandum stating the name and address of the holder, the distinctive numbers and denominations of the Bonds, and the date when the Bonds were acquired.

AUSTRALIAN PATENT LAW.

A copy of the Commonwealth Patents Act, 1921, has been received, and may be seen in the Patent Office Library, 25, Southampton Buildings, London, W.C. 2.

The Act, which was passed on 15th December last, amends the Principal Act (the Commonwealth Patents Act, 1903-1909) in the following respects:

- (a) By applying the Principal Act to the Territory of New Guinea from a date to be fixed by proclamation;
- (b) By extending the term of patents from 14 to 16 years;
- (c) By providing for prolongation of the term of a patent on application made to the Court by way of originating summons where loss or damage has been caused through the war;
- (d) By limiting the maximum periods for which the term of a patent may be prolonged to 5 and 10 years; and
- (e) By providing that applications for patents under the International Convention may be made either by the foreign applicants or their legal representatives or assignees.

DEPARTMENT OF OVERSEAS TRADE.

CLOSING OF COMMERCIAL DIPLOMATIC POST.

In view of the need for economy in public expenditure it has been decided to suspend the post of Commercial Secretary (Grade II.) for Peru. The post will be closed on 31st March next. Correspondence previously addressed to the Commercial Secretary should be addressed to H.M. Consul, British Consulate, Callao.

APPOINTMENT OF HONORARY TRADE CORRESPONDENT IN THE BECHUANALAND PROTECTORATE.
