2. I have increased the quantity from 8I00 cubic yards to 9000 cubic yards so as to endeavour tp procure a reserve.

To enable this quantity to be cut new banks may have to be opened late in the season, when the peat would have to be stacked on the hill ready for removal in about October or November 1923.

Tenders should be addressed to the Chairman of the Tender Board, should be marked "Tender for Peat" and should be deposited in the box marked "Government Fenders" at the Colonial Secretary's Office.

- 2. Sods should only be out at places indicated by the Colonial Engineer or by a person deputed by him, and must be out and rickled to his satisfaction, otherwise they will be rejected by him.
- The top sod to a depth of three i shes is not to be reckoned, and the walls of existing peat cuttings must be cut away to a horizontal depth of two inches before measurement can be reckoned.
