

## CUBIC YARDS OF PEAT.

I, CYRIL MENRICKSEN, agree with the Colonial Engineer to cut and rickle nine thousand (9000) cubic yards of peat in sods as required; (a) of dimensions not exceeding 9"x 9"x 6" for -/72d per cubic yard for open banks and -/8d per cubic yard for new banks; (b) of dimensions not exceeding 9"x 6"x 6" for -/72d per cubic yard for open banks and -/8d per cubic yard for new banks, the sods to be cut and thrown in open bank, subject to the following conditions:-

- 2. The top sod to a depth of three inches shall not be redicned and the walls of existing peat cuttings shall be cut away to a horizontal depth of two inches before measurement can be reckoned.
- The peat shall be out and rickled in the places pointed out by, and to the satisfaction of, the Colonial Engineer or person deputed by him. Cutting shall commen e on the 15th. Cotober 1923, weather ermitting.
- 4. Half the quantity of peat shall be ready for removal by the 8th. December 1923 and the remainder by the 12th. January 1924, weather permitting.
- 5. Theeling under this contract shall mean removing dry rickled peat from bank to suitable position to be decided on by the Colonial Engineer within the vicinity of banks to enable the carts to load. The wheeling shall be such as may be required, ordered and decided by the Colonial Engineer in any and all cases and subject to the option of the Colonial Engineer to have the wheeling done by labour employed by him in any case and at any time, should be think fit.

The rate to be paid for all peat to be wheeled under this contract in accordance with the above shall be -/2d per cubic yard.

In case of failure properly to perform any part of the work hereby agreed upon to the satisfaction of the Colonial Engineer, that Officer may at once determine this contract and defray any cost incurred by my default by stopping any payment due or which may become due to me and, if such stoppage is not sufficient to cover the cost, he may mulct the person who has given security for my proper fulfilment of the contract in such amount as he may deem to be necessary completely to cover the loss occasioned to the Government by my default.
