You probably recall our previous correspondence as well as the two geologists, Dr. Robert Berg and Mr. Walter Randall, who have visited the Falkland Islands in the spring of 1966.

Although their findings concerning the geology of Falkland Islands were rather negative onshore, we have now reached the conclusion that there could be an oil potential both offshore Falkland Islands, as well as in the Burdwood Bank.

We are very interested in actively exploring the offshore oil and gas potential and would like immediately to proceed with an application for the shelf area surrounding the Falkland Islands, especially that part between the Falkland Islands and Argentina. Our application would then cover the area between the Falkland Islands shore and mid-point between Argentina and the Falkland Islands.

We would also like to submit a separate application for an oil exploration license for the Burdwood Bank.

At this stage I do not know if the Falkland Islands claim the ownership of the Burdwood Bank and if your office would consider an oil exploration license over the Burdwood Bank. We have in our possession the standard oil exploration license, second schedule, parts I, II, and III, as well as the other regulations which you were kind enough to send us before.

Since mail is rather slow between the Falkland Islands and the United States and if you agree that we could submit an application for the offshore areas of the Falkland Islands, as well as another application for the Burdwood Bank, I would greatly appreciate it if you would send us a night letter cable collect, giving instructions and recommendations to prepare the



Enclosed is our application in duplicate for an oil exploration license covering a portion of the continental shelf of the Falkland Islands. Also enclosed is our check #17356 in the amount of \$11,388.70, to cover the appropriate fee. We have increased our check by a consideration of \$10.00 to cover any bank charges in clearing the check.

In order to ascertain that the mail is not lost on its way to the Falkland Islands we are mailing a duplicate of exactly the same set of applications a week later.

Because we would like to commence exploration operations on the continental shelf of the Falkland Islands as soon as possible, we would greatly appreciate it if you would send to us a telegram "collect" the day our application has been approved. As soon as the telegram is received we would immediately request bids from several aeromagnetic survey contractors in order that such a survey would commence as soon as the bids are received.

We are anxious to help the British balance of payments and are hereby undertaking to use only British companies for all exploration services, provided these services are available and can be obtained at competitive prices.

You may be assured that because of our long studies of the geology of the Falkland Islands, we have now become emotionally involved and are very anxious to proceed with a very active and speedy offshore geophysical exploration effort in hope of finding structures that may be hydrocarbon bearing.

I have just returned from England where our solicitor, Mr. J. A. C. Ellis, of the legal firm of Leman, Harrison and Flegg, 44 Bloomsbury Square, London, WC I, England, is forming a British company which will be a subsidiary company of Oceanic Exploration and Development Corp. As soon as this corporation has been formed we will wire you the pertinent details, including the name of the subsidiary corporation.

#### Exploration Program:

- 1. An aerial magnetometer survey of the licensed area.
- 2. The initial seismic lines will be surveyed on the sea on a ten-mile reconnaissance grid pattern followed up with a five mile infill grid pattern. The areas of special interest would be further detailed by seismograph. Advanced methods in seismic exploration would be used that vastly increase the effectiveness of this system in finding productive structures. The latest seismic techniques consisting of a C.D.P. (common depth point digital computer process) seismic survey will be used. An international geophysical company will be contracted to perform seismic surveys in the licensed area.

The most prospective seismic structure would be selected and a well drilled.

- (7) The company and its subsidiaries are engaged in the following exploration projects for petroleum, aside from their activities in the field of uranium and exploration for other minerals:
  - A. Exploration for oil and gas for itself and for direct investors in the U.S.A. These efforts are concentrated in the western states and those of the Gulf of Mexico coast. The company receives the benefits of production from several oil and gas fields.
  - B. Exploration for natural gas in the Green River Basin of Wyoming for a Chemical company. This work has resulted in the discovery of two gas fields.
  - C. In partnership with a number of American and Dutch companies, the company is the holder of Block K-9 in the Netherlands part of the North Sea. Exploration work will begin this year.
  - D. This company was granted, during May, 1968, two exploration permits on the continental shelf of Ghana.
  - E. In association with the Italian company, AGIP Mineraria, we hold an exploration permit on the continental shelf of Madagascar.
  - F. A petroleum exploration permit for offshore northwest Sabah, Malaysia is approved.

G. In uranium, the company carries out exploration in a number of states of the United States of America and holds an extensive exploration permit in Nigeria.

#### (8) Supervisory Personnel:

Jack J. Grynberg, Denver, Colorado, President of Jack Grynberg and Associates, graduated from the Colorado School of Mines with a professional degree of Petroleum Refining Engineer. Later he received the professional degree of Petroleum Production Engineer and did two years' graduate study in exploration geophysics in the same university. He was employed by Continental Oil Company in 1953 and 1954 in the Research and Development Department. In 1954, he formed his own firm, Jack Grynberg and Associates, to engage in consulting petroleum, geological and geophysical engineering. Mr. Grynberg has written a number of articles about well log interpretation and is a co-author of a textbook on well log interpretation. He conducted some twenty-two four-week intensive courses for petroleum engineers, geologists, and geophysicists on the subjects of electric, radioactive, and acoustic well log interpretation and petroleum reservoir engineering.

W. S. McCabe, Denver, Colorado, received a B.S. (1934) and M.S. (1935) degree in geology from the University of Illinois and one-year graduate work in geology at Princeton. He worked as supervisor of geological personnel for Superior Oil Company of California and for Pan American Oil Company (a subsidiary of Standard Oil Company of Indiana), Canadian Husky in Canada, and as an independent consulting geologist prior to employment by Jack Grynberg and Associates as geologist and Vice-President.

Paul R. May, Denver, Colorado, is employed by Jack Grynberg and Associates as geologist and geophysicist and as a manager of foreign operations. He was previously employed by the U.S. Geological Survey and the California Oil Company. He received a B.S. degree in 1949 and an M.S. degree in 1950 from the University of Michigan.

John J. Thuis, Denver, Colorado, is employed by Jack Grynberg and Associates as a geologist and as manager of domestic exploration. He was previously employed by Phillips Petroleum Company. He received a B.S. degree in Geology from the University of Oklahoma in 1950.

Professor John Chronic, Boulder, Colorado, Professor of Geology, University of Colorado, is retained as a consultant in oil, gas and mineral exploration.



## Memorandum of Association

OF

ATLANTIC AND OCEANIC RESOURCES LIMITED

- 1. The name of the Company is "ATLANTIC AND OCEANIC RESOURCES LIMITED".
- 2. The registered office of the Company will be situate in England.
- The objects for which the Company is established are -
- (A) (1) To acquire, own, purchase, sell, take on, lease, hold, enjoy, operate, dispose of, convey and lease real and personal property of every description including lands, mines, mineral properties, grants, concessions, leases, claims, licenses, water rights, wells, plants, works, refineries, factories, mills, shops, terminals, stations, waterhouses, pipe lines, storage tanks and drilling rigs, either absolutely or conditionally and either solely or jointly with other parties;
  - (2) To purchase, construct, lease, or otherwise acquire, own, hold, use, maintain, operate, or otherwise manage or control, sell, exchange, lease, mortgage, pledge, or otherwise dispose of, property of any kind or character, real, personal or mixed, tangible or intangible, necessary, useful, or convenient therefor, and to acquire, hold, mortgage, pledge, or dispose of shares, bonds and other evidences of indebtednesses;
  - (3) To buy, sell, operate and otherwise deal in oil properties of all kind, including but without limitation, royalties, minerals, overriding royalties, leases, working interests, operating rights and leasehold equipment of any kind and nature;
  - (4) To carry on the business of exporters and importers as principal, factors,

agents or commission merchants in respect to buying, selling, trading or dealing in any kind or kinds of goods, wares and merchandise; and to do a general brokerage, commission, import, forwarding and export business;

- (5) To engage in and carry on the petroleum business, and the various branches thereof, including the production, storage, transportation, purchase and sale of oil and gas and its products and by-products and refining, treating, applying, compounding and preparing them for market;
- (6) To engage in and carry on the business of mining, and the various branches thereof, including exploring for, development, production, storage, transportation, purchase and sale of mineral ores and their products and by-products, and refining, treating, applying, compounding and preparing them for market.
- (B) To carry on any other trade or business which can, in the opinion of the Board of Directors, be advantageously carried on by the Company in connection with or as ancillary to any of the above businesses or the general business of the Company.
- (C) To purchase, take on lease or in exchange, hire or otherwise acquire and hold for any estate or interest any lands, buildings, easements, rights, privileges, concessions, patents, patent rights, licences, secret processes, machinery, plant, stock-in-trade, and any real or personal property of any kind necessary or convenient for the purposes of or in connection with the Company's business or any branch or department thereof.
  - (D) To erect, construct, lay down, enlarge, alter and maintain any roads, railways, tramways, sidings, bridges, reservoirs, shops, stores, factories, buildings, works, plant and machinery necessary or convenient for the Company's business, and to contribute to or subsidise the erection, construction and maintenance of any of the above.

## Articles of Association

OF

ATLANTIC AND OCEANIC RESOURCES LIMITED

- 1. Subject as hereinafter provided, the regulations contained or incorporated in Part II of Table A in the First Schedule to the Companies Act, 1948 (hereinafter referred to as "Part II of Table A"), shall apply to the Company.
- 2. Regulations 24, 53, 75, 77 and 88 of Part I of Table A aforesaid (hereinafter referred to as "Part I of Table A") and regulation 5 of Part II of Table A shall not apply to the Company, but the Articles hereinafter contained together with the remaining regulations of Part I of Table A and regulations 2, 3 and 4 of Part II of Table A, subject to the modifications hereinafter expressed, shall constitute the regulations of the Company.
- 3. The shares shall be at the disposal of the Directors, who may allot, grant options over or otherwise dispose of them to such persons at such times and on such conditions as they think proper, subject to the provisions of the next following Article and to regulation 2 of Part II of Table A, and provided that no shares shall be issued at a discount, except as provided by Section 57 of the Act.
- 4. The Company in General Meeting may direct that any original shares for the time being unissued and any new shares from time to time to be created shall, before they are issued, be offered to the members or to any class of members. If any such direction is given, such offer shall be made by notice specifying the number of shares offered, and limiting a time within which the offer, if not accepted, will be deemed to be declined, and after the expiration of such time, or on the receipt of an intimation from the person to whom the offer is made that he declines to accept the shares offered, the Directors may, subject to these Articles, dispose of the same in such

manner as they think most beneficial to the Company and the Directors may, in like manner, dispose of any such new or original shares as aforesaid, which, by reason of the proportion borne by them to the number of persons entitled to any such offer as aforesaid or by reason of any other difficulty in apportioning the same, cannot in the opinion of the Directors be conveniently offered in manner hereinbefore provided.

- 5. In regulation 11 of Part I of Table A the words "(not being a fully paid share)" and "(other than fully paid shares)" shall be omitted.
- 6. The instrument of transfer of a fully paid share need not be executed by or on behalf of the transferee and regulation 22 of Part I of Table A shall be modified accordingly.
- 7. The proviso to regulation 32 of Part I of Table A shall be omitted.
- 8. Unless and until otherwise determined by the Company in General Meeting, the number of the Directors shall not be less than two nor more than five. The following shall be the first Directors of the Company, that is to say -

Herewith repetition requested begins: - Addressed Governor Falkland Islands telegram No. 255 of 14th November repeated saving to Buenos Aires. Your saving despatch No. 101

Oil Exploration.

Area applied for by Grynberga appears outside Falkland Islands Continental Shelf Order in Councid 1950. We are advised that you have no power to grant an oil exploration licence in this area. Your powers are defined by Mining Ordinance Cap 48 section 3 which refers to "Continental Shelf of Colony". As far as municipal laws of Falkland Islands are concerned Continental Shelf of Colony must be interpreted in accordance with Falkland Islands (Continental Shelf) Order in Council 1950, the Geneva Convention on Continental Shelf is not part of municipal law implied in Falkland Islands.

- 2. UK recognizes that Order in Council is erroneous in that it purports to claim sovereignty over Continental Shelf but decision was taken after UK acceded to Continental Shelf Conventions not to revoke it and so long as it remains unrevoked it is not thought possible to interpret the Continental Shelf in local legislation in any manner inconstant with Order in Council nor to amend definition in mining laws to accord with international law.
- 3. This does not alter international position between UK and Falkland Islands. As against Argentina we would probably continue to assert that whole of area applied for by Gryhbergs is within Falkland Islands Continental Shelf because it is on Falkland Islands side of Median line and is less than 100 fathoms deep. We base our international (....) in this enlargement on convention.
- 4. We are considering whether Falkland Islands Order in Council should be revoked and replaced by another extending shelf and should be grateful for your comment. In the meantime it is suggested that you inform Grynbergs that you cannot grant a licence for area applied for because of legal difficulties and that matter is under consideration. Ends.

In the first application we were able to get only a small scale map which resulted in certain plinimetric errors. We have just received a large scale map of the area which we designated Area I and have recalculated the area under application, as well as made precise measurements in accordance with the 1958 Geneva Convention to establish the median points along which a proper median line has been drawn. Accordingly, we have amended the original application, prepared a new set of maps and have established that the new area covers 30,744 square miles. Thus, our check should have been in the amount of \$9,223. U plus \$60.00 filing fee plus \$10.00 exchange charge. Therefore, on the filing for Area I, we are due a credit of \$2,025.50. Enclosed is also an application on offshore Falkland Islands covering Area II, which consists of 18,850.50 square miles. #### Exploration Program:

- 1. An aerial magnetometer survey of the licensed area.
- 2. The initial seismic lines will be surveyed on the sea on a tenmile reconnaissance grid pattern followed up with a five-mile infill grid pattern. The areas of special interest would be further detailed by seismograph. Advanced methods in seismic exploration would be used that vastly increase the effectiveness of this system in finding productive structures. The latest seismic techniques consisting of C.D.P. 

#### Exploration Program:

- 1. An aerial magnetometer survey of the licensed area.
- 2. The initial seismic lines will be surveyed on the sea on a tenmile reconnaissance grid pattern followed up with a five-mile infill grid pattern. The areas of special interest would be further detailed by seismograph. Advanced methods in seismic exploration would be used that vastly increase the effectiveness of this system in finding productive structures. The latest seismic techniques consisting of a C.D.P. (common depth point digital computer process) seismic survey will be used. An international geophysical company will be contracted to perform seismic surveys in the licensed area.

The most prospective seismic structure would be selected and a well drilled upon issuance of an oil prospecting permit.

## Schedule 7

Oceanic Exploration Corporation and its subsidiaries are engaged in the following exploration projects for petroleum, aside from their activities in the exploration for other minerals:

A. In partnership with a number of American and Dutch companies, the company is the holder of Block K-9 in the Netherlands part of the North Sea. Exploration work is presently being undertaken.

- B. This company was granted, during May, 1968, two exploration permits on the continental shelf of Ghana.
- C. In association with the Italian company, AGIP Mineraria, we hold an exploration permit on the continental shelf of Madagascar and expect a permit to issue shortly on a second such area.
- p. A petroluum exploration permit for offshore northwest Sabah, Malaysia, is approved.
- E. The Company is presently participating in an exploration license in Israel. Drilling is presently being undertaken.
- F. The Company presently holds exploration licenses covering uranium and other radioactive minerals in the Republic of Nigeria. Exploration is about to commence.
- G. The Company has other application for exploration permits and leases throughout the world, in different stages of development.



At the present time the United Nations are contemplating the extension of the continental shelf beyond the 100 fathom limit. If such an extension is passed by the United Nations then the 1958 Geneva Convention is automatically extended to beyond the 100 fathom line. Accordingly almost 80 per cent of the Burdwood Bank would be part of the Falkland Islands continental shelf and therefore would be under its jurisdiction. Accordingly we are taking the liberty of submitting for your consideration an application for 9,385 square miles of the Burdwood Bank which might fall under the Falkland Islands' jurisdiction. We are not attaching a check to cover the consideration in accordance with the Falkland Islands' law, but will do so if and when we receive a telegram and instructions from you to wire the payment to you. This payment would be \$2,815.50 plus \$60.00 for an application fee plus \$10.00 exchange charge, for a total of \$2,885.50. Thank you very much for your consideration.

#### Exploration Program:

- 1. An aerial magnetometer survey of the licensed area.
- 2. The initial seismic lines will be surveyed on the sea on a tenmile reconnaissance grid pattern followed up with a five-mile infill grid pattern. The areas of special interest would be further detailed by seismograph. 

# Don't play giveaway with ocean resources

THE CAMPAIGN waged both in this country and abroad to restrict the Continental Shelf and turn over control of deep-ocean development to an international body with licensing powers luckily has been stalled.

What happened is almost prophetic. A United Nations special committee couldn't agree on the basics of governing ocean exploration and now favors further special UN study of the matter.

Just as important, though, influential voices in this country have sounded warnings. The American Branch of the International Law Association, the American Bar Association, and the National Petroleum Council all have cautioned national leaders to move carefully to protect this nation's best interests.

The NPC report was requested by the Interior Department and presumably will influence the President, who earlier favored a UN approach.

Now, before the "giveaway crowd" can regroup, this country should immediately reaffirm its exclusive jurisdiction over all the natural resources of its Outer Continental Shelf clear to the deep ocean.

Backed with this policy, American delegates then can be sent to any conference called to amend the Geneva Convention on the Continental Shelf clearly instructed to do two things:

- Work for the broadest possible concept in redefining the extent of the Continental Shelf.
- Oppose control of the deep ocean by some international agency such as the United Nations. Instead, push for the historic principle of right of the discovering nation to appropriate submerged lands with its laws prevailing.

THESE MOVES should protect America's interests until more is learned about potential of resources buried in the ocean floor and better plans emerge to develop them. It's blind folly for this nation at this stage to renounce possible marine resources and hand them over to a UN bureau under the delusion this would benefit mankind.

In the first place, the UN has yet to show any ability to rule or administer—its function is to debate, study, and mediate. The red tape these people could dream up would delay effective exploration forever.

Also, there is only a handful of big nations with the financial resources, the marine experience, and general technology capable of undertaking deep-ocean exploration. All of them already have military or strategic interests underseas. Why should they ask permission to explore there? Why then submit to taxes, royalties, or restrictions on use of resources found there? More effective ways are available to help the developing nations if that is the object.

The best course: Don't give away any rights; support exploration; and if big discoveries follow, shape the rules to fit the situation existing then.

As mentioned on the telephone today, the correspondence on this file requires some attention and I suggest that for the July meeting of Ex.Co. it might be helpful if a statement of the position were to be recorded for information.

Folio (1) is purely introductory and indicates that the company are interested (a) in areas adjacent to the Falkland Islands and (b) the Burdwood Bank, which lies well to the south of the Islands.

The first firm application is at folio (7) dated 19th August 1968 and is for an area north-west of the Falkland Islands and extending to the median line between Argentina and the Falkland Islands. This area has subsequently become known as Area I. This application was acknowledged at folio (8). The company sent 11,388 dollars (approximately £4,762) to cover the fee.

At folio (15) is an FCO comment regarding the complex international position ending with the suggestion that we should not grant a licence for the area applied for, i.e. Area I, because of legal difficulties and that the matter is under consideration.

At folio (17) is an application dated 22nd November for an Oil Exploration Licence covering Area II, which extends right across the north of the Falkland Islands and down both the western and eastern sides of the group. This application does not appear to have been acknowledged. With this application came a cheque for 3,699 dollars (approximately £1,510) but the financial transactions are slightly complicated for reasons explained in the first half of folio (17).

At folio (18) is yet another application, this time in respect of about 80% of the Burdwood Bank. No money was sent with this application but the company are ready to wire the payment for their application if it is granted.

The application in respect of the Burdwood Bank is acknowledged at folio (21).

Folio (26) sets out the FCO view which seems to amount to the possibility of H.M.G. revoking The Falkland Islands Continental Shelf Order in Council (volume 2 of the Laws, page 24) and having another Order in Council made extending the continental shelf to the area that could be claimed under the Continental Shelf Convention. I have not delved into this but it is clear that the area to which the FCO refers is Area I.

FCO go on to in folio (26) to suggest that we tell Grynbergs that the area applied for is part of the Falkland Islands continental shelf but because of an incomplete definition of my powers prior to U.K. accession to the Genera Convention on the continental shelf I can not, at present, issue a licence although extension of my administrative powers is now being studied by H.M.G. FCO ended by agreeing that we should return the deposit, i.e. in respect of Area I.

Being unaware of the application for Area II, I asked acting CS to return the money on deposit to Grynbergs and said that in doing so he should use the precise wording in paragraph 2 of folio (26). This has been done but please note that the letter has not left the Falkland Islands post office outward bound. It will be necessary to retrieve it for reasons which appear in themext paragraph.

Folio (29) shows that FCO were unaware of Grynbergs application for Area II. The FCO advice, with which I agree, is that Area II lies within the Falkland Islands continental shelf as defined by Order in Council. There is, therefore, no need at this stage to return that between money which applies to Area II and it will be necessary for someone in the Secretariat or the Treasury to work out from folio (17) what proportion of the money deposited with us refers to Area II. There is, therefore, no need at this stage to return that part of Grynbergs

A letter should be sent to Grynbergs on the lines of folio (28) but making it clear that reference is only to Area I and arranging for a refund of the fee deposited in respect of Area I.

Other action required would seem to be a telegram in cypher to FCO on the following lines:

"Your telegram 69. Confidential. Oil Exploration. Application for Area II with appropriate deposit recevied here 29th January but no action yet taken. I agree area appears to lie within Falkland Islands continental shelf as defined by Order in Council and in circumstances it appears Falkland Islands Government has right to grant licence to Grynbergs.

"On 29th January application without deposit was also received from Grynbergs for Burdwood Bank. This was acknowledged but no action taken. Meanwhile am taking action in respect of Area I on lines indicated in your Letter to you leaving here 30th May." telegram 59.

With reference to your letters of August 19th, November 22nd and November 25th, 1968, applying respectively for oil exploration licences in Areas I, II and Nurdwood Bank and depositing respectively therefor sums of \$11,388.70, \$3,699.65 (arrived at after a credit of \$2,025.50 due to you subsequent to a reassessment of the precise dimensions of Area I), and AIL, I have to say that

- (i) the area which you have designated as Area I is part of the Falkland Islands continental shelf but because of an incomplete definition of the Governor's powers prior to the United Kingdom soccession to the Geneva Convention on the continental shelf it is not possible at present to issue a licence; however, an extension of the Governor's administrative powers to this effect is now under study;
- (ii) in the circumstances outlined in sub-paragraph (i) above the fee you deposited with your application is being returned, in an amount of \$3,925 lbs. 10d, through the medium of the Grown Agents for Oversea Governments and Administrations, 4 Willbank, London, S.W.1.
- (iii) the applications relating to Area II and the Burdwood Bank are under study and a further communication someoning them will be sent to you in due course.

# Oil Exploration Licences: Atlantic & Oceanic Resources Ltd. (U.K. subsidiary of J. Grynberg & Associates, Denver, Colorado)

Please refer to your telegram No. 69 of the 21st of May about an application for an Oil Exploration Licence for Area II from Grynberg's - an area which appears to lie within the Falkland Islands Continental Shelf as defined by Order in Council and embracing the north, east and west of the Islands.

It is our view that as the area in question lies without doubt within the Falkland Islands Continental Shelf a licence should be granted to Grynbergs. (We hold their deposit in respect of this application). It is the intention to seek local advice on this view at an Executive Council Meeting which will be held on or about the 14th of July and it would therefore be of great assistance if it could be arranged for us to receive, some reasonable time in advance of that date, your advice on the international political implications of a decision to grant Grynberg's a licence for the area in question.

Two other applications from Grynberg's for Oil Exploration Licences in respect of Area I and of some 80% of the Burdwood Bank are still under consideration here. As considerations relating to them need more careful study than it has hitherto been possible to give, and because of the necessity to give careful consideration also to our comments upon the proposal regarding alterations in the legislation relating to the limits of the Falkland Islands Continental Shelf (referred to briefly in your telegrams No. 256 of the 20th of November, 1968, and No. 59 of the 28th of April, 1969, as well as in our telegram No. 259 of the lith of December, 1968; but so briefly as to necessitate a second look at the matter in greater depth), it is our intention to embody our views on these matters in a subsequent letter, aiming to get it off to you by the next (June, ex-Stanley) sailing of the "Darwin".

Meanwhile your advice on the matter raised at the end of my paragraph 2 will be appreciated.

Addressed Buenos Aires telegram number 169 of 24th June repeated Governor Falkland Islands.

Falkland Islands. Oil and continental shelf.

Atkinson's letter HGF 16/1 of 13th November to Claxfield and latter's reply of 29th November 4/3 (18) (not copied to Governor). Grynbergs have now lodged a total of three applications. One of the two new ones, like the original, is outside the area defined by the existing Order in Council, but within the area which could be claimed in accordance with the Geneva convention. Third is in the Order in Council area.

- 2. In The Governor will be consulting his Council about the third application of 14th July, and has asked for advice on the political implications of granting a licence. (We await further comments from him on the two applications which would involve extension).
- 3. While the immediate problem is the third application, we should be grateful if your assessment would cover the question of extending the continental shelf as well. And also the question of timing. Is one moment likely to be worse than another?
- 4. Problem has not yet been submitted to Ministers. At official level we believe it would be very difficult indeed for domestic political reasons to veto any of these applications if the islanders decided that they are to their advantage. The question is not of purely hypothetical commercial interest, even if cil is found. Grynbergs have put down substantial financial deposits. (Criginal one had to be returned pending decision on the question of extension). However, one of the factors which would presumably weigh in the islanders' minds would be your estimate of Argentine reactions.
- 5. If oil operation goes ahead, would you anticipate stronger Argentine reaction on possible enlargement of fishery limits ----- estimate contained in Summerhayes' letter of 23rd May to Sugg?
- 6. Grateful early reply.

(c) be admitted into the United Kingdom or the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics respectively, for the purpose of joining a vessel as a member of the crew provided that he is in possession of a visa and a written declaration from the shipping company or its agents that he is to join a specified vessel at a specified port.

### ARTICLE 14

- (1) The High Contracting Parties reserve the right to deny entry to their respective territories to any holder of a recognised seaman's identity document whom they consider undesirable.
- (2) Each High Contracting Party binds itself to re-admit to its territory any holder of a valid British Seaman's Card on the one hand and any holder of a valid U.S.S.R. Seamen's Passport on the other hand who has entered the territory of the other High Contracting Party by virtue of this Treaty.
- (3) Except as provided in Article 13 a holder of a seaman's identity document referred to in Article 12 shall be subject to the conditions and regulations governing the entry, stay and departure of foreign nationals in force in the territories of the High Contracting Parties.

#### ARTICLE 15

- (1) Each High Contracting Party shall, so far as practicable, grant treatment similar to that provided for in Article 13 to any member of the crew of a vessel of the other High Contracting Party (not being a national of either High Contracting Party) who holds a seaman's identity document issued by the competent authority of the State concerned and conforming with the provisions of the Convention on Facilitation of International Maritime Traffic, signed at London on 9th April, 1965, provided that such document guarantees the re-admission of the bearer to the country which issued the document.
- (2) The provisions of paragraphs (1) and (3) of Article 14 shall apply in relation to any seaman to whom paragraph (1) of this Article applies.

#### ARTICLE 16

(1) The judicial authorities of one High Contracting Party shall not entertain any civil proceedings arising out of a claim of the master or a member of the crew of a vessel of the other High Contracting Party relating

My view regarding an extension of continental shelf to median line remains as stated in Mansfield's letter of 29th November and as to timing this would be a particularly bad moment with London negotiations regarding the Falkland Islands still pending and a new Argentine Foreign Minister in office whose attitude towards the dispute generally is still undetermined. In the circumstances it would be most unfortunate if we were to give any opening to those who would be inclined to urge a more active policy on him: a change in the Falkland Islands continental shelf law could well provide such a pretext. As regards the third application I see much less reason to withhold a licence although this still might provoke some Argentine reaction.

2. On your paragraph 5 the Argentines would obviously take an extension of the continental shelf at the same time as that of fishing limits as evidence of some new consorted policy but our estimate is still that an enlargement of fishing limits alone will not cause serious concern.
