

Grand Valley Oil Ltd. hereby makes application for an Exclusive Oil Exploration Licence covering 15,322 square miles of area in the territorial waters of the Falkland Islands.

Grand Valley Oil Ltd., a Canadian company, is an agressive, experienced oil company with the technical knowledge and financial ability to manage a marine exploration program.

We have contacts with other oil companies who have marketing outlets and who are interested in offshore exploration. We would plan to invite other interested oil companies to join us to form a consortium for the exploration and development of an offshore exploration licence.

We are aware that another company is interested in acquiring additional acreage on the Falkland Islands continental shelf. - An airborne magnetic survey of the licenced area is planned to determine the location and approximate thickness of the sedimentary section.
