
2. I am to add, however, that payments are still made for Turkey and Carrancho beaks at the rate of 4d. and 6d. per beak respectively.

3. The beaks should be forwarded to the Inspector of Stock or to any Justice of the Peace on the West Falkland for destruction. In the latter case it will be necessary to furnish a certificate from the Justice of the Peace to the effect that the beaks have been destroyed by fire in his presence.
