The shortest time of transit would be
7 to 8 weeks when the eggs would be bad.
They would also arrive in their very cold winter.

import pairs of birds. These might be

Sir,

I have received a letter from Dr H.A. Baker, D.Sc, etc, of the Department of Agriculture and Mines in Newfoundland, in which he states that he is anxious to try the experiment of introducing the Falkland Islands Upland Goose into Newfoundland.


His idea is that he might be sent a consignment of three or four dozen eggs and endeavour to get them hatched out on arrival and set the birds free.

I regret that I am not in a position to suggest whether this idea is feasible or not, but if you would care to secure the opinion of the Government Naturalist here I can arrange to give him all the relevant information contained in Dr Baker's letter.




