With reference to our conversation I send for your information a copy of a letter to Mr. Graeber. The Governor has power to grant a licence under Section 5 of Cap 77. There appears to be however no law by which I can prevent anyone taking upland geese, king shag or rock shag. Nor is there any law to prevent anyone taking teal in season. I did not therefore consider that we would be justified in imposing a fee for upland geese, shag or teal. With regard to elephant seal I find that on 7.12.50 we informed the Administrative Officer South Georgia that the licence fee is now £5 this seems a reasonable amount. For the other birds I have charged the same rate which we have previously charged for penguins £4.

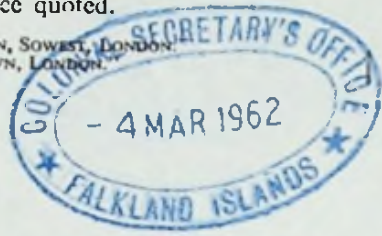

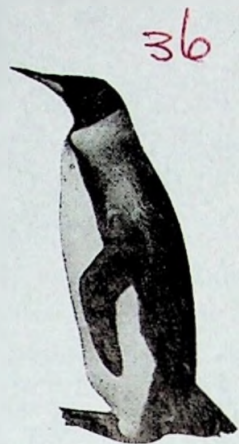

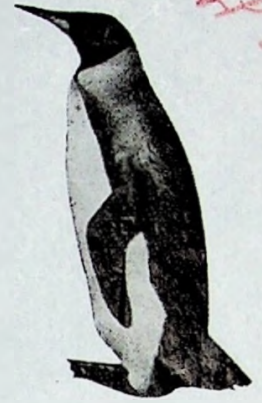

MEMORANDUM NO. 10/63 FOR EXECUTIVE COUNCIL

Collection of Birds and Animals for Zoos.

Several visits have been made to the Island by a Mr. Graber to collect birds and animals for zoos. He may make further visits. A request has also been received from Chipperfields Zoo, Southampton to make a visit to collect birds and animals. It has already been ruled that charges should be made when birds and animals are collected on a commercial basis, but hitherto the actual application of this principle has had to be worked out at short notice as cases occur, generally on the basis of what has been allowed before, and it seems desirable to work out a policy and to prescribe fees. Memo. No. 44/62 of the 22nd November, 1962 deals with the question of protection of birds. Seals are also protected by law. In the case of birds and animals which are not protected by any existing law there appears to be no legal sanction for controlling their capture or prescribing conditions under which they can be captured and therefore when they are included in an application to capture birds and animals their capture has been allowed free of charge. The same principle has been adopted with applications to capture game birds, such as duck, in the open season. It is suggested that it is not necessary to make any law to alter this situation. With regard to controlled birds and animals applications have been allowed on payment of the following amounts:-

- Seals (not including Leopard Seals which are not protected) £5 each. *
- Geese (excluding Upland Geese which are not protected) £4 each.
- Ducks in season and Logger Ducks £4 each.
- Penguins (Gentoo, Rock Hopper, and Jackass) £4 each.

The taking of King Penguins in South Georgia has been allowed for a fee of £10 a piece. The figures have been chosen comparatively arbitrarily and Council may wish to alter them. It is suggested that no permits be allowed to capture any other kind of penguin in the Falklands other than the three mentioned. If the proposal in the Memo. No. 44/62 with regard to reserves is approved no capture of birds or animals would of course be allowed in any of those reserves. It has also been suggested that no permits should be issued within ten miles of Stanley and that if permits are to be issued they should be issued subject to the consent of the manager of the land concerned.

* The capture of fur seals should not be allowed.







Thanks greatly to your help and advice we have been having a wonderful exhilarating time. The Cameron family and everyone else we have met have been more than kind.

We have, at least so far, hand-reared our Kelp goslings successfully and hope now to be able to get them home without trouble.

As for penguins we are not quite sure what to do. I have heard, since seeing you, of the ghastly losses the professional collectors have had "killing more Rockhoppers than they ever get to Stanley" and I have also heard from home that recent collectors have lost many Rockies on passage. As you know I didn't come here to kill penguins! But also I explained the desire to take some back to pay the cost such as air-freight of the geese and so on -

May we have permission not specifically to take a dozen Rockies, Gulls, and Jackass, but rather more fluidly to take not over 3 dozen of the

Species combined, but possibly <sup>2</sup> more than 12 of each? This would give us a chance to try with Rockhoppers here and release them if they showed any sign of not doing well. Yet we could then still manage to make up to what we feel we could handle with Gentoo and Tackass.

You thanked me for the Broadcast. I should have thanked you! It has been an ever-open introduction and I have soon learnt that here an introduction means an invitation.

We leave Stanley on 8<sup>th</sup> March on Darwin. How we get to Stanley we do not know yet, but looking forward to seeing you on our return.



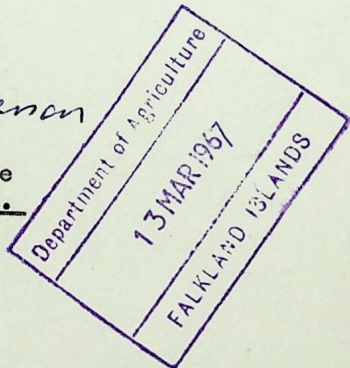

2. Mr R. Napier made a complaint to me

I have to refer to the situation which has arisen as a result of the damage to "Philomel". It is understood that the two elephant seal which you have taken under licence issued to you on the 25th of July have been placed loose in the hold of the "Philomel" and so are existing under conditions which it may be expected will become increasingly inhumane during the period which must elapse before these wild animals can be exported by the R.M.S. "Darwin" on the 14th of September.

2. The licence issued to you, which is both to take and to export sea elephants, expires on the 31st of August. In view of this and in the light of circumstances referred to in the preceding paragraph I suggest that your best course would be to release the two seal taken and for a fresh licence to be issued to you, valid until the date of sailing of R.M.S. "Darwin" on the 14th of September, to enable you to take fresh animals which will not be required to remain so long in confined captivity as would be the case with the animals which you have already taken.

3. The alternative would be for you to be able to assure me beyond doubt of your ability adequately to feed and care for under humane conditions the two animals that you have taken until the R.M.S. "Darwin" sails in the middle of next month; but under local circumstances it is difficult to see how you can confidently give me an assurance such as to enable me to agree to extension of the time limit of your export licence.

4. As the licence fee needs to be paid to the Treasury only before shipment and as you have therefore not yet paid the fee it would seem to be in the best interests of all concerned for you to adopt the procedure suggested in my paragraph 2.

## The Wild Animals and Birds Protection Ordinance, 1964

### REGULATIONS

(under section 16 of the Ordinance)

No. 2 of 1966.

In exercise of the powers conferred by section 16 of the Wild Animals and Birds Protection Ordinance, 1964, the Governor in Council has made the following Regulations —

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Wild Animals and Birds (Export) Regulations, 1966.

2. (1) No person without an export licence from the Governor shall export any wild animal or bird.

(2) The fees payable in respect of the exportation of wild animals and birds shall be as follows —
