## HYDROGRAPHIC DEPARTMENT ADMIRALTY, BATH.

16th January, 1945.

Sir.

In view of the frequent changes either of a permanent or temporary character, to which stendard times are now subject, it has been decided in the interests of the navigator to adopt G.M.T. as a universal time for all tidal predictions in Admiralty Tide Tables. The necessary changes will be introduced as follows:-

- All standard ports in Admiralty fide Tables, Part (a) I, Section A (Ruropean Waters) will be predicted in G.M.T. in the tables for 1944. A new edition of Admiralty Tide Tables, Part II for European waters will be issued at about the same time embodying the necessary changes.
- All standard ports in Admiralty Fide Tables, Part (b) I. Section B (The World excluding European Waters) will be predicted in G.M.T. in the tables for 1946. A new edition of Admiralty Fide Tables, Part II · will be issued at about the same time embodying the necessary changes.
