



Doar Colonel,

Since my last letter of the 30th October, good progress has been made.

Tellurometer Party Training. Evans, the five F.I.D.S. and myself are now proficient in operating and booking and I am quite pleased at the way that things are going.

On the 27th we measured the sides SAPPERS HILL-Falkland Islands. ROUND MOUNTAIN and SALVADOR HILL- ROUND COUNTAIN by reciprocal measurements. Transport was from Stanley racecourse by helicopter.
The first party was lifted from the racecourse at 08.15 and all

measurements were completed and personnel back in Stanley by 15.00

on the same day.

There was a very large swing on the line ROUND MT .- SAPPERS HILL. however, the means of the two measurements (using a different remote for each measurement) are in close agreement. The computations are being done at the moment and will be sent on the next mail.

This is more or less a practise run in field conditions though no doubt the results will be of use as a check base (the computers

said they would like a side length here if possible).

On Tuesday, 2nd December, we go aboard M.M.S. Protector and will measure the Lafonia triangle on the 3rd and, I hope, tie in Sea Lion Islands and Beauchene Island by linear measurements immediately after.

Falkland Islands Admin. The horses and equipment are now on West Falkland ready for Evans to commence there as soon as the falkland tellurometer measurements are completed.

South Shetlands-Grahams Land Connection. The Protector arrived Stanley on Saturday, 11th Movember and sailed on Sunday morning to pick up a F.I.D.S. who is seriously ill. I was asked by Captain Butler early on Saturday evening if I would like to go south on this voyage to get a quick recee done of the South job and decided to go. The ice situation is very had this year and the Protector could not get within helicopter range of the base where the sick man is, or near the survey area. Pack formed a continuous barrier in a great are at an average distance of fifty The Protector arrived in continuous barrier in a great are at an average distance of fifty

miles N.E. of the Grahams Land and the South Shetlands. The Shackleton has however managed to reach Hope Bay from the W.W.

I got back to Stanley on the 24th November. I took all data on the South Shetlands Connection with me and got a few alternatives worked out. Captain Butler told me that he was not prepared to wait for long periods ofor visibility for theodolite angles and I have worked out a compromise scheme, mainly trilateration. I have told Captain Butler that we may have to fall back on the original traverse if this does not go through. I enclose a copy of the

new scheme.

You will note that the only angles to be measured are at Mt.
Mirkwood on Deception Is. which is easly accessible from the base.
This can be measured by a land party independent of Protector co-operation if it is necessary to wait for visibility. (The party could be collected by Shackleton or Biscog which I have arranged with John Green, if necessary.) There are several trilateration methods, I have shown the most probable in heavy lines.

Protector goes to South Georgia for approximately a week after the Falkland Islands bases are completed, so the earliest date we will go south will be the middle of December. With the late break-up of the ice this year, it might well be January.

Tellurometers. I am having trouble with one of the remotes. At short ranges the circle diameter on the master is much too small with the circle amplitude at maximum. How to rectify this is not shown in the fault-finding instructions. If there is a simple adjustment that can be made I would be most obliged if the information could be wired.

General. I have been vefy busy since I have been back in the Falklands and have had to leave quite a bit of paperwork until a later date. I am taking every advantage of weather to get the party out on field training. Poart from tellurometer operation all members of the party know how to use altimeters and helios and the asst. surveyors have been getting in some theodolite practise.

Equipment. There were no ice axes, crampons or snow shovels included in the F.I.D.S. stores and they have none in Stanley. I have been able to borrow these from the Protector's Royal Marine unit.



All tellurometer and theodilite observations to date have been sent to Records.

Programm ing for helicopter transportation is rather interesting, the object being to have the least number of flights over the shortest distances, es that there are no long delays between parties finishing a measurement and being transported to the next point, the vriable factors being the ship's course during a operation, whether one or two helicopters available, the distances and weights involved.

The fact that all members of the party can both observe and book helps out considerably in the last factor, as the tripods, power packs etc. stay at a point when it is a matter of changing instruments over. I include detailed programmes for

information.

Falkland Islands, Future Programe. Evans goes over to West Falkland today. He is booked province mally to go on leave on the 28th. May (there is no north bound ship from then until the first week in July). In the likely event of there still being a considerable amount of work left by the time, I would be most obliged if you would consider letting Evens return to the Falkla for a short tour, to see the job through. The fact is that it takes so long to get used to the rather unusual working conditions here that a replacement surveyor would be offing like as useful, hen I say this I -- an thinking in terms of knowing the farmers and whom to approach for any assistance necessary. Also the fact that over the winter months while I was on leave Evans made a very good job of collecting placenames and other information, and to in fact has a better picture of this side of the work than myself.

Evans would like to spend the first three weeks of his leave baving a look at J. America and the lest Indies, arriving in U.H. about the end of June, if this is permissable.

The Colonial Secretary has asked me to check the boundaries of a piece of land(Greenshields Bros.on the east of Salvador Sound) which has just changed hands. It will take about four days. I have said I will do it subject to your extense of the yo confirmation.

That is all for the moment, I hope that by the next mail I will have at least something definite to report about the S.Shetlands-Grahamland connection. Thank you for your telegram concerning this work. If in the unlikely event of H.M.S. Protector being available after the end of January, and the work is not completed, I should imagine the Governor would want me to carry on, as he is very interested in this particular job.

Deur Colonel,

Since I last wrote from Port Stephens, I have managed to get some work done, though it is slow going at this time of year. I enclose a work diary for the last two months, also a diagram.

All stations in the Fall ends have now been beaconed, apart from the Jason Islands, and a few intended resections.

During the last month I have completed obsevations at the three primary stations, it. Weddell, Precipice Mill, and Doubles Pt. Mill, and also tied in the five inor stations wold Ft. Mill, South Mill, Rabbit Mill, Prench Mo. Mill and Double Feat.

the local residents, as ever, have been most helpful, laying on horses, beats and motor transport as required, besides accomplation.

The next points to be observed are Stanhope Hill and Second Passage, after which I will carry on to West Point Is. Careass, Saunders and the other northern islands. I doubt if will get all these island trips, observed by the time I were arrives back, but with any luck we should finish them before the shear ng season starts, when the fames will be unable to devote much time to moving us around.

After completing the islands we can the finish off the observing on the West Falkland, Evans probably covering the northern half, syself the southern.

At the Western and of the triangulation, have provisionally chosen the W. Weddell-Loop Pt. Will sidelength for an azimuth, both points be ng r asomably accessible.

I hope that everything on the West Falkland and adjaces islands will be completed by the end of the year.

Evans has entioned the difficulties involved in getting to these. If Protectors' helicopters could be laid on, that would certainly be the quickest way of fixing these islands.

er sidelength at the moment. It is difficult to get to by any ethod, so unless the helicaters can again be made available, a bearing from Sea Lion ain will be the best that can be cone.

There are quite a few ends to tie up after the planimetric and height control is completed, checking fence lines, Government Reserves, and place ages.

I am pretty certain we will finish by May 1960, all going well, keeping in mind that it may be necessary for Evans or myself to go South for a few weeks.

I was asked by one of the FIDS in Stanley, over the R.T. whether I approved of the plans for this year, but as I had no diagram of the area, and as been he had only a general idea of what was required, I could not enlighten him, and parely ed him to contact Tolworth.

I think that is all for the moment,



From time to time maps produced by this Directorate and sent in bulk for use by the local Government, become known to the general public locally and a demand for their sale may be made.

There is no objection to such sales, but if you contemplate making any, care should be taken beforehand to ensure that sufficient copies are retained for the use of the local Government (including Departments other than your own); these copies which are printed free, should be marked "Official Use Only" and not sold to the public, since this Directorate's maps normally have a selling price printed on them. When it is proposed to place on sale to the public maps which do not have a selling price printed upon them, each copy should be priced and stamped "For sale, price".

A careful record should be kept of all such sales of maps produced by this Directorate. Since all copies of these sheets have been given without charge to your Department for the use of the local Government, the money received from such sales should be returned to this Directorate, less a reasonable percentage for the cost of reco ding sales. A percentage of 20 c is regarded as reasonable, and this money becomes part of the revenue of the local Government, in the same way as the money returned by you goes in H.M. Government funds. There is no objection to such receipts being paid quarterly or half yearly, through the Crown Agents for Oversea Governments and Administrations, made payable to the Paymaster General. Details of sales should be sent direct to the Establishment and Finance Officer, Directorate of Overseas Surveys, at the same time as the Crown Acents are asked to make payment. Requirements for further supplies of maps to meet such sales should be made to the Records Officer of the Supplies of maps of other territories produced and Directorate. printed by this Directorate should be purchased direct from Messrs. E. Stanford Limited, 12-14, Long Acre, London, W.C.2.

Dear Colonel,

Thank you for your letter of the 7th.October.

Since my last rather hurried note from Saunders Island. in which I think I mentioned that observations had been completed at the three points on that island, I have also completed at Mt. Repoel (S33) and First Mt(P 15) on Pebble Island.

I flew in to Stanley from Pebble on the 28th. to do the accounts, make arrangements for Evans arrival, etc. I should finish on Pebble within a few days of getting back there, and he will then shift to Port Howard.

I have arranged to shift some of the horses back to the East Falkland, from Fox Bay, on the 15th. of next month, and will get the required re-observations done as soon as possible.

Evans can go straight to Port Howard on arrival. oweing to shipping arrangements I will not be able to meet him in Stanley. When I finish on the East I can re-join him to finish off the observations on the West Falkland. It will not be necessary to ship any horses back to the West.

All this will probably takke to the end of the weer January.

The stations on West Point and Carcass Islands have still to be observed, I could not do these on the last circuit as the owners had put themselves in quarantine for the winter months to avoid colds and a' flu epidemic. One of the advantages of living on an island.

However as the trigs. on these islands are the points from which the Jasons will be tied in that area can be done as a whole. I am please to hear that Protector will be able to help out with these islands, I will have a scheme and flight programme made out for their arrival. If I bee use the F.I.D.S. tellurometers We it should only take and a few days to measure to and identify the necessary points, afterwards taking bearings from West Point/Carcass I have in fact intersected prominent features on outlying islands and rocks (the Jasons from New Island and 2nd. Passage Island to date.

I do not anticipate any great difficulty in finishing the survey by May, but will give priority to the mainland and the astro. observations, as your instructions.

Transport. All the horses are in good shape, the three left at Hill Cove were put on a tussock island for the winter. the other ten at Port Howard had a plentiful supply of oats and hay. Concerning the disposal of the six D.O.S. horses on completion of



the survey, one will have to be given to the Agric. Dept. in place of the one lost at Fox Bay a few months ago. As we have been using the Agric. Dept. horses for the last two years any other that they require could be handed over.

It is not worth while incurring the extra cost of shipping any back to Stanley. The two forms that have wintered the horses would like to buy them.

The Land Rover spares have arrived, and the D.P.W. has agreed to send a mechanic out to Port Howard to do the necessary repairs.

I have just received your letter of the 10th June, with attached duplicate of the air letter form of the same date which I received over three months ago at Port Stephens. It had been delivered to the caretaker of the building in which my office is, who had kept it awaiting my arrival in Stanley.

I am pleased to know that the originals the Bransfield work finally arrived. I hope that results were satisfactory, despite the rush in which it was done.

It is interesting to hear of recent tellurometer development thank youfor the copy of the American Tellurometer Manual.

I was sent a copy of 'Tellurometer Measurements in Morway' by S.Bakkelid, whom I met at C.T.&S last year.

I will get all completed field books in the post awa for the next outgoing mail, I could not manage it for this one, the mail closing today.

Thank you for your letters of the 14th. December and 9th. November, both of which arrived via the Kista Dan" three days ago. I englished at the Post Office concerning the late arrival of the latter, and it seems that one bag which should have been picked up by Protector at Punta Arenas went astray, and was held up in Buenos Aires for several weeks before being returned to Montevideo.

This is rather unfortunate as I have completed the re-observations as your letter of the 9th. April. The sidelenths P 28-P 23 and P 28-P 28 being measured by tellurometer as an additional check.

Evans observed P 5, Mt. Sulivan with a broken horizontal plate bubble, levelling on the vertical bubble, which must have been out of adjustment. It is intended to re-bserve the whole station. Evans must have forgot to mention this when he was at Tolworth, as the large misclosures were found before he went on leave.

Progress Report.

The first part of December was spent in training three Fids. surveyors on tellurometers, also assembling the stores required for the tellurometer party, and working out various methods how the work could be carried out. H. M.S. Protector helped out by flying me to the points for re-observation, the tellurometer measurements giving the Fids surveyors some field experience.

On the arrival of the four surveyors from the South to complete the tellurometer party, I had a short refresher course for them, the whole party and myself then embarking on M.M.S. Protector on the 28th, and Evans and labourer picked up at Hill Cove, en route to the Jasons.

Due to bad weather, persistant cloud on all the sum its for the two days the ship was in the area, the scheme was not a complete success, however, I hope there is just enough control to fix the islands, at the worst it will only mean re-visiting one island to take additional bearings.

Ivans and labourer were dropped off at Carcass island, I should have been dropped off at West Point, but due to the island been clouded up I had to get off at New Island on the Blat, where I had a week's wait for the plane back to stanley.

The sidelengths between P16 & P14 and the South Jason were measured by tellurometer, which should do for the check base

I was rathersurprised to hear of the poor closure between the Lafonia Main base and the Stanley sidelengths. I am not at all happy about these Stanley sidelengths (the first tellurometer measurements done last year) as after doing further measurements in the area, from Sapper's-Mt. Low and Mt. Low-Salvador Mill, the fact that the fine readings show a steady linear increase with carrier over the whole cavity range frequency in crease is very noticeable, presumably due to unsuitable terrain. As only a limited range was used last year, reciprocal readings and adjacent lines over similar terrain would be consisten within themselves, but there is a possibility that they are not the true distances.

As I have not got the duplicates of these original observata--ions, or the abstracts for the East points to be re-observed, all of which were destroyed in the Secretariat fire, I cannot do any field checks here.

Puture Programme. Evans will carry on with the West Falkland observing, all island points now having been completed, and I will get on with the further re-observations on the East.

All field work completed to date is in this mail.

Evans spent Christmas with friends at Port Howard, where there was a house party for the West Falkland farmers. As I was busy with the Fids. work over Christmas I had rather a quiet time in Stanley, but managed to lose a little money at the race meeting.

Dear Mr. Wiggins,

Thank you for your telegram concerning the re-observations on the East Falkland, P38 and P36 were both observed from P28. I will try to get to Sea Lion Island in the next month, for the check observation there.

Evans mentioned several points that had come up at Tolworth, namely:-

- (a) Names on the Admiralty Charts. These can be considered correct unless they disagree with the amounted photographs.
- (b) Paddock(Camps) Names. These are widely used in describing particular areas, as shown on the diagram in this mail. *
- (c) The relative importance of settlements is obvious from their size. Two categories would be sufficient.
- (d) Rola- Interpretation of vegetation, for which there is numerous examples on the an otated photographs of the three main types,
 - (1) Grass, white and green, the former vastly predominent.
 - (2) Diddle-dec, rushes, fern and balsam bog, all of which show up much darker on the photos than 1.
 - (3) Tussock grass, mainly natural growth apart from a few plantations.

If 2 and 3 could be shown sybolically, this would increase the utility of the map series, as at the moment no farmer knows either the exact area of his land, or the amount of products—ive grazing land (1).

- (e) Sheet Mames, suggested as enclosed Sheet diagram.
- (f) Telephone lines. As these are not visible on the photographs, it means riding along every line and identifying third or fourth pole to make an exact job of the identification. An extra two months would be required for this, one surveyor only. I tried the Stanley Rincon Grande line last weekend, and had to give up as the line goes across country not fit for horses in places. However, given the time it is quite feasible.
- (g) Road classification. A few miles of metalled single track roa in the Stanley area.
 - (2)Semi-engineered tracks between settlement (3)Riding tracks, very vaguely defined both o the ground and photographs.



These are the main points.

I understand that this vehicle has now been returned to Government and would respectfully enquire if it could be made available to this Department.

At the moment the Department owns a 15 cwt Commer truck which we use generally for telephone maintenance and transport of traffic to and from the W/T Station. It is also used for transporting camp and outward overseas mails from the Post Office to F.I.C. Jetty, but all too frequently it is engaged on other work when required for this purpose and alternative last minute arrangements have to be made with P.W.D. This is not a satisfactory arrangement as P.W.D. also have their commitments and are not always able to produce transport 'out of the hat'.

We are responsible for the proper maintenance of the Lighthouse line and Camp lines to Pony's Pass and the Murrell and since the Commer truck has no four wheel drive facilities it is impossible to take the vehicle over soft camp and thus the North Camp line between the Naval W/T Station and the Murrell must be repaired solely on foot. The Lighthouse line in winter also presents a problem as indeed it did only a few days ago when it was found impossible to use the truck and repairs had to be delayed until the following day when the Survey Rover was borrowed to complete the task.

I suggest therefore that the Commer truck could be retained for postal requirements and the Rover used for carriage of W/T traffic and line mainten-Both vehicles could be housed in our present garage.

Dear Mr. Reid,

The Governor has passed on to me your letter of the 1st October, on the subject of the supply of peat to F. Smith. It is perhaps natural that your office has looked askance at a bill for supplying peat to one of our officers, but I think the matter would appear in a different light to them if the circumstances were fully explained.

Government never supplies peat free to anybody except the Governor and one other officer in whose case for a special reason the supply of free peat is part of his emoluments. There are a few others who are supplied by Government and have to pay full cost. As regards the rest they can either try to obtain a contractor to cut it for them or cut it themselves. A person of the Falkland Islands like Frank Smith would never for a moment contemplate any other procedure than to cut his own peat. is done after working hours on ordinary days and at weekends during the peat cutting season when the land is fairly dry, that is roughly from October to December. Frank Smith had not been working for you but had been employed on his ordinary work in Stanley he would certainly have found time during the peat cutting season to cut his own peat at no expense to himself. There is, however, one point which seems to have been forgotten. Although the cutting of the peat would have cost him nothing he would have had to pay a carter to cart it in and the estimated cost of this is £12 12s. I think that the amount paid therefore should have been \$28 less \$12 12s that is £15 8s. You will realise therefore that this amount of £15 8s represents actual expenditure incurred by Frank Smith as a definite result by his employment by the Directorate in exactly the same way as, for instance, in another country, if he had been sent somewhere by the Directorate by train to do a job his train fare would have been an expense incurred in the course of his duties.

Or, as I said, it would be regarded simply as an expense incurred in carrying out his work, analogous to a rail fore. But whatever vey you look at it it is certainly part of the "costs" which your Directorate has promised to neet. The sum of \$12 les will be recovered from Frank Smith as soon as possible and remitted to the Directorate.

Please refer to your telegram Setec No. 20.

500 By now you will have received our letter of 15th March explaining that the area measured was the water area of Horshoe Bay which opens into the inlet named Port Salvador. We had been surprised at the acreage of a bay being required but we could not find a land area named "Horshoe Bay" on our 1:50,000 maps. We thought of referring back to you but assumed you would have not asked us to measure an area for which we would not know the precise limits from information held here.

We could find no land area named Horshoe Bay.

Your second telegram asking for Horshoe Bay (WHITTINGTONS RINCON) still leaves us uncertain of your requirements - is it the area covered by Horshoe and Whittingtons Rincon as shown on the enclosed maps? 

We replied to this by telegram on 28th June giving the acreage of Rincon Grande as 24,400 acres to the nearest 100 acres and that of Johnsons Harbour as 56,300 acres (including area of Loch Head Pond at 136 acres) to nearest 100 acres.

Apart from Lock Head Pond there are innumerable small lakes and ponds within the Johnsons Harbour area and we give a rough estimate that these cover between 600 and 700 acres altogether.

Enclosed are the 1:50,000 map sheets 8, 14 and 15 and on these we have marked the fences which we used as the landward boundaries of the farms for measuring purposes.

Also enclosed are two pieces of astrafoil on which we have marked grids which may be used in measuring acreages on our 1:50,000 maps. Astrafoil 'A' has been drawn so that each square covers 4 acres and astrafoil 'B' each square represents 1 acre on our maps. We thought you might find these useful for measuring areas on our 1:50,000 maps as you merely superimpose the astrafoil over the area to be measured and add up the squares. For irregular edges you will find astrafoil B useful for adding up portions of acres.

The astrafoils should give you measurements to an accuracy of plus or minus 1% if used carefully.
