Technically, the procedure recommended by A.T. at 22B is the correct one, though in practice it makes little difference which procedure is adopted. The laying season for Gentoo Penguins will soon be starting and with regard to the Rookery at Sparrow Cove it is advisable that this Rookery should not be robbed so that the birds can multiply, therefore no licences are issued to gather eggs from there but last season Bren Carrier tracks were seen leading to this Rookery and it was clearly seen that the birds had been robbed.

These birds if allowed to multiply are a great asset to the improvement of the land on the south side of Port William which is Government Land known as the Sand Grass.

After consultation with Mr. Cawkell and Dr. Hamilton I think it would be a good idea to go out there during the laying season and partially dye the eggs with an aniline dye so that they could be detected if seen in any persons possession: and have broadcast notices that proceedings will be taken against any person found in possession of <sup>such</sup> coloured eggs.

I would be grateful for your views on this matter.


