Sir,

With reference to my predecessor's confidential despatch of the 15th December, 1915, and to my despatch No.34 of the 16th April, I have the honour to inform you that I shall be obliged if you will in future furnish an annual report giving all particulars obtainable in regard to the condition of the fur seal rookeries in, and adjacent to the Falkland Islands.

2. You no doubt realise that in these rookeries the Colony possesses an asset which might acquire great value. I take this opportunity of expressing the opinion that, should it prove impracticab--le to carry out the formation of a Company such as that contemplated by Sir Ernest Shackleton, it will be incumbent on the Colonial Government after the war to undertake the protection of the fur seals even although considerable expense should be involved.

3, It might in the future he possible to re-establish the fur seals in localities where thay formerly abounded but where thay have long since been exterminated.
