Sir,

I beg to report that the frame work of house intended for the accommodation of the guard on Elephant Jason Island has been re-erected in the dockyard.

To accommodate the 3 men of the guard, I would suggest that this house, which is one room, be divided into two compartments, sleeping room and living room.

It will be necessary to fit a stove for cooking purposes, cupboards and shelves, table and chairs.

A latrine will also have to be built.

This work I would suggest be placed in the hands of the Falkland Islands Coy since there is no skilled labour available in Government Service, as it would appear desirable that the Island Guard should be accommodated in warm and comfortable quarters.

From Governor to Colonial Secretary.

The Harbour Master has told me that as he has no ~~carpenter~~ carpenter the completion of the pier for the pier at Stephens Jason will take about 10 days at the best. There is no anchorage at Stephens Jason and bad weather may delay the work even longer than anticipated.

2. Mr. Thompson, Carpenter, should be instructed to proceed to Stephens Jason by steamer on 22nd February to supervise erection of the pier such labour as is required being supplied by crew of steamer, pier.

3. The period within which Mr. Thompson is to vacate his duties may be extended to 31st March.
