From Governor to Colonial Secretary.

- Provision to decision to purchase afterglow & as a preventive measure for protection of fur seal the reasons for which are recorded in G.O.C. 11/1921 it was decided to permit Mr J. Hansen to take 100 skins from Jason Islands & Mr Carey a like number from Bird Island on special conditions which are recorded in the same paper.
2. At that time Mr. Hansen had been advised from England not to undertake any killing of seal, even if he could obtain a licence, owing to low prices current: it was therefore decided further that no cheap skins be made for special licence and on skins when exported.
3. Mr. Hansen took 96 skins & Mr Carey (91?): the former have been exported & G.O.C. was given verbal authority to permit export without payment (see 5 (11⁺²²) of rd 8/1921): confirmation of that authority is now given.
