With reference to your letter of the 4th of February, I am directed by the Governor to inform you that as a temporary measure, and with a view to the protection of tussac, permission is granted to you up to the 31st of July, 1922, to kill or drive off sea lions (Hair Seal).

2. It should be clearly understood that:-
- (a) All unnecessary killing of the seals must be avoided.
 - (b) The permission now granted may be withdrawn at any time.
