EXTRACT FROM COLONIAL OFFICE DESPATCH No. 85 of the
20th of July, 1920.

3. I should explain that the last paragraph of the letter from the Department of Overseas Trade was written under a misapprehension, but I understand that the Department is willing to advise the Crown Agents as to the arrangement of the sales of any consignments sent to this country by the Government for disposal. Such consignments should, therefore, be made to the Crown Agents, who have now been requested to deal with them in consultation with the Department of Overseas Trade. You will no doubt ensure that the skins are carefully indentified.

MINUTE.

To The Honourable Colonial Secretary
From The Government Naturalist.

23rd August 1923.

I have the honour to state that I have handed over to the Falkland Islands Company 7 barrels containing 127 Fur Seal Skins for transmission to the Crown Agents.

The skins are the product of the last two seasons' killing with the exception of two stage, and therefore valueless, skins and six which H.E. Verball, instructed me to withhold for the British Empire Exhibition 1924.

2. The barrels are addressed:—

O.H.M.S.

Crown Agents.

Millbank.

London, S.W.

and are marked ~~N~~ N1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, and 7 respectively.

I am informed by the Falkland Islands Company that the freight will be approximately £22.

3. With regard to their disposal, I would refer to S.O.S. Despatch no. 65 of 20, where it is stated that with reference to skins taken by Government the Department of Overseas Trade is willing to advise the Crown Agents as to arrangements for marketing and that the Crown Agents have been requested to deal with the skins in consultation with the Department of

Overseas Trade.

4. I have not packed the skins in classified lots, partly because it ^{was} necessary to fill the barrels for economy of freight and in order to prevent chafing, and partly because I was not aware that my classification would agree with that of the commercial fur brokers.

I am directed by the Acting Governor to inform you that seven barrels containing 127 fur seal skins are being forwarded to you by the Government Naturalist per the m.s. "Legarto". The barrels are addressed "O.H.M.S. Crown Agents, London" and are marked Nos. 1 to 7 respectively.

2. The skins have not been packed in classified lots, partly because it was necessary to fill the barrels for economy of freight and in order to prevent chafing, and partly because it was doubtful whether such classification would agree with that of the fur brokers.

3. I am to request that you will be so good as to arrange for the sale of these skins in accordance with the arrangements made for the disposal of such consignments as indicated in Colonial Office Despatch No. 85 of the 20th of July, 1920.

With reference to your letter No. 607/23 of the 24th August 1923, regarding seven barrels containing 127 fur seal skins shipped to us per s.s. "LAGARTO" for sale, I have the honour to state that at the suggestion of the Department of Overseas Trade, the sale of this consignment was placed in the hands of Messrs C.M. Lampson and Company, I now enclose for your information, a copy of the firm's valuation report and assortment list, together with a copy of their account sales in respect of the disposal of 107 skins. The proceeds, amounting to £62. 18. '8. will be found credited in our account for April.

2. The valuation of 10s/-d approximately per skin was not considered attractive, but, having regard to the report on the condition of the skins and the unsatisfactory state of the market, it was decided, with Mr Middleton's concurrence, to dispose of them at the first auction at the best price obtainable.

3. At Mr Middleton's request twenty skins have been retained and are being prepared for exhibition at /the
