Sir,

Mr F.G.Langdon of San Carlos.N. has asked me to write you on the following matter :-

A portion of Cape Dolphin has been fenced off and tussac planted for the purpose of grazing animals during the winter months, but great difficulty is being experienced through seals hauling up on this particular part and killing the tussac.

If this portion of land is to be of any use for grazing purposes it will be necessary to get rid of the seals. Mr Langdon asks if it is possible to grant him permission to kill a few of these animals, - by doing this he is of opinion that others will be frightened off, and thus the tussac allowed to grow undisturbed.

Sir,

With reference to your letter of the 9th of February, I am directed by the Governor to inform you, that as a temporary measure and with a view to the protection of tussac, permission is granted to Mr. F. G. Langan, up to the 31st of July, 1922, to kill or drive off sea lions (Hair Seal).

2. It should be clearly understood that:-

- (a) All unnecessary killing of the seals must be avoided.
- (b) The permission now granted may be withdrawn at any time.
