Sir,

The undersigned, John Davis, and E.G. Rowe, (as attorney for Messrs Estate Louis Williams), hereby beg to apply for a license to kill (and boil for oil) Seals, of all varieties to be found in the Falkland Islands and adjacent Colonial Waters, with the exception of "FUR SEALS."

In the event of the Colonial Government granting a license, we would explain that it would be the intention to seal with the s.s. "Prefecto Garcia", or some similar small vessel, and to employ only British labour.

- Note. 1. Mr. John Davis would be the person charged of the sealing operations and alone responsible for the compliance of the relative Ordinances restrictions etc.
- Note. 2. The offices of the Company would be constituted in Stanley, and provisionally at the offices of Messrs Estate Louis Williams, where all communications can be made.
- Note. 3. Mr. John Davis will attend any interviews that may be called for and explain exactly how and where he would intend to seal, etc.
- Note. 4. We shall much appreciate it if a copy of the existing regulations governing sealing in the Falkland Islands, could be sent to us, also details of all license fees, royalties, export duties, etc., as these details are not available in the book of Ordinances in our possession.


