I have the honour to acknowledge the receipt of your telegram -

2. Although the Government are not concerned in the matter of the buildings being on sub-leased land, I considered it desirable to acquaint you of the fact by my telegram.

3. I submit for your information a copy of a letter dated 24th January, 1909, from Mrs. Fannie W. Cull, the leasee of 6,000 acres of Crown Land at New Island, enclosing copy of her Agreement with Messrs Salvesen for the sub-lease of 30 acres for a period of 21 years.

I, Fannie M. Cull do hereby agree to lease to
Chas. Salvesen & Co. of Leith for 21 years 30
acres of land situated at the South end of New
Island with rights to search for fresh water
outside the limited 30 acres for the sum of
£15. 0. 0 Fifteen pounds per year this sum to be
paid on the 1st January, if he should wish to give
up this land before the lease has expired, he will
give me twelve months notice with £30. 0. 0. Thirty
Pounds rent and all the buildings remaining on this
land will belong to me at the end of the 12 months.
