Dear National,

The Jane Cameron National Archives are pleased to share our latest update, and welcome back Phoebe Watson, who has returned to the Archives and has been working alongside the team since April 2026.

In the last two months the Archives have received more new material, including: a collection of photographs and oral history recordings relating to 1982; photographs of sealing activities in the Islands; and personal notes of Edward Bernard Anderson from his time working on vessels such as the *Golden Chance*, *MV Protector III*, and *AK Ilen*.

This month, the Archives have supported the Jane & Alastair Cameron Memorial Trust in marking and judging the history projects undertaken annually by students in Year 6 (IJS) and Year 9 (FICS). The winners will be announced at the end of year prize giving event in July/August – well done to all who took part.
