THE COLONIAL SECRETARY,

Stanley, Falkland Islands.

I have the honour to confirm my verbal report that a coffin containing a decomposed body was this morning discovered by some P. W. D. workmen when trenching beside the Peat Shed of the Dockyard Cottage. I also confirm your approval of the recommittal of the remains in Port William.

The body was that of Robert Gonzales, a native of South America, who murdered James Millett on the 30th April, 1874 and committed suicide the following day. The coffin was weighted and disposed of between York Rocks and Ordnance Point.
