COLONIAL PRISON SERVICE MEDAL

1. The Queen has now approved the amendments to the Royal Warrant of the above Medal which were set out in Circular Despatch TXH 10/65/1 of 30 September 1975. A copy of the Amending Warrant, which was published in the London Gazette of 7 October 1977, is enclosed.

2. In Order to put into operation the provisions of the new Amending Warrant it will be necessary for those Territories who have local regulations to amend them accordingly. A copy of the revised "Model Regulations" for the Colonial Prison Service Medal incorporating the new amendments is also enclosed and I should be grateful if you would make the necessary amendments to your Territory's Regulations (if any) and let me have in due course three copies as printed in your Official Gazette.

COLONIAL PRISON SERVICE MEDAL

(AMENDING WARRANT)

ELIZABETH THE SECOND, BY THE GRACE OF GOD OF THE UNITED KINGDOM OF GREAT BRITAIN AND NORTHERN IRELAND AND OF HER OTHER REALMS AND TERRITORIES QUEEN, HEAD OF THE COMMONWEALTH, DEFENDER OF THE FAITH TO ALL TO WHOM THESE PRESENTS SHALL COME, GREETING!

WHEREAS We did by a Warrant under Our Sign Manual dated the twenty-eighth day of October, one thousand nine hundred and fifty-five, institute and create a Medal designated the Colonial Prison Service Medal and did make, ordain and establish rules and ordinances for the governance of the same, reserving to Ourselves, Our Heirs and Successors full power of annulling, altering, abrogating, augmenting, interpreting or dispensing with the rules and ordinances, or any part thereof, by a notification under Our Sign Manual;

AND WHEREAS We deem it expedient that the said Warrant shall be amended to provide that the Medal shall be available to members of all ranks of Prison staff, and that previous service in the Police Force of a given Colony or Territory may be allowed to reckon towards the required period of qualifying service for the award of the Medal:

NOW THEREFORE We do by these Presents for Us, Our Heirs and Successors ordain and appoint that the said Warrant shall be amended as follows:-

The following shall be substituted for Clause Fifthly of the said Warrant:

Eligibility and Service required. - The Medal shall be awarded to staff of all ranks in the Prison Service who have completed not less than

eighteen years' whole-time and continuous service in the Prison Service in any Colony or Territory under Our Protection, or an aggregate of eighteen years' whole-time and continuous service in the Prison Service in one or more Colonies or Territories under Our Protection, as defined in the Regulations hereinafter mentioned; and at the discretion of the authorities concerned may also be awarded to staff in Prison Service who have completed an aggregate of eighteen years' whole-time and continuous service partly in the Police Force and partly in the Prison Service of a given Colony or Territory under Our Protection.

Given at Our Court at St. James's this Fifteenth day of September, one thousand nine hundred and seventy-seven, in the twenty-sixth year of Our Reign.

THE COLONIAL PRISON SERVICE MEDALMODEL REGULATIONS.

(Insert name of Colony or Protectorate)

1. Service required

The Colonial Prison Service Medal will be granted as a reward for long service and good conduct to staff of all ranks in the Prison Service of (insert name of territory), who on or after the (date of Royal Warrant) shall have completed eighteen years' continuous service as hereinafter defined.

A Clasp will also be granted to a recipient of the Medal on his completing twenty-five years' qualifying service, and a further Clasp on completing thirty years' qualifying service. For each Clasp so awarded a small silver rose may be added to the ribbon when worn alone.

2. Continuity of service

Qualifying service in the Prison Service of other Colonies or Territories under Her Majesty's Protection may be allowed to reckon towards the required period of qualifying service, if the total period of such service amounts to not less than eighteen years: provided, however, that where service has been rendered in more than one such territory as aforesaid an interval not exceeding twelve months between any two periods of service shall not be regarded as breaking the continuity of such service; provided also that a break in service not exceeding six calendar months in any one such territory shall not be regarded as breaking the continuity of such service. Previous service in the police force of (insert name of territory) may also be allowed to reckon towards the required period of qualifying service provided that such police force service is continuous with prison staff service in (insert name of territory).

3. Exemplary character

For the purpose of these Regulations service shall only be reckoned as qualifying service if it is certified that the character and conduct of the person recommended for the grant of the Medal or Clasp has been exemplary.

(Insert definition of "exemplary character". The term is to be defined for each territory in the light of existing practice and requirements, but the definition should be so framed as to secure that no award will be made unless the person recommended has been of exemplary character and conduct.)

4. Recommending authority

Recommendations for the award of the Medal or Clasp shall be submitted by the Officer in charge of a Prison Service to the Governor-General, Governor or Officer Administering the Government. The medal will be awarded on the authority of the Governor-General, Governor or Officer Administering the Government and a notification of such award shall be published in the Government Gazette.

5. Forfeiture and restoration

(a) A recipient of the Medal or Clasp who is convicted of a criminal offence or is dismissed or removed from the Prison Service for misconduct shall forfeit the Medal and Clasp unless the Governor-General, Governor or Officer Administering the Government shall otherwise direct.

(b) A Medal or Clasp so forfeited may be restored to the recipient by the Governor-General, Governor or Officer Administering the Government at his discretion.

(c) A notice of forfeiture or restoration shall in every case be published in the Government Gazette.

(A regulation relating to replacement in the event of loss may be inserted if this is thought to be desirable.)

6. Monetary allowance

If it is intended that the Medal should carry with it the grant of an allowance a sixth regulation should be added defining the extent of the allowance and the condition of its termination, (e.g., cessation of service).
