

## CLIFTON FAMILY

*NB: The following is prepared from Falkland Islands Registers and files – there may be other family born outside the Falklands. Unless stated otherwise, all dated births, deaths and marriages occurred in the Falklands and all numbered graves are in Stanley Cemetery. Any variations which may occur in the spellings of names are recorded as written in the records at the time.*

**Henry and Caroline “Needle” CLIFTON** (née **HETHERALL**) and their family came to the Falkland Islands sometime before the birth of their daughter Lily in Stanley in February 1887.

According to family history the family sailed to the Falkland Islands in Jubilee year as Caroline had inherited a hotel from her brother Daniel or William **HEATHERALL**.

**William HETHERALL**, age 50, late publican born in England, died 20 May 1885 in Stanley from acute phthisis and was buried 22 May 1885 in Grave A92. The informant was his wife **Margaret HETHERALL** who signed with a X. No further mention found to date of Margaret.

On 9 August 1904 **Henry CLIFTON**, labourer of Stanley purchased Crown Grant 107 being  $\frac{1}{4}$  of an acre of land in the Southern Suburbs of Stanley for £8. [Reg Off: Vol V, pg 114]

On 29 May 1906 **Henry CLIFTON**, labourer of Stanley purchased a Crown Grant being one rood of land in the Southern Suburbs of Stanley for £15. [Reg Off: Vol V, pg 188]

On 10 February 1911 **Henry CLIFTON**, carter, sold Crown Grant 107 containing two roods of land to his son Henry CLIFTON, carter, for £24. [Reg Off: Vol VII, pg 33]

On 31 March 1919 **Henry CLIFTON** sold Crown Grant 367 being land and buildings on Allardyce Street for £560. [Reg Off: Vol VII, pg 274]

Henry and Caroline departed on board the *Solstrief* 5 April 1921.



## FIRST GENERATION

### Children of Henry and Caroline:

1. **Henry “Harry” CLIFTON** born 28 March 1870 at Mile End Old Town Eastern, Middlesex, England. His father's occupation was recorded as sock sampler. Henry came to the Falkland Islands with his parents and five siblings. Henry, age 22 and a labourer living at Port Edgar & Stanley, was married to **Rose Ann Mary ANDERSON**, age 17 and living at Port Edgar & Stanley, 30 July 1892 in Christ Church according to the Rites and Ceremonies of the Established Church by Licence by Lowther E Brandon MA Colonial Chaplain & Dean. The witnesses were James Anderson and W R Hardy. Henry's father was recorded as Henry Clifton, labourer, and Rose's father was recorded as James Anderson, mariner. Rose, age 73 and a housewife, died 9 June 1947 and was buried 11 June 1947 in Grave P1343. By May 1947 Harry had worked for the Falkland Islands Co Ltd for 27 years and 2 months. [FIC/EF/] Harry, age 84 and a butcher from England, died 25 October 1953 and was buried 27 October 1953 in Grave P1522.
2. **Caroline “Dolly” CLIFTON** born 10 May 1872 at Dunstan Road, Mile End, London, England. [FIC/EF/ Masrch 1947] Came to the Falkland Islands with her parents and five siblings. Caroline, age 19 and living at Stanley and Pebble Island, was married to **Kenneth McPHEE**, age 32, a shepherd living at Stanley and Pebble Island, 30 June 1891 in the house of Henry Clifton according to the Rites and Ceremonies of the Established Church by Licence by Lowther E Brandon MA Colonial Chaplain. The witnesses were Henry Clifton and Annie Clifton. Caroline's father was recorded as Henry Clifton, labourer, and Kenneth's father was recorded as John McPhee, labourer. Kenneth died in Gallegos in 1922 at the age of 63 and was buried in the local cemetery. [FIM Dec 1922] Caroline was married to (2) **SUTHERLAND** (*not in the Falkland Islands*).
3. **Anne Sarah CLIFTON** born circa 1876 (*not in the Falkland Islands*). Came to the Falkland Islands with her parents and five siblings. Anne, age 18 and living in Stanley, was married to **Donald McINNES**, age 24 and a shepherd living at Port North, Roy Cove, 20 June 1894 in the house of Henry Clifton according to the Rites and Ceremonies of the Established Church by Licence by Edward C Aspinall Assistant Colonial Chaplain. The witnesses were Ed Holt and John Summers. Anne's father was recorded as Henry Clifton, labourer, and Donald's father was recorded as John McInnes, crofter.
4. **Joe CLIFTON** born ? (*not in the Falkland Islands*). Came to the Falkland Islands with his parents and five siblings.
5. **William George CLIFTON** born circa 1881 in England. Came to the Falkland Islands with his parents and five siblings. William, a carter, was married to **Annie CAMPBELL** 10 February 1914 at Christ Church Cathedral by Banns by C McDonald Hobley. The witnesses were Elliot Fell Campbell and James Campbell. William's father was recorded as Harry Clifton, carter and Annie's father was recorded as James Campbell, deceased shepherd. Annie, age 58, died 7 August 1941 on Bleaker Island from chronic myocardial degeneration and was buried next to her son Phillip at Darwin. William, age 67 and a cook, died in Stanley Thursday 25 March 1948 and was buried 27 March 1948 in Grave P1374. According to his obituary William was employed by the Falkland Islands Company Ltd for the greatest part of his life and had worked on Bleaker Island and at North Arm [Obituary FI Weekly News 1 Apr 1948]
6. **Jessie Louisa CLIFTON** born 15 April 1882 in England and baptised 21 September 1888 by Holy Trinity Church, Stanley, Falkland Islands. Came to the Falkland Islands with her

parents and five siblings. Jessie, a housekeeper in Stanley, was married to **Henry BELL**, a bricklayer from England, 31 May 1903 at St Mary's Chapel, Stanley by Special Licence by P J Diamond R Catholic Priest. The witnesses were Garrett Cullen and Henry Clifton. Jessie's father was recorded as Henry Clifton, labourer, and Henry's father was recorded as Henry Bell, bricklayer. Henry and Jessie departed on board the *Liguria* 2 June 1903 for Buenos Aires and later emigrated to the USA. Jessie died 15 December 1937 in Detroit, Michigan, USA. Her ashes were returned to the Falkland Islands on the *Reina del Pacifico* and were scattered in Port William at 2pm on Tuesday 8 February 1938. [Obituary Penguin 15 Feb 1938]

7. **Mary Ann CLIFTON** born 6 June 1884 (*in Falklands – not in birth register?*) and baptised 21 September 1888 by Holy Trinity Church, Stanley, Falkland Islands.
8. **Lily CLIFTON** born 2 February 1887 and baptised 21 September 1888 by Holy Trinity Church. Her father's occupation was recorded as labourer. Lily, a cook, was married to **Charles Fisher THOMPSON**, carpenter, 17 May 1909 at the Registrar's Office, Stanley by Special Licence by W A Thompson, Acting Registrar General. The witnesses were G J Felton and A C Kirwan. Lily's father was recorded as Henry Clifton, carter, and Charles' father was recorded as Joseph Edwin Thompson, no occupation. Charles and Lily went to the UK in 1936 seeking employment.
9. **Mabel CLIFTON** born 20 January 1889 in Stanley and baptised 8 November 1892 by Christ Church Cathedral. Her father's occupation was recorded as labourer. Mabel was married to **James CLARK**, seaman, 17 August 1909 in Christ Church Cathedral after Banns by Edward J Seymour, Chaplain & Hon Canon. The witnesses were Christian Andreasen, Maud Clifton and Maud McPhee. George was 28 and a shepherd living in Stanley. James' father was recorded as James Clark, labourer, and Mabel's father was recorded as Henry Clifton, carter. In 1910 & 1911 James was recorded as the manager of Speedwell Island. In 1933 and 1942 his occupation was listed as farm manager. Mabel and the two children travelled to Liverpool on the *Orepesa* 8 November 1923. James and Mabel went on holiday to the UK in 1933 travelling from Speedwell Island to Montevideo on the *Lafonia*. Mabel went to the UK for medical attention in 1939. James retired to the UK in 1942.
10. **Maud CLIFTON** born 10 October 1890 and baptised 8 November 1892 by Christ Church Cathedral. Her father's occupation was recorded as labourer. Maud was married to **Henry John PERGOLIS**, Government Service, 21 September 1915 at Christ Church Cathedral by C McDonald Hobley, Chaplain. The witnesses were James Day and Kate Peck. Maud's father was recorded as Harry Clifton, carter, and Henry's father was recorded as Martina Pergolis, mariner. Maud, Henry and their son departed on the *Solstrief* 5 April 1921.
11. **Richard John CLIFTON** born 20 August 1892 and baptised 8 November 1892 by Christ Church Cathedral. His father's occupation was recorded as labourer. Richard departed for Liverpool, UK on board the *Thor* 14 April 1920. Richards's father, Henry, sold Crown Grant 373 on Allardyce Street for £800 on Richard's behalf. [Reg Off Vol VII, pg 367-368] Richard died 30 January 1972 in the UK.

## SECOND GENERATION

### Children of Henry (1) and Rose CLIFTON:

1. **Henry "Harry" CLIFTON** born 8 October 1893 and baptised 17 November 1893 by Christ Church Cathedral. His father's occupation was recorded as labourer. Henry was a private in the FIDF. Henry, age 36 and a mariner, died 7 January 1930 from pulmonary and laryngeal tuberculosis and was buried 9 January 1930 in Grave J998. [Obituary Penguin 11 Jan 1930]
2. **William CLIFTON** born 21 May 1895 and baptised 14 October 1896 by Christ Church Cathedral. His father's occupation was recorded as shepherd. William, age 27 and a farmer, went to Punta Arenas to work 11 May 1922 on board the *Ortega*. William married **Ella COLLINS(?)** before October 1928 (*not in Falkland Islands*).
3. **James CLIFTON** born 28 September 1897 and baptised 25 October 1897 by Christ Church Cathedral. His father's occupation was recorded as carter. James, a shepherd, travelled to Chile in 1921 to live and obtain work. James, a motor driver, was married to **Orissa Charlotte DETTLEFF** 29 March 1941 at the house of Mrs Hansen, Port Stanley by Special Licence by A R Hoare, Registrar General. The witnesses were A Clarke and Mary Clarke. James' father was recorded as Harry Clifton, slaughterman, and Orissa's father was recorded as Hansen Dettleff, deceased carter. James, age 63 and a general contractor, and Orissa, age 49, travelled to the UK for a visit in 1962. James died overseas and his ashes were buried in Stanley Cemetery 26 February 1973.
4. **Albert CLIFTON** born 6 August 1900 and baptised 19 September 1900 by Christ Church Cathedral. His father's occupation was recorded as carter. Albert, a sailor, was married to (1) **Isabella Pearl COLEMAN** 15 June 1927 at Christ Church Cathedral by Banns by Frederick S Vaughan, Clerk in Holy Orders. The witnesses were R Hansen and Jessie Clifton. Isabella's father was recorded as John Coleman, mason, and Albert's father was recorded as Henry Clifton, butcher. Isabella, age 36, died 17 October 1940 from acute broncho-pneumonic pthisis and chronic pulmonary tuberculosis at her parents' home and was buried 20 October 1940 in Grave K1170. [Obituary FI News Weekly 24 Oct 1940] Albert was married to (2) **Ann Fraser McMULLEN** née **HOLLEN**, widow, some time after May 1956 (no record in Falkland Islands). Ann, age 48, died 2 January 1965 in Stanley from lung cancer and was buried 5 January 1965 in Grave T2021. Albert, a widower and caterer, FIDF Club, was married to (3) **Maria Ubaldina LIMA**, from Uruguay, 16 January 1968 at the Office of the Registrar General, Stanley by Harold Bennett, Registrar General. The witnesses were L Clifton and Jan Clifton. Albert's father was recorded as Henry Clifton, deceased butcher, and Maria's father was recorded as Francisco Lima, factory worker. Albert, age 74 and a canteen manager, emigrated to New Zealand in 1972 with his son *NB: On his passport applications his date of birth is 28 August 1898 but all other records state 6 August 1900*. Albert died in New Zealand and his ashes were buried in Stanley Cemetery 25 June 1979.
5. **Thomas Stanley CLIFTON** born 6 November 1901 in Stanley and baptised 26 March 1902 by Christ Church Cathedral. His father's occupation was recorded as labourer. Thomas, a shepherd, was married to **Rebecca Maud "Maud" ROWLANDS** 29 September 1926 at Christ Church Cathedral by Banns by Frederick S Vaughan, Clerk in Holy Orders. The witnesses were Albert Clifton and Alice Elizabeth Rowlands. Thomas' father was recorded as Henry Clifton, butcher, and Rebecca's father was recorded as James George Rowlands, carpenter. Thomas, age 26 and a shepherd, Rebecca and their child, left for Punta Arenas 1 July 1929 on board the *Bogota* seeking employment.

Thomas, Maud & their baby arrived from South America on board the *Bogota* 9 January 1930. Thomas, age 43 and a labourer, travelled to the UK in 1946 to take part in the Victory Parade. Rebecca, age 42 and a housekeeper, and her son went to Australia in 1946. Rebecca and Thomas divorced in 1951. Thomas, age 55 and a greaser emigrated to the UK in 1957.

6. **Florence Mary "Ciss" CLIFTON** born 28 November 1903 in Stanley and baptised 2 March 1906 by Christ Church Cathedral. Her father's occupation was recorded as carter. Florence was married to **Richard Francis SHORT**, navy, 10 February 1924 at San Carlos N by Governor's Licence by J Stanley Smith, Clerk in Holy Orders. The witnesses were Aldred Anderson and Alice Elizabeth Rowlands. Florence's father was recorded as Henry Clifton, butcher, and Richard's father was recorded as Richard Francis Short, shepherd.
7. **Richard George CLIFTON** born 26 January 1905 and baptised 2 March 1906 by Christ Church Cathedral. His father's occupation was recorded as carter. Richard departed for South Georgia 8 October 1932 on board the *Fleurus* to work on the whaling factories. Richard, age 26 and a labourer, died 3 March 1933 on board ss *Salvestria* from acute beri beri (*buried at South Georgia?*).
8. **Jessie Maud CLIFTON** born 23 January 1906 and baptised 2 March 1906 by Christ Church Cathedral. Her father's occupation was recorded as carter. Jessie, age 22 and a nursemaid, travelled to the UK in 1928 accompanying her employer as a nursemaid. Jessie was married to **George Douglas SMITH**, publican, 22 January 1930 at St Mary's Roman Catholic Chapel, Stanley by Banns by Mario Louis Migone, Priest in Charge. The witnesses were Annie Clifton and Leonard Laurence Reive. Jessie's father was recorded as Harry Clifton, butcher, and George's father was recorded as George Bennett Smith, deceased. The bridesmaids were Miss Evelyn Smith & Miss Annie Clifton and the best man was L Reive. [Penguin 23 & 25 Jan 1930] George died 22 July 1976 at Stanley and is buried in Grave R1875. Jessie died 16 August 1979 in Stanley and is buried in Grave R1876.
9. **Joseph Etherall CLIFTON** born 22 June 1908 in Stanley and baptised 23 August 1911 by Christ Church Cathedral. His father's occupation was recorded as butcher. Joseph, 2<sup>nd</sup> officer on ss *Fitzroy*, was married to **Kitty Elliot BROWNING**, age 22 and a cashier, 20 April 1954 at the United Free Church (Tabernacle), Stanley by Walter Forrest McWhan, Minister. The witnesses were Grace Elizabeth Goss and John Benjamin Browning. Joseph's father was recorded as Henry Clifton, deceased butcher, and Kitty's father was recorded as John Benjamin Browning, storekeeper, FIDS. Joseph and Kitty went on their honeymoon to Montevideo. Joseph, age 49 and a labourer, went to the UK for medical treatment in 1957 and, age 58 and a jetty foreman, to Montevideo for medical treatment in 1967. Joseph accompanied Kitty in 1970 when she went to Argentina for medical treatment. Joseph, age 63 and a jetty foreman, went to Argentina for medical treatment in 1972. Joseph, age 63 and a foreman, died 7 June 1972 in Stanley and was buried 9 June 1972 in Grave U2188. Kitty, age 43 and a widow living at 61 Fitzroy Road, died 16 November 1975 in Stanley from cancer, and was buried 19 November 1975 in Grave U1861.
10. **Violet CLIFTON** born 5 July 1909 in Stanley and baptised 23 August 1911 by Christ Church Cathedral. Her father's occupation was recorded as butcher. Violet was married to **Alexander Maurice BONNER**, shepherd, 10 July 1935 at the Registrar's Office, Stanley by Special Licence by A R Hoare, Ag Registrar General. The witnesses were Albert Bonner and Annie Harris. Violet's father was recorded as Henry Clifton, butcher, and

Alexander's father was recorded as Alexander McIntosh Bonner, stock inspector. Alexander died 14 December 1960 in Stanley and is buried in Grave S1685.

11. **Annie Jane CLIFTON** born 12 June 1911 in Stanley and baptised 23 August 1911 by Christ Church Cathedral. Her father's occupation was recorded as carter. Annie was married to **William Charles Henry George HARRIS**, seaman, 8 February 1934 at Christ Church Cathedral by Banns by Harold E Lumsdale, Dean of Christ Church. The witnesses were E Luxton and V Clifton. Annie's father was recorded as Harry Clifton, butcher, and William's father was recorded as Henry George Harris, mechanic. [Account of wedding Penguin 9 Feb 1934] William was second steward on ss *Lafonia*. Annie emigrated to Montevideo, Uruguay in 1934 where the couple made their home. Annie, age 30, died 20 July 1942 from chronic pulmonary tuberculosis and was buried in Grave O1220.
12. **Charles "Chuck" CLIFTON** born 6 May 1913 in Stanley and baptised 29 August 1912 by Christ Church Cathedral. His father's occupation was recorded as butcher. Charles, a labourer, was married to (1) **Mary Frances WHITNEY** 16 May 1934 at the Registrar's Office, Stanley by Special Licence by A R Hoare, Ag Registrar General. The witnesses were R Grant and M Pedersen. Charles' father was recorded as Henry Clifton, butcher, and Mary's father was recorded as George Eddy Whitney, labourer. Charles, a divorced labourer, was married to (2) **Jessie Emily Jane FORD**, domestic servant, 9 March 1942 at the Registrar's Office, Stanley by Special Licence by James Erik Hamilton, Registrar General. The witnesses were Ruby Dorothy May Wilson and Harold Bennett. Charles' father was recorded as Henry Clifton, slaughterman, and Jessie's father was recorded as Charles Ford, carpenter. Jessie, age 71, died 9 October 1990 in Stanley and was buried 12 October 1990 in Grave V3144. Charles, age 89 and a pensioner, died 25 April 2003 in Stanley and was buried 30 April 2003 in Grave V3145.
13. **Jess Jean CLIFTON** born 14 April 1916 and baptised **Jesslyn CLIFTON** 26 March 1918 by Christ Church Cathedral. His father's occupation was recorded as shepherd. Jesse Lynn, age 30, died Wednesday 31 March 1948 in his parents house in Stanley from haemolytic streptococcal infection of the throat and a congenital heart defect and was buried 1 April 1948 in Grave P1376. [FI Weekly News 8 Apr 1948]
14. **Allen Louis CLIFTON** born 25 May 1920 and baptised 27 June 1920 by Christ Church Cathedral. His father's occupation was recorded as labourer. Allan, age 29 and a labourer, died 20 April 1949 from cardiac failure and pulmonary tuberculosis and was buried 23 April 1949 in Grave G1402.

#### **Children of Caroline (2) and Kenneth McPHEE:**

1. **Kenneth John McPHEE** born 4 May 1892. Married (1) **Ellen "Nellie" McCARTHY** in the Cookhouse, North Arm 18 July 1918. She died 13 September 1921 at Darwin Harbour, possibly buried there. Married (2) **Grace Darling BIGGS** at North Arm 27 June 1924. Kenneth died 31 July 1951 and is buried in Grave 1458. Grace died 23 August 1994 and is buried in Grave V3215.
2. **Maud Lilian McPHEE** born 11 February 1894. Married **Leslie Law COBB** in St James Church, Punta Arenas 6 May 1919.
3. **Sarah Ann McPHEE** born 8 February 1896. Married **William SUTHERLAND** in St James Church, Punta Arenas 8 March 1917.

4. **Florence Mary McPHEE** born 13 May 1898. Married **George William GORDON** in St James Church, Punta Arenas 16 December 1918.
5. **Mildred Mabel McPHEE** born 21 February 1901.
6. **Roderick McPHEE** born 7 February 1905 at Stanley.
7. **George McPHEE** born 14 October 1906 at Stanley. Died 25 August 1907 from whooping cough and is buried in Grave H 491.

#### **Children of Anne (3) and Donald McINNES:**

1. **John MACINNES** born 25 August 1900 (*in England?*) and baptised 5 January at Port North, Roy Cove, by Christ Church Cathedral. His father's occupation was recorded as shepherd.
2. **Catherine McINNES** born 12 May 1902 at Port North, Roy Cove, and baptised 14 September 1902 by Christ Church Cathedral. Her father's occupation was recorded as shepherd.

#### **Children of William (5) and Annie CLIFTON:**

1. **James Henry CLIFTON** born 26 July 1916 in Stanley and baptised 21 September 1916 by Christ Church Cathedral. His father's occupation was recorded as carter. James, age 32 and a fireman, went on holiday to the UK in 1949. James died in 1997 in Lower Hutt, New Zealand.
2. **Hugh Ernest CLIFTON** born 19 March 1918 in Stanley and baptised 30 May 1918 by Christ Church Cathedral. His father's occupation was recorded as carter. Hugh, a shepherd, was married to **Winnie McCARTHY** 24 February 1943 at Christ Church Cathedral by Banns by Gerald K Lowe, Senior Chaplain. The witnesses were J Clifton and S Sedgwick. Hugh's father was recorded as William George Clifton, cook, and Winnie's father was recorded as Michael McCarthy, farm overseer. Hugh, age 39 and a contractor, Winnie, age 40, and their children went to the UK in 1957. Hugh died 2 January 1991 in Carterton, New Zealand.
3. **William John CLIFTON** born 1 February 1921 in Stanley and baptised 14 February 1921 by St Mary's Roman Catholic Church. His father's occupation was recorded as carter. William, age 14 days, died from a congenital heart defect 14 February 1921 and was buried the same day in Grave Ai857.
4. **Thomas Duncan CLIFTON** born 4 June 1922 in Stanley and baptised 27 July 1922 by Christ Church Cathedral. His father's occupation was recorded as carter. Thomas, age 10 weeks, died 14 August 1922 from natural causes and was buried 15 August 1922 in Grave Ai876.
5. **Philip CLIFTON** born 14 November 1923 and baptised 14 November 1923. His father's occupation was recorded as carter. Philip, age 22 and a shepherd, was accidentally drowned 18 October 1946 at Ladrillos Island, North Arm and was buried at Darwin. The finding of the coroner's inquest was that his death was by accidental drowning in the course of his duties as a shepherd. [FIC/EF/]

### Children of Lily CLIFTON (7)

1. **Horace CLIFTON** born 1 November 1905. His father's name was not recorded. Horace, age 1 month, died 1 December 1905 from premature birth 7 months and marasmus (*no burial record*).
2. **Kathleen Malvina Balcom CLIFTON** born 2 October 1907 and baptised 17 October 1907 by Christ Church Cathedral. Her father's name was not recorded.

### Children of Lily (7) and Charles THOMPSON:

1. **Mary Ann "Polly" THOMPSON** born 23 January 1910. Married (1) **John Silas Percival PETTERSSON**, labourer, 20 September 1930 at the Registrar's Office, Stanley by Special Licence by J M Ellis, Registrar General. The witnesses were L W Aldridge and W D A Jones. Divorced. Married (2) **Henry William Alfred STEWART**, handyman, 15 October 1956 at the Office of the Registrar General, Stanley by Harold Bennett, Registrar General. The witnesses were G A Stewart and L Davis.
2. **Charles Henry THOMPSON** born 28 October 1911. Mason. Married **Margaret Jane MIDDLETON**, domestic servant, 23 February 1933 at the Registrar's Office, Stanley by Special Licence by G R L Brown, Registrar General. The witnesses were P Pettersson and Martin Henriksen. Went to the UK with their family in 1933.
3. **Edwin Fisher THOMPSON** born 9 November 1915 at Teal Inlet. Bricklayer. Emigrated to the UK in 1936 seeking employment.
4. **Percival Eric THOMPSON** born 30 June 1918 at Stanley. Emigrated to the UK in 1936 seeking employment.
5. **Austin Fisher THOMPSON** born [REDACTED] at Speedwell Island. Went to the UK with his father in 1936.

### Children of Mabel (9) and James CLARK:

1. **Richard James CLARK** born 20 August 1910. Travelled to Liverpool on the *Orepesa* 8 November 1923 with his mother and sister. No further mention in registers.
