

FRAZER FAMILY

NB: The following is prepared from Falkland Islands Registers and files – there may be other family born outside the Falklands. Unless stated otherwise, all dated births, deaths and marriages occurred in the Falklands and all numbered graves are in Stanley Cemetery. Any variations which may occur in the spellings of names are recorded as written in the records at the time.

John Bruce FRAZER was born 16 May 1844 in Scotland.

John was married to **Ann HERALD** (*not in the Falkland Islands*).

John, schoolmaster and storekeeper for Darwin, his wife and three year old son, were passengers on board the *Lioness* leaving London 24 February 1880. John was employed by the Falkland Islands Company Limited on an annual salary of £120 with butcher's meat, fuel and an unfurnished house or lodging. £8 was given to him for wages during his passage out and he also took with him a quantity of furniture and used his own bedding on the passage out. John, the storekeeper and schoolmaster at Darwin, returned on the *Ramses*, departing November 1888 and was to sign another five year agreement in Stanley. His wife and children were detained through the illness of the children but were to return next spring. [FIC/C2; 712]

On 18 February 1892 John, storekeeper for the Falkland Islands Company Ltd at Darwin appointed William Hope, sheep farmer Santa Cruz Territory, to be his attorney for the purpose of managing, arranging, settling, and generally acting on his behalf in respect of any property that he may be interested in in Chile. [BUG-REG-4; 308]

John departed 23 June 1895 for Punta Arenas on board the *Herodot*. He departed there again 25 April 1896 on board the *Herodot*.

John and his family arrived 4 October 1899 from Darwin Harbour on board the *Fair Rosamond* and departed on her for San Julian 13 October 1899.

John and his eldest son established Estancias La Colmena in San Julian, Argentina.

John, age 72, died 8 November 1916 at Nolt Loan, Arbroath, Angus, Scotland and was buried in the Western Cemetery, Arbroath.

Annie, age 77, died 30 September 1928 at Dalhousie Place, Arbroath and was buried in the Western Cemetery, Arbroath.

FIRST GENERATION

Children of John and Ann FRAZER:

1. **John FRAZER** born circa 1873 in Scotland.
2. **Euphemia FRAZER** born 12 February 1882 at Darwin. Her father's occupation was recorded as schoolmaster.
3. **David Herald FRAZER** born 2 October 1887 at Darwin and baptised 30 November 1890 by Holy Trinity Church. His father's occupation was recorded as schoolmaster.
4. **Ann Herald FRAZER** born 15 September 1890 at Darwin and baptised 30 November 1890 by Holy Trinity Church. Her father's occupation was recorded as schoolmaster.
