GARCIA FAMILY

NB: The following is prepared from Falkland Islands Registers and files – there may be other family born outside the Falklands. Unless stated otherwise, all dated births, deaths and marriages occurred in the Falklands and all numbered graves are in Stanley Cemetery. Any variations which may occur in the spellings of names are recorded as written in the records at the time.

Felice GARCIA was born circa 1820 in Patagonia.

Felice GARCIA arrived in the Falkland Islands in 1843. [H8]

In the census taken 22 February 1851 **Felis GARCIA** was recorded as being age 27, a gaucho and a Spaniard.

On 26 March 1852, **Hake GARCIA**, labourer of South America, was recorded on the List of Aliens who had registered themselves to the present date. [H8]

On 27 March 1852, **Felix GARCIA** of South America was recorded on the list of Aliens who had received permission to reside in the Falkland Islands. [E4; 47]

Felice GARCIA Oriental and a labourer, arrived at Hope Place 25 September 1852 from Montevideo on board the *Stanley Cacique* to work for the Falkland Islands Company Ltd who had brought him down. [H11: FIC/IW1; 61]

Felice GARCIA was still in the Falkland Islands 22 May 1855 and was an alien employed by the Falkland Islands Company Ltd. [H12; 430]

Felix GARCIA, a native of Patagonia, single and resident at Hope Place, was recorded on the List of Registered Aliens returned 14 Sep 1855. [H8]

Felice GARCIA, age 45, a gaucho and native of Patagonia, died at 7am on 7 April 1865 at Darwin Harbour and his body was brought in to Stanley on board the *Foam*. The coroner returned a cause of death of 'by the visitation of God in a natural way'. He was buried 12 April 1865 in Grave H 503. [H21, 422: N/CHU/CHR/9: FIC/IW1; 221]
