HUNZIKER FAMILY

NB: The following is prepared from Falkland Islands Registers and files – there may be other family born outside the Falklands. Unless stated otherwise, all dated births, deaths and marriages occurred in the Falklands and all numbered graves are in Stanley Cemetery. Any variations which may occur in the spellings of names are recorded as written in the records at the time.

John Frederic HUNZIKER was born 16 June 1837 in Berne, Switzerland to **John Jacob HUNZIKER** and **Elisabeth HUNZIKER** née **HUERZELER**.

John was trained at the St Chrischona Pilgrim Mission near Basle, Switzerland.

John left England 9 March 1860, arriving in Stanley 29 June 1860, the only passenger on board the 90-ton schooner *Fairy*. He arrived at Keppel Island 29 July 1860 to work for the South American Missionary Society. By the latter half of 1861 he was working for SAMS in Patagonia.

John, age 27 and a catechist of the South American Society from Switzerland living at El Carmen, Rio Negro was married to **Martha Ellen FELTON**, age 24 from London, England, and living in Stanley, 21 July 1864 at Trinity Church Stanley according to the Rites and Ceremonies of the Church of England by Governor's Licence by Charles Bull MA Colonial Chaplain. The witnesses were James Felton, Nora Felton and Catherine Felton. John's father was recorded as John Jacob Hunziker, president of the Parish of Wynam, Berne, and Martha's father was recorded as Henry Felton, late sergeant major of the Life Guards.

John and Martha left for El Carmen 8 August 1864; returning to Stanley sometime before the birth of their first son in November 1866.

After leaving the South American Missionary Society in 1867 John was employed by J M Dean and Sons at Port Stephens.

Martha, age 41, died 26 November 1881 at Port Stephens from heart disease and was buried there. The inscription on her headstone reads

MARTHA ELLEN. THE BELOVED WIFE OF JOHN FREDERICK HERNZIKER DIED NOVEMBER 26TH 1881 AGED 41 YEARS.

John went on to have three children with Martha's sister, Madeline FELTON, but there is no record of their marriage in the Falkland Islands.

The family left the Falkland Islands sometime after September 1886.

John, age 69, died 28 August 1907 at Langley, Wedby Island, USA and was buried in Langley Woodman Cemetery, Langley, Island County, Washington.

Mr. John announce that WE REGRET to Frederick Hunziker died at Langley, Wedby Island, U.S.A., aged 69 years. He was for many years connected with the South American Missionary Society, and as one of their Missionaries was probably the first white man to travel through Patagonia from Punta Arenas to Bahia Blanca. By his kind and genial manner he gained the confidence of the principal chief of of the Tuelche Indians, and was of great value in interpreting and explaining the treaty between the Argentine Government and the tribes about Rio Negro. This treaty converted what were formerly enemies into friends, and as such they greatly aided in the settling of Rio Negro, and the hardy settlers of Chubut.

Mr. Hunziker, after leaving the S. A. Mission was Manager for Messrs. J. M. Dean and Sons, at Port Stephens.

Frederick, age 82, died 25 September 1950 in Everett, Snohomish, Washington, USA and was buried in Langley Woodman Cemetery, Langley, Island County, Washington.
- 3. Charles Ernest HUNZIKER born 13 May 1870 at Port Stephens and baptised George Ernest Albermarle HUNZIKER 1 July 1870 by Holy Trinity Church. His father's occupation was recorded as missionary. George, age 78, died 17 March 1949 in Everett, Snohomish, Washington, USA and was buried on Langley Island, Washington.
- 4. **James Herbert HUNZIKER** born 4 September 1873 at Port Stephens and baptised 10 May 1874 by Holy Trinity Church. His father's occupation was recorded as missionary. James, age 82, died 3 May 1956 in Everett, Snohomish, Washington, USA and was buried in Langley Woodman Cemetery, Langley, Island County, Washington.
- 5. **Arthur Harold HUNZIKER** born 21 October 1875 at Port Stephens and baptised 9 January 1876 by Holy Trinity Church. His father's occupation was recorded as formerly missionary now sheep farmer.
- 6. **Eleanor Maud HUNZIKER** born 29 July 1879 at Port Stephens and baptised 8 February 1880 by Holy Trinity Church. Her father's occupation was recorded as sheep farmer. Eleanor, age 25, was married to **Oliver Ross LINGENFELTER** 24 November 1904 in Langley, Washington, USA. Eleanor, age 40, died 11 February 1920 at the family residence 105 Lakeside Avenue. She was cremated.

- 1. **Nelly Madeline HUNZIKER** born 4 June 1884 at Port Stephens and baptised 10 May 1885 by Holy Trinity Church. Her father's occupation was recorded as sheep farmer.
- Ada Alice HUNZIKER born 1 June 1885 at Port Stephens and baptised 15 June 1886 by Holy Trinity Church. Her father's occupation was recorded as camp manager. Ada was married to Adolph Charles BOSSHARD 14 November 1906 on Langley Island, Washington, USA. Ada, age 87, died 2 November 1972 in Everett, Snohomish, Washington, USA.
- 3. Walter John HUNZIKER born 8 September 1886 in Stanley and baptised 7 November 1886 by Holy Trinity Church. His father's occupation was recorded as sheep farmer. Walter was married to Alice Ellen HOWARD 12 September 1906 on Langley Island, Washington, USA. Walter, age 93, died 5 January 1980 on Coupville Island, Washington, USA and was buried in Langley Woodman Cemetery, Langley, Island County, Washington.

- 4. Stanley Felix HUNZIKER born 26 January 1889 in Cottonwood, Minnesota, USA. Stanley was married to Marguerite Ada FREYGANG 18 August 1917 in Victoria, Vancouver Island, British Columbia, Canada. Stanley, age 82, died 15 March 1971 in Washington and was buried in Langley Woodman Cemetery, Langley, Island County, Washington.
- Nora Ethel HUNZIKER born 20 December 1890 in Cottonwood, Minnesota, USA. Nora was married to Cuthbert Glen GILLIARD 25 April 1922 in Snohomish, Washington, USA. Nora, age 95, died 15 January 1986 in Tacoma, Pierce, Washington and was buried on Langley Island.
- 6. **William Oscar HUNZIKER** born 26 March 1893 in Lucas Township, Lyon, Minnesota, USA. William was married to **Gertrude Ella McLEOD** 24 April 1917 in Washington, USA. William, age 91, died 28 April 1984 in Edmonds, Snohomish, Washington and was buried in Lynnwood, Snohomish, Washington, USA.
