HYNAM FAMILY

NB: The following is prepared from Falkland Islands Registers and files – there may be other family born outside the Falklands. Unless stated otherwise, all dated births, deaths and marriages occurred in the Falklands and all numbered graves are in Stanley Cemetery. Various spellings of names are recorded as written at the time.

George HYNAM, private, and his wife **Fanny HYNAM** formerly **STANBURY**, arrived in the Falkland Islands on board the British Barque Ealing Grove 12 January 1858 as part of the Falkland Islands Company detachment of Pensioners. [H14, pg 316]

George, age 55 years & 9 months, a pensioner & native of Chew Magna, Somerset, England, died in Stanley 21 November 1875 from chronic bronchitis & consumption and was buried 28 November 1875 in Grave A138. Fanny, age 53 and a widow, died in Stanley 1 October 1879 from chronic bronchitis and was buried 5 October 1879 in Grave A129.

FIRST GENERATION:

Children of George and Fanny HYNAM:

- 1. Harriet Ann HYNAM born 7 February 1858 in Stanley and baptised 4 April 1858 by Holy Trinity Church. Her father's occupation was recorded as private of the Falkland Islands Garrison. Harriet, age 16 and living in Stanley, was married to Obadiah LYSE, age 24 and a private in the Royal Marines Light Infantry living in Stanley, 15 January 1874 in the Parish Church according to the Rites and Ceremonies of the Established Church after Banns by H C Lory Act Col Chaplain. The witnesses were W Claxton and J Bradley. Harriet signed with an X. Obadiah's father was recorded as John Lyse, labourer, and Harriet's father was recorded as George Hynam, pensioner. Harriet, age 26 yrs 7 mths, died in Stanley 19 September 1884 from consumption and was buried 21 September 1884 in Grave A131. Obadiah, age 43 & British, died 25 January 1893 from cardiac asthenia and was buried at Roy Cove.
- 2. **Mary HYNAM** (twin) born 7 September 1859 in Stanley. Her father's occupation was recorded as private in the Falkland Islands Company (*military garrison*). Mary, age 2 days, died in Stanley from premature birth 9 September 1859 (no burial record).
- 3. **Susan HYNAM** (twin) born 7 September 1859 in Stanley. Her father's occupation was recorded as private in the Falkland Islands Company (*military garrison*). Susan, age 2 days, died in Stanley from premature birth 9 September 1859 (*no burial record*).
- 4. **Charles Thomas HYNAM** born 2 October 1860 in Stanley and baptised 4 November 1860 by Holy Trinity Church. His father's occupation was recorded as private in Falkland Islands Garrison Company. Charles was working for the Falkland Islands Company Limited at North Arm from at least 1 January 1894 and by 1903 was assistant overseer on a monthly wage of £7-10-0. He continued working for the FIC Ltd up until his death. Charles, age 46 and a shepherd at Darwin, died 2 February 1908 from Mediastinal Sarcoma Asthenia and was buried at North Arm. He died intestate. [FI Gazette; 1908, pg 95]
- 5. Susan Elizabeth HYNAM born 2 June 1864 in Stanley and baptised 8 July 1864 by Holy Trinity Church. Her godparents were recorded as John Edmonds (?), Mary Ann summers and Fanny Hynam. Her father's occupation was recorded as private in Falkland Island Garrison Company. Susan, age 16 and living in Stanley, was married to (1) John Jardon HALLIDAY, shepherd living in Stanley, 23 June 1880 in the Parish Church according to the Rites and Ceremonies of the Established Church after Banns by Lowther E Brandon MA Colonial Chaplain. The witnesses were Charles Hynam and Mary Hae Stentiford. John's father was recorded as William Halliday, carter, and Susan's father was recorded as George Hynam, army pensioner. John, age 62, died 13 August 1900 and was buried 15 August 1900 in Grave A37. Susan, a widow, was married to (2) Patrick GASKIN, labourer, 5 June 1916 at the house of Mrs Halliday, Stanley by Special Licence by Mario Louis Migone, R C Priest in Charge. The witnesses were Frederick Browning and Annie Halliday. Patrick's father was recorded as Michael Gaskin, blacksmith, and Susan's father was recorded as George Hynam, labourer. Patrick, age 62, died 28 November 1926 and was buried 28 November 1926 in

Grave N957. Susan, age 80, died 19 August 1943 and was buried 20 August 1943 in Grave O1248.

- 6. **Fanny HYNAM** born 16 November 1865 in Stanley and baptised 25 December 1865 by Holy Trinity Church. Her godparents were recorded as her father, Gregoria Parry and Jane Nixon. Her father's occupation was recorded as pensioner of the 20th Foot, late of the Falkland Islands Garrison Company. Fanny, age 8 years and 5 months, died in Stanley from brain disease 15 December 1873 and was buried 18 December 1873 in Grave A 137.
- 7. **Samuel George "George" HYNAM** born 11 December 1869 in Stanley and baptised 4 February 1870 by Holy Trinity Church. His godparents were recorded as Thomas Butler, Elizabeth Kendall and Ann Rebecca Butler. His father's occupation was recorded as gardener and pensioner. George worked as a labourer at North Arm for the Falkland Islands Company Limited from 11 July 1906 to 11 February 1907. George, age 67, died Friday 25 September 1936 in KEMH, Stanley and was buried 28 September 1936 in Grave K 1098. [Penguin 28 & 29 Sep 1936]

SECOND GENERATION:

Children of Harriet (1) and Obadiah LYSE:

- 1. George John LYSE born 22 March 1874 in Stanley and baptised 4 October 1874 by Holy Trinity Church. His father's occupation was recorded as blacksmith. George, a foreman living on Pebble Island, was married to Edith Mary BETTS, age 19 & living on Pebble Island, 25 April 1902 in the house of John Betts at Pebble Island according to the Rites & Ceremonies of the Established Church by Licence by C K Blount MA Assistant Colonial Chaplain. The witnesses were David Noah Kiddle and Edith Adelaide Kiddle. George's father was recorded as Obadiah Lyse, marine, and Edith's father was recorded as John Cranmer Betts, manager of sheep farm. George, age 77 & a retired foreman, died 10 June 1951 and was buried 14 June 1951 in Grave P1454. Edith, age 80 & a widow, died in Stanley 14 November 1962 and was buried 16 November 1962 in Grave P1726.
- 2. **Emily Fanny LYSE** born 15 January 1876 in Stanley and baptised **Fanny Eliza LYSE** 13 February 1876 by Holy Trinity Church. Her father's occupation was recorded as blacksmith, private in Royal Marine Light Infantry. Fanny, age 17 & living at Port Howard, was married to **John SKILLING**, age 24 & a shepherd living at Port Howard, 14 April 1893 at Port Howard according to the Rites and Ceremonies of the Established Church by Licence by Edwin C Aspinall Assistant Colonial Chaplain. The witnesses were George Bond Paice, Flora Sarah Paice, Thomas Braxton and Mary Ann Simpson. John's father was recorded as John Skilling, shepherd, and Fanny's father was recorded as Obadiah Lyse, shepherd. John made his X mark on the certificate. Fanny died 20 April 1943, age 67 and is buried in Grave O1236. John died 7 August 1955, age 86, and is buried in Grave O1557.
- 3. **Emily Susan LYSE** born 14 September 1877 in Stanley and baptised 18 November 1877 by Holy Trinity Church. Her father's occupation was recorded as blacksmith. Emily, age 17 & living in Stanley, was married to **Thomas GOODWIN**, age 22 & a shepherd living at Hill Cove, 2 August 1894 in the house of John J Halliday according to the Rites and Ceremonies of the Established Church by Licence by Lowther E Brandon MA Dean & Colonial Chaplain. The witnesses were J Jardon Halliday and Susan E Halliday. Thomas' father was recorded as John Goodwin, shepherd and Emily's father was recorded as Obadiah Lyes, marine. [Account of wedding FIM Sep 1894] Thomas, a shepherd at Fox Bay, died 15 May 1939 in KEMH, Stanley from stomach cancer and was buried 19 May 1939 in Grave K1134. Thomas left all of his estate equally to his daughter Harriet and his granddaughters Bessie and Linda Kivell. [Reg Off Vol X, pg 33]
- 4. **Arthur LYSE** born 13 December 1878 in Stanley and baptised 12 January 1879 by Holy Trinity Church. His father's occupation was recorded as blacksmith. Arthur, age 5 years & 6 mths, died in Stanley 31 July 1884 from tabes mesenterica and was buried 3 August 1884 in Grave 130, next to his Grandmother.



- 5. **Ellen Stanbury LYSE** born 10 October 1880 in Stanley and baptised 19 December 1880 by Holy Trinity Church. Her father's occupation was recorded as blacksmith. Ellen, age 19 & living at Hill Cove, was married to **James Andrew PITALUGA**, age 22 & a navvy living at Hill Cove, 22 May 1899 in the house of Mr J Halliday according to the Rites & Ceremonies of the Established Church by Licence by Edwin Coupland Aspinall Canon of Christ Church & Camp Chaplain. The witnesses were John Jardin Halliday and Rose Pitaluga. James' father was recorded as James Pitaluga, horse tamer, and Ellen's father's was recorded as Obadiah Lyse, blacksmith.
- 6. Charles Walter LYSE born 10 February 1882 in Stanley and baptised 12 March 1882 by Holy Trinity Church. His father's occupation was recorded as blacksmith. Charles, an overseer, was married to Francis Mary McLEOD 29 May 1917 at Christ Church Cathedral by Registrar's Licence by C McDonald Hobley, Clerk in Holy Orders. The witnesses were John McLeod, Alexander McLeod and Mary Ann Short. Charles' father was recorded as Obadiah Lyse, deceased blacksmith, and Frances' father was recorded as Alexander McLeod, shepherd. Charles, age 61 & a foreman, died at Fitzroy 9 October 1941 and was buried 11 October 1941 in Grave L1197. Frances, age 75 & a widow, died in Stanley 25 May 1970 and was buried 27 May 1970 in Grave T2157.
- 7. **Frederick William LYES** born 25 February 1884 and baptised 6 August 1884 by Holy Trinity Church. His father's occupation was recorded as blacksmith. Frederick, age 9 months, died in Stanley 4 November 1884 from tabes mesenterica and was buried 7 November 1884.

Children of Susan (5) and John HALLIDAY:

1. Fanny Elizabeth HALLIDAY born 25 June 1881 and baptised 17 May 1882 by Holy Trinity Church. Her father's occupation was recorded as shepherd. Fanny, age 21 and living in Stanley, was married to Frederick BROWNING, age 27 and a sheep farmer living in Stanley, 30 October 1901 in the house of Mr J J Halliday according to the Rites & Ceremonies of the Established Church by Licence by Lowther E Brandon MA Dean & Colonial Chaplain. The witnesses were John Burley and Susan Elizabeth Halliday. Frederick's father was recorded as Benjamin Browning, gardener, and Fanny's father was recorded as John Jardon Halliday,

blacksmith. Frederick, age 52, died from cardiac disease 12 October 1926 and was buried 14 October 1926 in Grave J 947. Fanny, age 50, died from cardiac failure and valvular disease of the heart and was buried 18 November 1931 in Grave K 1026.

- 2. William George HALLIDAY born 14 June 1883 at Roy Cove and baptised 30 March 1884 by Holy Trinity Church. His father's occupation was recorded as labourer. William, a labourer, was married to Selina Margaret Annie "Annie" POOLE, widow, 2 January 1909 at the Registrar's Office, Stanley by Special Licence by G Hurst, Registrar General. The witnesses were A C Kirwan and Ellen Barnes. William's father was recorded as John J Halliday, shepherd, and Annie's father was recorded as Joseph Alazia, mariner. William, age 51 and a shepherd, died 5 February 1935 through misadventure. Selina, age 69, died 4 July 1948 in Stanley and was buried in Grave L1383.
- 3. Mary Susan HALLIDAY born 6 August 1884 and baptised 19 May 1885 by Holy Trinity Church. Her father's occupation was not recorded. Mary, age 17 and living in Stanley, was married to Ernest Robert GLEADELL, age 24 and a shepherd living in Stanley, 8 May 1901 in the house of D Cusack according to the Rites & Ceremonies of the Established Church by Licence by Lowther E Brandon MA Dean & Colonial Chaplain. The witnesses were Daniel Cusack and Susan Elizabeth Halliday. Ernest's father was recorded as Enoch Gleadell, shepherd. Ernest was awarded a medal during WWII and it is now held in the FI Museum. Ernest changed his surname to CUSACK in 1928. Ernest, age 84 and a labourer, died 19 June 1960 in Stanley and was buried 23 June 1960 in Grave S1672.
- 4. **Harriet Jane HALLIDAY** born 9 February 1888 and baptised 30 October 1888 by Holy Trinity Church. Her father's occupation was recorded as shepherd.
- 5. Annie Eliza HALLIDAY born 2 March 1889 and baptised 4 November 1889 by Holy Trinity Church. Her father's occupation was not recorded. Annie was married to George GLEADELL, sailor, 17 June 1909 at the Registrar's Office, Stanley by Special Licence by W A Thompson, Acting Registrar General. The witnesses were Mrs George Watson and George Watson. George's father was recorded as Edwin Gleadell, retired shepherd, and Annie's father was recorded as John Halliday, deceased shepherd. Annie, age 31, died 14 March 1921 from pulmonary tuberculosis and was buried 16 March 1921 in Grave J858. George, a labourer, went to Punta Arenas, Chile in 1927 to find work.
- 6. John Jordan George HALLIDAY born 31 December 1890 and baptised 26 February 1891 by Holy Trinity Church. His father's occupation was recorded as shepherd. John, a shepherd, was married to Helen LARSEN, widow living in Stanley, 14 June 1911 at the Registrar's Office, Stanley (21 days notice) by M Craigie-Halkett, Acting Registrar General. The witnesses were Frederick Browning and Edward B Binnie. John's father was recorded as John Jordan Halliday, shepherd, and Helen's father was recorded as Henry Cull, engineer. Helen, age 77, died 23 January 1950 in Stanley and was buried in Grave O1421. John, age 66 and a wool shed man, died 28 September 1957 in Stanley and was buried 2 October 1957 in Grave S1596.

THIRD GENERATION:

Children of George (1) (1) and Edith LYSE:

- Ernest Lewis LYSE born 19 February 1903 on West Falkland and baptised 1 July 1903 by Christ Church Cathedral. His father's occupation was recorded as undermanager on sheep station. Ernest, age 74 & a farm worker, died in Stanley 16 September 1977 and was buried 19 September 1977 in Grave U1899.
- 2. **Markham Oswald LYES** born 22 November 1906 on Pebble Island and baptised 14 December 1906 by Christ Church Cathedral. His father's occupation was recorded as foreman. Markham, age 59 & a radio operator, died in Stanley 13 February 1966 from heart failure and was buried 17 February 1966 in Grave T2047.
- 3. **Sydney Russell LYSE** born 15 June 1914 and baptised 12 July 1914 by Christ Church Cathedral. His father's occupation was recorded as farm foreman. Sydney, age 80 & a pensioner, died in KEMH, Stanley 3 December 1994 and was buried 9 December 1994 in Grave V3220.
- 4. Lena Mary LYSE born 2 January 1919 on Pebble Island and baptised 18 May 1920 by Christ Church Cathedral. Her father's occupation was recorded as was assistant manager on sheep station. Lena, age 26 & a clerk, died in Stanley 28 June 1945 from bronchial pneumonia & tuberculosis and was buried 1 July 1945 in Grave P1229.

Children of Fanny (1) (2) and John SKILLING:

- Harriet Elizabeth Sarah Ann SKILLING born 12 March 1894. Her father's occupation was recorded as shepherd. Married David LEES, carpenter from Scotland, 2 February 1914 in the United Nonconformist Church (Tabernacle) after Banns by Robert Johnson, Nonconformist Minister. The witnesses were Gordon Leslie Challen and Harriet Simpson. David's father was recorded as David Lees, carpenter.
- 2. **Eliza Fanny SKILLING** born 26 August 1895. Her father's occupation was recorded as shepherd. Eliza died 24 November 1895 at Port Howard, age 3 months from convulsions and is buried there.
- 3. **John Obadiah SKILLING** born 10 November 1896. His father's occupation was recorded as shepherd. Died 2 July 1943 from a cerebral haemorrhage and is buried in Grave O1241.
- 4. Charles Robert SKILLING born 8 August 1898 at Port Howard. His father's occupation was recorded as labourer. Charles, a labourer, was married to Jessie Ann SMITH 15 January 1928 at Christ Church Cathedral by Special Licence by Fredk S Vaughan, Clerk in Holy Orders. The witnesses were Fred Browning and Ellen Berntsen. Jessie's father was recorded as Adam Smith, navvy. Charles was employed by Salvesen & Co 13 October 1932 to work as a labourer on their vessel the Sourabaya for the 1932/33 season. Charles R departed with his cousin Charles J for South Georgia on board the Lafonia 13 October 1933 to work on Salvesen's floating whaling factories for the 1933/34 season. Charles died 22

August 1967 in Stanley and is buried in Grave T2079. Jessie travelled to Argentina for medical treatment in April 1973. Jessie, age 68, died 19 May 1973 in Buenos Aires, Argentina.

- 5. Frederick McMurray SKILLING born 5 January 1902 at Port Howard. His father's occupation was recorded as labourer. Shepherd. Married Emily Louisa "Biddy" GOODWIN 13 July 1927 at Christ Church Cathedral by Special Licence by Fredk S Vaughan, Clerk in Holy Orders. The witnesses were P L Skilling and Harriet Helen Lees. Emily's father was recorded as James Goodwin, shepherd. Frederick, a cutterman, drowned 18 August 1937 at Lively Island and is buried in Grave K1113. Emily died 15 June 1977 in Stanley, age 71, and is buried in Grave K1890.
- 6. **Percival Hector SKILLING** born 20 May 1904 at Port Howard. His father's occupation was recorded as shepherd. Labourer in Stanley. Married **Malvina Louisa SKILLING** (*cousin*) 24 June 1934 at Christ Church Cathedral by Special Licence by Harold E Lumsdale, Dean of Christ Church. The witnesses were C R Skilling and M N Lees. Malvina's father was not recorded. Malvina emigrated to the UK in 1944.

Children of Emily (1) (3) and Thomas GOODWIN:

- 1. Harriet Janet GOODWIN born 29 April 1895 and baptised 30 March 1896 by Christ Church Cathedral. Her father's occupation was recorded as shepherd. Harriet was married to William KIVELL, labourer, 2 February 1921 at Port Stephens, West Falkland by Registrar's Licence by J Stanley Smith, Clerk in Holy Orders. The witnesses were George Goodwin and Emily Goodwin. Harriet's father was recorded as Thomas Goodwin, shepherd and William's father was recorded as Richard Kivell, deceased farmer.
- John Alexander GOODWIN born 15 November 1896 at Shallow Bay and baptised 25 November 1896 by Christ Church Cathedral. His father's occupation was recorded as shepherd. John died at Shallow Bay 30 June 1897, age 7 months, from exhaustion following severe burns after falling into a fire and was buried at Hill Cove. [Account of death FIM Aug 1897]
- 3. **George William Thomas GOODWIN** born 26 September 1898 at Shallow Bay and baptised 21 October 1898 by Christ Church Cathedral. His father's occupation was recorded as shepherd. George died 11 July 1929, age 30, from morbus cordis on the West Falkland *(no burial or grave record).*

Children of Ellen (1) (5) and James PITALUGA:

1. **Rose Harriet PITALUGA** born 25 July 1900 at Hill Cove. Died 3 February 1910 from congenital absence of thyroid gland and is buried on Saunders Island.

Children of Charles (1) (6) and Frances LYSE:

- George Walter LYSE born 13 March 1919 and baptised 27 April 1919 by Christ Church Cathedral. His father's occupation was recorded as overseer on sheep station. George, age 84, was buried 19 February 2004.
- 2. Reginald Sturdee LYSE born 2 June 1924 and baptised 22 June 1924 by Christ Church Cathedral. His father's occupation was recorded as foreman. Reginald, a labourer, was married to Ethel Malvina ANDERSON 11 June 1955 at Christ Church Cathedral by J Gould, Senior Chaplain & Vicar of Stanley. The witnesses were Milly Grant, F Lyse, L Grant and L R Anderson. Reginald's father was recorded as Charles Walter Lyse, deceased foreman, and Ethel's father was recorded as Ludwick Riley Anderson, head shepherd. Reginald, age 73 and a pensioner, died 9 July 1997 in Stanley and was buried 12 July 1997 in Grave 3269.

Children of William (2) and Annie HALLIDAY:

- Joseph Falklands HALLIDAY born 11 August 1907 in Stanley. His father's name and occupation was not recorded on the form but William registered the birth as the father.
- 2. **Guy Pembroke HALLIDAY** born 18 March 1909 in Stanley and baptised 20 May 1909 by Christ Church Cathedral. His father's occupation was recorded as labourer. Guy, age 31 and a labourer, died 11 September 1940 in Stanley from tuberculosis and was buried 13 September 1940 in Grave L1166.
- 3. Muriel Eliza Ivy HALLIDAY born 23 September 1910 in Stanley and baptised 8 November 1910 by Christ Church Cathedral. Her father's occupation was recorded as labourer. Muriel was married to Norman MORRISON, labourer, 26 October 1935 at Hill Cove by Registrar's General Licence by H C Harding, Acting Registrar. The witnesses were Alfred David Summers and L Halliday. Norman's father was recorded as Roderick Morrison, mason, and Muriel's father was recorded as William George Halliday, deceased shepherd.
- 4. John Arthur Leslie HALLIDAY born 7 October 1912 in Stanley and baptised 5 November 1912 by Christ Church Cathedral. His father's occupation was recorded as labourer. John, age 88, died 25 June 2001 in Stanley and was buried 28 June 2001 in Grave V3336. John was married to (1) Beatrice May PECK 11 January 1941 at St Mary's Catholic Church by Special Licence by H F Drumm, Priest in Charge. The witnesses were Norman Morrison and Audrey Kiddle. John's father was recorded as William George Halliday, deceased shepherd, and Beatrice's father was recorded as Archibald Riley, naval rating. John and Beatrice were divorced in 1945. John, a divorced labourer, was married to (2) Jane Christina WATTS, widow, 19 April 1948 at the Registrar's Office, Stanley by J E Hamilton, Registrar General. The witnesses were M Henricksen and Albert James Henricksen. John's father was recorded as William George Halliday, deceased shepherd, and Jane's father was recorded as John Johnsen, deceased handyman. Jane, age 82, died 19 August 1985 in Stanley and was buried 23 August 1985 in Grave V3039. John, age 88 and a pensioner, died 25 June 2001 and was buried in Grave V3336.

Children of John (5) (6) and Helen HALLIDAY:

- Stanley Stanford HALLIDAY born 7 December 1911 and baptised Stanley Stanbury HALLIDAY 17 October 1912 by Christ Church Cathedral. His father's occupation was recorded as shepherd. Stanley, a labourer, was married to Susan Elizabeth BROWNING (first cousin) 2 September 1935 at the Registrar's Office, Stanley by Special Licence by A R Hoare, Ag Registrar General. The witnesses were David Leonard Browning and Agnes Caroline Sornsen. Stanley's father was recorded as John Jordan Halliday, labourer, and Susan's father was recorded as Frederick Browning, deceased sheep farmer. Stanley, a certified lunatic, was sent to the UK on the Rippingham Grange June 1953. Susan, age 63 and a housemaid, emigrated to New Zealand in 1972. Susan, age 73, died 28 December 1982 in Stanley and was buried 31 December 1982 in Grave V1990.
- 2. John Henry HALLIDAY born 23 March 1913 and baptised 28 November 1916 by Christ Church Cathedral. His father's occupation was recorded as shepherd. John, a labourer, was married to Fanny Stanbury BROWNING (first cousin) 27 April 1939 at the Nonconformist Church (Tabernacle), Stanley by Special Licence by Walter Forrest McWhan, Nonconformist Minister. The witnesses were Lucy Rowlands and Fred Browning. John's father was recorded as John Jordan Halliday, labourer, and Fanny's father was recorded as Frederick Browning, farmer. Fanny, age 65, died 25 October 1980 in Stanley and was buried 28 October 1980 in Grave U1958. John, age 76 and retired, died 24 April 1989 and was buried 28 April 1989 in Grave U1959.
- 3. Gladys Elizabeth HALLIDAY born 25 March 1915 on Speedwell Island and baptised 28 November 1916 by Christ Church Cathedral. Her father's occupation was recorded as shepherd. Gladys was married to Henry Stanbury BROWNING (first cousin), farmer, 31 October 1934 at the Registrar's Office, Stanley by Special Licence by A R Hoare, Ag Registrar General. The witnesses were George Albert Sornsen and Fanny Stanbury Browning. Henry's father was recorded as Frederick Browning, deceased farmer, and Gladys' father was recorded as John Jordon Halliday, labourer. Henry, age 39 and a farmer, died 15 June 1943 from cardiac weakness and exposure and was buried 18 June 1942 in Grave L 1217. Gladys, age 62 and a widow at Mullet Creek, died 28 September 1977 in Stanley and was buried 30 September 1977 in Grave U 1901.
